

London, Nov. 25.—Speaking at the Unionist banquet at the town ball today, following the close of the Conservative convention, Lord Salisbury said that the government was meeting with difficulty growing out of the tariffs which were stifling British trade. The heresy upon which these tariffs were founded was, he added, a growing one. There was, he continued, a call for protection, and this call was increasing in force.

The government, he explained, was anxious lest the protection efforts should succeed, owing to the commercial difficulties and the sufferings of the industrial populations.

Rt. Hon. Joseph Chamberlain proposed a toast, to which Lord Salisbury responded, and in so doing warmly indorsed Lord Salisbury and the Conservative policy generally. Referring to Mr. Gladstone's threat in regard to the exacuation of Egypt, he classed it as a "new treason" upon the part of that gentleman.
