# THE GIRLS' HOME.

### THIRTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT.

STANDING at the threshold of a new year, it has become customary with institutions, as with individuals, to stop, for a short space in the busy whirl of ordinary routine, and take a brief survey of the situation; to look back upon the past and see what has been achieved, noting mistakes and failures, not with a spirit of critical and dissatisfied retrospect, but in order to see clearly wherein the error lies, and to bring the benefit of the experience thus acquired to bear upon future action, thus making of our short-comings stepping-stones whereon to mount to higher things. The past can thus be made to serve us in the future, and help us to look forward with hopeful confidence.

We are glad that you have gathered with us this afternoon, for though, as Managers of this Home, the regulation of its affairs has been largely left in our hands, we are not unmindful of the fact that the Institution really belongs to the citizens of Toronto, more especially to those whose generous contributions have enabled us to keep it in the condition in which you find it to-day; and that we are but your appointees, to whom you have entrusted its management and oversight. We thank you for this confidence, and trust that, as you glance with us over the past year, and hear the prospects for the current one, you may feel satisfied that it has not been misplaced,

The demands for admission have been very great, much larger than our limited capacity would allow us to entertain, and the cases have been for the most part very pitiable and deserving.

There were 92 inmates on the first day of January, 1890, and

32 have been taken by relatives or friends;

1 was sent to the hospital for sick children;

1 has died, and there were still 97 children under the care of the Institution on the thirty-first of December, 1890.

This is probably the largest number that have been under our protection at one time for many years; and there are other worthy people whose burdens we would be glad to ease, were the capacity of the Home large enough to permit of it; but our dormitories are already overcrowded, so that the children we have do not get quite as pure air as they ought.

There is a scheme, however, at present under consideration, which it is hoped will not only enable us to decrease the number of occupants in each dormitory, but will also admit of our taking in all its larger number of children than we have at present. The schoolroom has long been felt inadequate for the needs of so many children, and our able teacher, Miss McKee, has been labouring at a great disadvantage; so in order to somewhat obviate the difficulty, the School Board has very kindly furnished an assistant teacher, who conducts classes for the younger children in a temporary school that has been fitted up in one of the play-rooms. Such a condition of affairs could not, of course, be allowed to long continue, and our appeal to the School Board to build a new school-room, was very favourably entertained. In carrying out this project, however, a new difficulty arose, as the Board can only build upon their own ground; and after considering several ways of overcoming this trouble, it was finally decided to accept their offer to allow us to erect a school, for the use of which they will pay a yearly rental. We, therefore, propose, as soon as the season is favourable, to add a wing to the east side of this building, which will contain, in addition to a two-roomed school with all modern improvements, another dormitory, and increased storage accommodation. To meet the cost of this, it is proposed to appropriate part of the legacy left by our late esteemed friend Mr. Wm. Gooderham.

Notwithstanding the vast amount of sickness there has been in the city during the past year, the health of the children has been remarkably good. This is largely attributable to the constant and particular attention of Dr. Wishart, and the unremitting care and watchfulness of Mrs. Bright, our Matron, of whose efficiency we cannot speak too highly. Their efforts too have been supplemented by sundry pleasant excursions given by the various ferry companies, and by the generosity of the Board of the Hospital for Sick Children, in affording the shelter of the Lakeside Home to those children whose constitutions would be benefited by such a change.

We have this year the sad duty to record the loss by death of one of our most interested workers, Mrs. John Leys, who has been for twenty-four years a member of this Board. In mentioning her name, we recall how she always made the comfort and happiness of the children her first consideration. To her we are largely indebted for the new Indenture, by which a small bank account is to the credit of each child who faithfully completes her term of service; and in order that this should not increase the work of the Treasurer, she herself undertook to invest and keep track of this special fund. She has often too spoken of another scheme for the children's welfare, the engaging of a traveller to visit periodically the homes out of town in which children have been placed, to make particular enquiries in the neighbourhood; and send in a statement of the results of his investigations. This would, of course, be a very great advantage, but as our means will not permit of it, we have to do what seems to us next best, and ascertain by correspondence the condition of the children. Some letters received in this way by the Corresponding Secretary, will be read at the close of this Report, and may serve as an index to the work we are striving to accomplish.

Mrs. McGee still conducts the weekly Sunday School on Sunday afternoons, with an able staff of assistants, and several clergymen visit and talk with the children regularly.

The little ones had a bright and happy Christmas vacation, thanks to the many kind friends who, notwithstanding the additional calls which every one has to meet at this busy season, still found time to which every one has to meet at this busy season, still found time to think of and provide for them, and among these we would not forget the ladies and gentlemen who furnished such a delightful entertainment on the evening of the Christmas tree.

We would like to enumerate particularly all the friends who have shown an interest in the Home, but it will be impossible to do so, still we do most heartily thank them all for the assistance and encouragement they have given, although we know that in the giving they have received ample reward.

So, with a new year before us, we will not falter, but will press ever onward and upward, trusting that heavenly guidance and blessing may still be ours as we proceed.

2 98 In presenting to you my Third Annual Report, it gives me great pleasure to say that the health of the Home has been, throughout 1890, wonderfully good. While the nursery children, and a few of those from the higher departments, have, from time to time, suffered from colds, eczematous attacks, and the ordinary run of infantile complaints, there has been no serious disease nor epidemic among the children, and even the grippe found no victims in the Home. The complaint among the nurseries, spoken of in last report, was entirely eradicated by the stringent measures taken.

The greatest care has been exercised to prevent the entrance of disease in the persons of the children admitted by the Board, and there is no doubt that in this way much disease is kept out of the Home.

