Hon. Isaac Burpee's Death.

Hon. Isaac Burpee, Member of the House of Commons for St. John city and county and ex-Minister of Customs, died at New York on Sunday 1st inst. He was a native of Sunbury County, where he was educated in the local Grammar School, removing to St. John thirty-six years ago, when he was twenty-two years old. He engaged successfully in the hardware business, and did not enter public life until about fifteen years ago, when he became the first chairman of the Portland town council. His excellent business training, together with a natural aptitude for public affairs, at once attracted attention and in 1872 he was chosen by a large majority to represent the city and county in Parliament. He entered the Mackenzie Cabinet on its formation, as Minister of Customs, continuing in the position and discharging its duties with more than usual faithfulness and success until the resignation of that Ministry in 1878. He was as conscientious as he was able in the discharge of his representative duties, commanding the respect and friendship of all parties in Parliament. His public spirit was displayed in which he has been associated during the last twenty years and in the gift of a free public library to the city of Portland, in which he lived. All who knew him will regret that death has claimed him at a time when he seemed but fairly started on a most useful public career, full of promise of honor to himself and benefit to his constituency and the Province.
