## Dominion Parliament.

(Continued from first page.)  
The clause respecting New Brunswick was next considered. The subsection affecting St. John City and county was allowed to stand until the arrival of the judge Skinner, the county representative, that ten years was quite long enough to protect investors.

The discussion lasted over an hour, the opposition contending that the house should regulate in the interests of the consumers rather than of the inventors. Mr. McMillin, attorney for the Inventors' association, defending the proposition, which was ultimately adopted.

A motion by Mr. McMillin to shorten the life of a patent to ten years was rejected. It was provided that the act should not be retroactive.

The house then went into committee upon the Criminal Code and Mr. Carran presented two amendments suggested by W. A. Watt, of the Montreal Society for the Protection of Women and Children, to the clause defining offences against young girls. They asked that the age of children in the definition clause should be raised to 16, but Sir John Thompson could not accept the proposition, believing that it would tend to mislead the public.

A request to raise the age of girls from sixteen to twenty-one in the clause forbidding harboring, was also rejected.

In the afternoon the Criminal Law bill was considered in committee. The house, in committee all evening, made good progress, adjourning at 12:20.