During the year we have lost two of our inmates by death. In February last, Mamie Funstone, aged 13 years, who had been placed for — years in a home in Dundas, was brought to the Hospital for Sick Children in the last stages of Phthisis, and death soon closed the scene. In April, Eliza Speers, aged 14, who had long been in a delicate state of health from heart disease, gradually faded away, and was found dead in her chair, where she had been put to catch some of the spring sunshine that was streaming through the Infirmary windows.

While we are thus able to congratulate ourselves that our average health has been good, and that we have been providentially spared any serious illnesses, still we do not think that the children are as robust as they should be. Not long since I was forced to ask the Board to limit the number of their admissions, as the sleeping rooms were being overcrowded,—and now only one girl is allowed in a bed.

Mrs. Bright and Mrs. Bowers are most watchful, and never permit the slightest ailment to pass without prompt attention.

May the coming year have yet better things in store for us.

# CONSTITUTION OF THE GIRLS' HOME.

- 1. This Institution shall be called the "Girls' Home," and have for its object the rescue from vice of young girls, and the bestowal of careful attention to their religious, moral, and temporal welfare; also the maintenance and support of girls from two to fourteen years of age.
- 2. Children are given out to parties furnishing suitable references, on payment of five dollars per annum, till the child is fifteen; then, ten, fifteen, and twenty dollars for the next three years respectively; these sums, except the first, to be invested for the said child's benefit and given to her at the expiration of her term of service.
- 3. The management shall be entrusted to a Committee, of not more than forty-five ladies, chosen at the Annual Meeting, out of which shall be elected by ballot the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Directresses, Treasurer, Secretary, and Corresponding Secretary. All vacancies shall be filled by ballot, and a majority vote at a Monthly Meeting after at least one week's notice. Should it happen at any meeting that no Directress be present, then the ladies in attendance, if sufficient to form a quorum, may elect some one of their number to take the chair, the lady so appointed to have, for the time being, the same authority in all respects as a Directress.
- 4. No alteration shall be made in this Constitution, except at the Annual Meeting; and notice of any proposed alteration must always be given to the Board, at least one month previous to such Annual Meeting.

### RULES FOR THE

# BOARD OF MANAGEMENT OF THE GIRLS' HOME

- 1. Regular meetings of the Board of Managers shall be held every Tuesday, at 10.30 a.m., the first Tuesday in the month being the day of the Monthly Meeting, for which all important business shall be deferred. Special meetings may be called by the Secretary, upon an order from the 1st Directress, or, in her absence, at the request of any three members.
- 2. All meetings shall be opened and closed with prayer, and be opened as soon after the appointed hour as a quorum shall be present, which shall consist of five members at a Monthly and three at a Weekly Meeting, being conducted in the following order:
- 1st. The Secretary shall read the minutes of the preceding meeting, which shall be signed, or in case of a Monthly Meeting all the meetings during the past month; inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place and read the general Reports of the condition of the Institution.
- 2nd. The presiding lady shall place all resolutions before the meeting, declare the decision to the Secretary, and if an equality of votes occur, give the casting one, in addition to her vote as member of the Board.
- 3. As soon as the meeting is opened (when a quorum is formed) all conversation, not addressed to the presiding Lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.
- 4. Any lady allowing three months to pass without being present, or notifying her inability to attend, to the Secretary, shall have her name struck off the list of the Managing Committee.
- 5. The Treasurer shall receive and take charge of all moneys belonging to the Institution, as well as the children's fees, keeping account of the same. All accounts shall be brought by her before the meeting of the Managers every month.

6. The Corresponding Secretary shall keep account of all children given out from the Home, and correspond with them at least once a year, and shall keep account of and read all correspondence respecting them, at the Board Meetings.

7. The Secretary shall direct all the correspondence, keep account, as far as practicable, of all the children in the Institution—giving a general report thereof at the Monthly Meeting, at which she shall regularly attend, but never be called upon to preside, minute the proceedings, and take the names of the ladies present.

8. Two members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Secretary to visit the Home daily each week, ascertain from the Matron the behaviour of the children, as well as whatever may be requisite for them and for the house, and report the same at the Regular Weekly Meetings. The 1st Directress, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, and Secretary shall not be of the number of Daily Visitors.

9. Any three Managers, including a Directress, may admit applicants up to the age of fourteen, with the doctor's certificate insuring them to be free from disease.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE

# MATRON AND CHILDREN OF THE GIRLS' HOME.

1. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the children, as well as to conduct the household affairs generally, and also to instruct the girls between the ages of five and fourteen, in sewing, knitting, and household work.

2. She shall admit any applicant not younger than two years, or older than fourteen, upon the doctor's certificate; subject always to the approval of the Board.

3. The charge for each child of such parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$5 per month, unless an exceptional case should occur. If more than one child of the same parent or friend gain admittance, a reduction may be made as approved by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

4. The Matron shall daily inspect the cleanliness of the children, see that they attend the day-school punctually and regularly; and every morning and evening conduct family prayers.

5. The children shall rise at 6 a.m. from May 1st to October 31st, and at 7 a.m. from November 1st to April 30th. The time for going to rest to be from 5 to 8 p.m.

Children under fourteen are not allowed to wash or scrub more than three hours a day.

6. Meals to be at regular hours. Breakfast at 8 a.m.; dinner at 12; tea at 5 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals by the elder children. The Matron and one servant to be present.

7. All children of age to do so, shall regularly attend Sunday School, and also Divine Service once every Sunday, in charge of the Matron, or some other competent person, and in the afternoon attend the Sunday School in the Institution.

8. Parents or friends of the children shall be admitted to visit them on Wednesday and Friday afternoons, from 3 until 5 o'clock. Persons wishing to come at other hours must obtain a permit from the Board.
