THE TORONTO TRUST FUNDS

General Conference of the Methodist Church Begins To-Day.

The History of the Gathering—Delegates From Many Lands—Officers—Business That Will Likely Be Taken Up This Morning—Program.

The most important meeting in the history of Canadian Methodism is that which opens in the Metropolitan Church this morning. It will be the fifth great meeting of the General Conference, and it will continue for at least two weeks. Some idea of the importance of the event may be gathered when it is stated that no fewer than 282 delegates—half clergy, half laymen—representing every province of the Dominion, will be present, and from Japan party is expected all the way from the Conference indeed is very large, including the whole of Canada and Newfoundland, with the Bernadine on the east and Japan on the west.

Montreal, Que., Aug. 31.—(Special.)—Mr. Charles M. 

COL HENRY'S ARREST Is Likely to Lead to Sensational Developments in Dreyfus Case. Paris, Aug. 31.—The arrest of Lieut.-Col. Henry, on the discovery that he is the author of an important letter which has been the subject of the most sensational developments in the whole of this extraordinary affair.

It appears that so soon as M. Cavaignac assumed the office of Minister of War, he changed the official bureau which makes a thorough research of the Dreyfus case, and it was this inquiry which resulted in the discovery of documents lately read in the Chamber of Deputies, by M. Cavaignac, showing that proof of the guilt of Dreyfus was forged. When Colonel Henry was summoned to the Minister for War and was questioned by M. Cavaignac, in the presence of General Bédoulet and others, he at first chose to deny the authenticity of the documents. But when discrepancies were pointed out, he at first admitted adding sentences and finally confessed to forging the whole letter. It is affirmed, however, that this discovery has not changed M. Cavaignac's belief in the culpability of Dreyfus, but the Minister is determined to punish all the guilty parties, no matter what their rank or position may be. Colonel Henry is to be tried by court-martial.

Confessed to Forgery. Colonel Henry confessed to having committed forgery, "owing to the absolute necessity for finding proofs against Dreyfus," and it is understood that the document in question is the letter which, as hitherto been alleged to have been written by the German Military Attaché in October, 1896. Finally it is said that when the Interpellation of Deputies, by M. Cavaignac, in the Chamber of Deputies this letter was secretly communicated to the court-martial and was the chief evidence upon which Dreyfus was convicted.

The anti-Dreyfus papers are dumbfounded at the arrest of the Colonel, while, on the other hand, the papers which have been supporting the proposition to reopen the Dreyfus case are jubilant. They now demand the immediate release of Colonel Henry, and they insist upon a revision of the Dreyfus trial. When Count Esterhazy was informed of the arrest of Colonel Henry and of his admission he exclaimed, "This is too terrific."

Spanish Steamships Cleared. New York, Aug. 31.—Two steamships flying the Spanish flag sailed from this port today. They were the former United States prizes Miguel Jover and the Catalina. A few days ago the Washington authorities decided that the steamers should not have been seized and ordered their release. They were by their own crews they went to sea this morning.

COL HENRY'S ARREST Is Likely to Lead to Sensational Developments in Dreyfus Case. Paris, Aug. 31.—The arrest of Lieut.-Col. Henry, on the discovery that he is the author of an important letter which has been the subject of the most sensational developments in the whole of this extraordinary affair.

It appears that so soon as M. Cavaignac assumed the office of Minister of War, he changed the official bureau which makes a thorough research of the Dreyfus case, and it was this inquiry which resulted in the discovery of documents lately read in the Chamber of Deputies, by M. Cavaignac, showing that proof of the guilt of Dreyfus was forged. When Colonel Henry was summoned to the Minister for War and was questioned by M. Cavaignac, in the presence of General Bédoulet and others, he at first chose to deny the authenticity of the documents. But when discrepancies were pointed out, he at first admitted adding sentences and finally confessed to forging the whole letter. It is affirmed, however, that this discovery has not changed M. Cavaignac's belief in the culpability of Dreyfus, but the Minister is determined to punish all the guilty parties, no matter what their rank or position may be. Colonel Henry is to be tried by court-martial.

Confessed to Forgery. Colonel Henry confessed to having committed forgery, "owing to the absolute necessity for finding proofs against Dreyfus," and it is understood that the document in question is the letter which, as hitherto been alleged to have been written by the German Military Attaché in October, 1896. Finally it is said that when the Interpellation of Deputies, by M. Cavaignac, in the Chamber of Deputies this letter was secretly communicated to the court-martial and was the chief evidence upon which Dreyfus was convicted.

The anti-Dreyfus papers are dumbfounded at the arrest of the Colonel, while, on the other hand, the papers which have been supporting the proposition to reopen the Dreyfus case are jubilant. They now demand the immediate release of Colonel Henry, and they insist upon a revision of the Dreyfus trial. When Count Esterhazy was informed of the arrest of Colonel Henry and of his admission he exclaimed, "This is too terrific."

Spanish Steamships Cleared. New York, Aug. 31.—Two steamships flying the Spanish flag sailed from this port today. They were the former United States prizes Miguel Jover and the Catalina. A few days ago the Washington authorities decided that the steamers should not have been seized and ordered their release. They were by their own crews they went to sea this morning.
