SCARBORO'S FISH AND BIRDS TO BE WELL LOOKED AFTER

Branch Association of the Ontario Fish and Game Protective Association Was Formed.

At a packed meeting held at the Seal Way House last night the basis for one of the most industrial branches of the Ontario Fish and Game Protective Association was formed.

The officers elected were: President, Jonathan Ashbridge; vice-president, J. Reynolds; secretary-treasurer, Andrew Young; executive committee, Wallace Walton, Thomas Walton, W. W. Thompson and Robert McConnell.

Jonathan Ashbridge took the chair and stated the necessity of preserving the birds which helped the farmers in more ways than one. Many of them devoured the seeds of the wheat plants and saved the farmers the loss of their crops.

A Kelly Evans, the secretary for the parent association, said that he had attended meetings in London, Windsor, Chatham and Georhian, and at none of them did he see such a large number of representative farmers.
