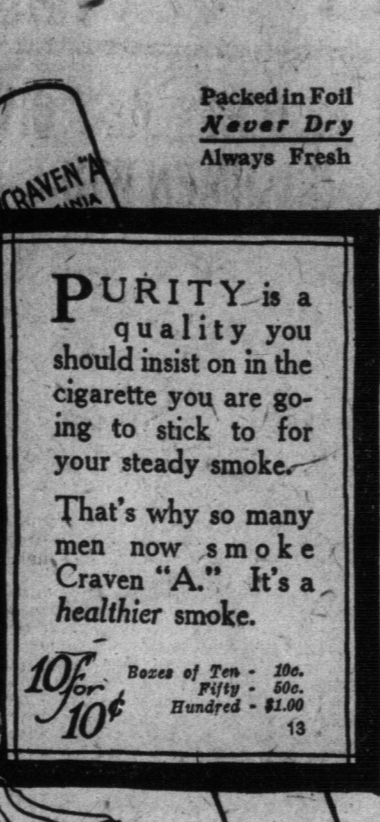

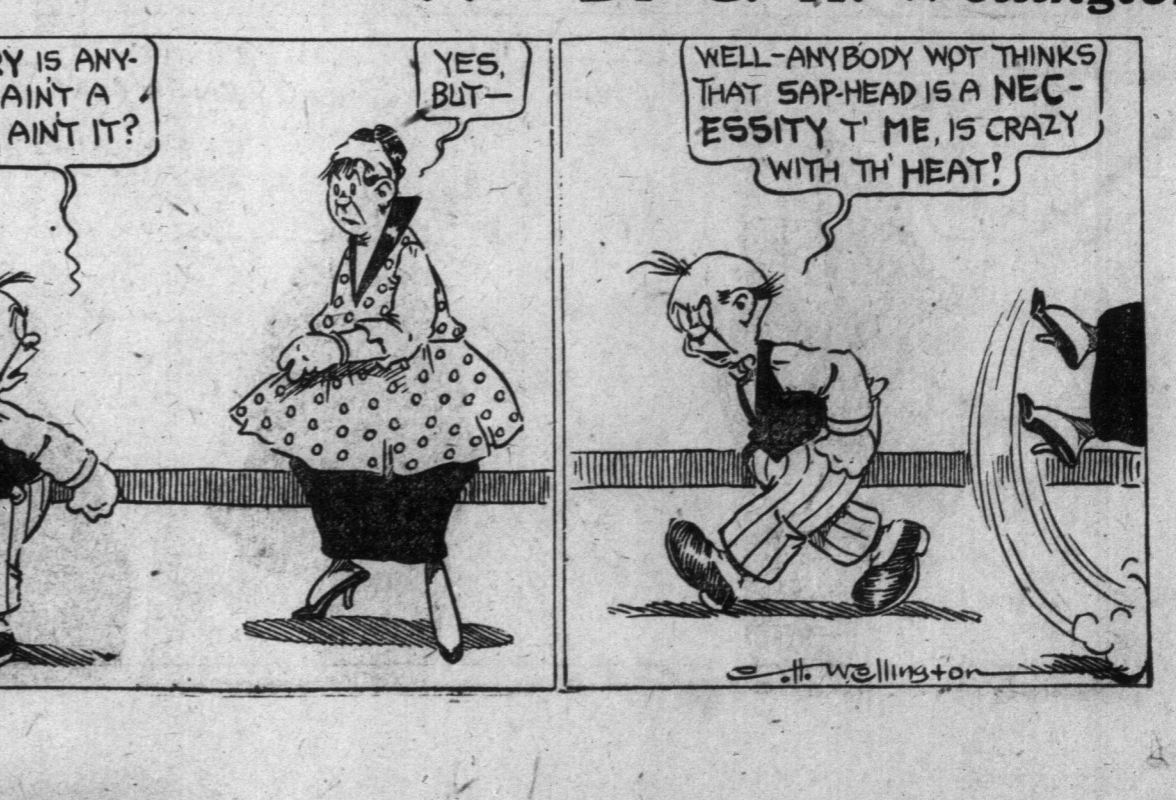

MANY FINE WOMEN AS FARMERS ON FARMS

Girls of Fine Mental and Physical Types Are Registering. FARMERS UNCONVINCED No Trouble to Get Women to Go Back to the Land.

Why They Left. It is Miss Harvey's opinion that many girls leave the farm for the city simply because they do not get sufficient money to satisfy the natural craving of the young girl for pretty things. She says she believes if all girls were given a proper allowance, that they would prefer farm life to city life.

Why They Left. Many of the women registering with Miss Harvey are eager to do their bit to help the production movement, they are giving up their paying positions from patriotic motives. Two or three women have registered who were wives of farmers and are about 40 years of age, fine, big, strapping women, who are willing to do any work around the farm.

Why They Left. When the girls register they must pass a physical examination by Dr. McCullough, of the department of health. If his report is satisfactory, they are entered into the training which are under the management of Superintendent Putman, of the Women's Institutes.

Why They Left. These classes are given instruction every Saturday in practical farm work, which includes milking, feeding stock, harnessing, hitching, cleaning down horses, bedding stock and all the work of the farm house.

Why They Left. Consider Farmer's Wife. The problem of increasing the work of the farmer's wife by the introduction of female farm labor has not been considered. Each woman registering must be willing to spend two hours out of her day's work on the farm.

Why They Left. Women Have Made Good. Last year the women went on the farms again. The fruit men were skeptical then, as to the wisdom of the movement. They advanced all kinds of objections against women going to the farms.

Why They Left. Educate the Farmer. It is the farmer's own conviction that the farmer who is the hardest to convince as to women upon farms. He does not want women, and will not have them if he can manage without help.

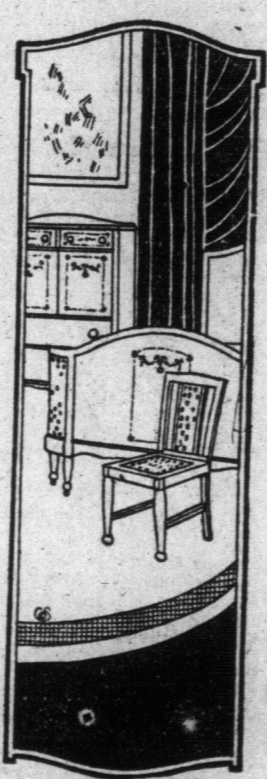

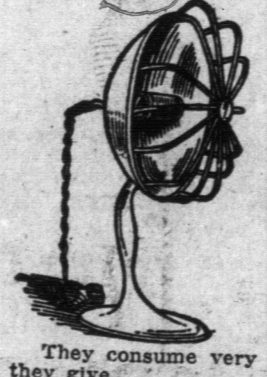
