WIHERLESS it is expedient to consulidate and revise

Composilion of the $A s=0 c^{\circ}$ tion. H.c By-laws of the Assuctation heretofore passed, and enact further By-laws for the good governa int of the Association:

THEREFORE: The President, Vice-Presidents and Directors of the Jodustrial Exhibition Association of Turonto, pursuant to the authority vested in them hy the Act of Incorporation, enact is follows:

1. The Association shall be composed of the personi and representatives named in the fourth section of the Act of Incorporation, as amended by 6r Vic., Cap. 54, Sec. 2. Ontario Statutes, 1898 , and subsequent amendments, and -weh other persons and representatives as the said Board .if Directors may from time to time admit to membership. binder the provisions of Scetion 10 of the said Act. No one person thall represent more than one Association, Cor1, ration or Society. Fifteen members of the Association 1

3. 4. A majority of the said elected Directors shall be resi- (Smmom dents oi the City of Toronto, and seven Directors shall con-- titute a quormu withe lioard of Directors for the transaction of busincss at ally mecting of the satid Board.
5. The election of Directors shall be by ballot. Nomi- Nomination bations for Directors shall be made in writi,g with the of Dilirectory dusent of the nominee in writing, signed by the nominator .und nominece respectively, and received by the Secretary wi the Association during the week preceding the date of the annmal mecting. and not later than 120 ochock noon of Saterday prior to the date of election.
6. For each ammal meeting the Secretary shall prepare Batlot : ballot printed on white paper containing the names in
alphabetical order of those members of the Association eligible to be elected Directors, for whom he has written nominations as above required, setting forth after the name of each nominee his resident address. The names of all persons duly nominated shall be printed in uniform style of type upon the ballot paper.

Marking of Ballot
7. The marking of ballots shall consist in the roter marking an "X" opposite the mame of each person he votes for. Any ballot having a greater mumber of mames thus marked than the required number of Directors to be elected will be a spoiled ballot and will not be counted.

Calling of Meeting of Board
8. The maximum number of Directors to be elected siall be plainly printed at the top of each hallot paper for which the roter is required to vote.
9. Mectings of the Board of Directors may be calle ? by the President, or in his absence by the first Vice-President, or in the absence of buth of them by the second VicePresident. on twenty-four hours' notice; or in the event of refusal of the President or Vice-Presidents, as the case may be, by any eleven members of the Board, on forty-eight hours' notice, and when so called shall be deemed regular meetings for the transacion of any business, and the Secretary shall issue to members written or printed notice not less than twenty-four or forty-eight hours, as the case may be, of the time and place of holding such meetings, specifyines in said notice the nature of the business to be transacted, so far as he may be apprised of the same.

Klection of Officer:
10. The elective offecers of the Association shall be an Honorary President, a Presidem and lwn Vice-Presidents.
11. The appointed officers of the Association shall be Appointed a General Manager (who may also act as Secretary), a Sccretary, a Treasurer and one or more Auditors, together with such other officers as the Board of Directors may find it necessary and expedient to appoint from time to time and ds weasion may require.
12. Before the appointment of any of the oflicers pro- Fixing vided for in the next preceding section, the Board of Appointed Directors shall fix and determine the salary or other Offigers remuneration to be paid to each such officer, and no salary laving been so fixed and determined shall be afterwards increased or diminished except at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors duly and properly called for that purpose.
13. All appointed officers of the Association shall hold oifice during the pleasure of the Board of Directors, muless otherwise specially agreed upon.

I4. The Honorary President, the President and two Election of Vice-Presidents shall be elected annually at the first meeting Elective Offiof the new Board of Directors each year, by ballot, after being nominated, and the persons elected must receive a majority vote of all the Directors present at the meeting, only members of the Board of Directors are eligible for the election to the office of President and Vice-President. The Honorary President shall be elected from among the members of the Association who are Past Presidents. In the event of there being no Past President, the Board may elect any other member of the Association to the office.
15. The Board of Directors shall have authority to Honorary and appoint such number of Honorary and Associate Directors Associate as they may deem adrisable.

Committee:

Election of Exeoutive
16. There shall be appointed by the Board of Direclors, within one week after the annual meeting of the Association, the following standing Committees for the ensuing year:-

and such other Committees as the Buard of Directors may from time to time deem expedient and necessary. With the exception of the Executive Committec, each of these standing Committees shall, unless otherwise directed by the Board, consist of a Chairman and two other members from the Board of Directors, who shall have power to add to their number either from amongst the members or Directors of the Association, and they shall also lave power to appoint a Vice-Chairman or Vice-Chairmen if deemed necessary.
(a) The Executive Committee shall consist of six members, four of whom shall be the Honorary President, the President and two Vice-Presidents, and two of the Poard of Directors, who shall be elected by ballot at the
maugural meeting of the Board. They slall not be nominated by the Striking Committec.
(b) The duties of the Executive shall be to prepare Dutien of the recommendations for Board Mectings, supervise finance Executive letting of contracts, advertising, transportation, reception, General Office management, to carry out and keep an accurate report of all matters referred to it by the Board. The lresident of the Association shall be the Chairman of this Committee, and they shall also appoint a Vice-Chairman. This Committee shall also compose the Committee on Nominations, which shall each year within one week after the annual mecting of the Association prepare a draft of the inembers of the various Committees for the ensuing year (except the Executive Committee, which shall be elected as rovided in clause a), which report shall be presented at the a augural meeting of the newly elected Board of Directors.
(c) The Agricultural Industries Committee shall include Composition agricultural products, vegetables, horticulture, fruit, honey of Comultees and apiary supplies.
(d) The Mlanufactures and Liberal Arts Committee shall Manufactures Mclude agricultural implements, machinery miscellaneou Committre manufactures, stoves. carriages. tramsportation, and ladies wrork.
( $\epsilon$ ) The Sub-Committec on Ladies' Work and Domestic Ladic: Irt shall consist of five persons, who, if not members of the Committee issociation, shall rank as Associate Members. They shail e a sub-committec of the Manufactures and Liberal Arts committee and be appointed by them.

（f）The Chairman of the Committees shall be appointed by the Board of Directors，and shall，unless otherwise deemed expedient by the Board，be one of the members $\boldsymbol{o}^{\text {i }}$ the said Board．
（g）The President and two Vice－Presidents shall be ex－officio members of all Committees．

17．The Superintendents of the various departments on the grounds shall each certify to the pay sheets of the em ployees in their respective departments．These pay sheets shall be handed to the Manager for inspection and approval， and must then be signed by the Chairman of the Executive Committee（or a member of the Executive Committee pro－ pertly authorized to do sn by him）before being paid by the Treasurer．

18．The seal of the Association shall be under the charge of the Secretary，who shall，in conjunction with the President or Vice－Presidents，as the case may be，have power，under the general directions of the Board of Direc． tors，to affix the same to such instruments or documents as may require it．

## DUTIES OF OFFICERS．

19．（a）The President shall preside at all meetings of the Association and of said Board of Directors，when prc－ sent，and shall perform the duties usually appertaining $t$ such office，and in his absence such duties hall be per－ formed by one of the Vice－Presidents，or in their absence
by a member of the Board of Directors, to be chose:1 at the meeting.
(b) The General Manager shall, under the direction of fieneral the Board of Directors, make all a:rangements for the lolding of all exhibitions. He she!l see that the grounds and buildings are prepared and ready for use at the proper time, provide a sufficient quantity of fodder for live stock. thel for Machinery Hall and other engines, and have at the necessary properties and equipment ready for the exhibition. He shail, under the direction of the Board of Directors and arious Committees, attend to the arrangement of each lepartment, and decide all matters, such as tiae President and Vice-President, arting in his absace, may not considic: 1 sufficient importance to warra't him in calling a full meting of the Board of Directors to determine, and in such Fe report at the next meeting of the Board. He shall repare and recommend to the Board of Directors a procramme for the carrying out of all exhibitions, which the bard may from time to time determine to hold, and report - to the staff of assistants, clerks, servants and workmen acessary for each such exhibition, and generally perform 11 such duties as usuaty deyolve on such an officer, maden he direction or subject to the approval of the Board of directors, and further do and perform all such acts, matters Ind things as may be required of him by any By-law or coolution or order of the said Board of Directors, in conection with his eaid office of General Manager.
(c) The Secretary shall at*and and be present at all secretary wetings of the Association ...d Directors, and keep a
faithful record of the transactions and proceedings i the Association and of the Board of Directors at all sucti mectings, in a book or books, which shall be open to the inspection of the members of the Association at all reasol: able times, at each annual meeting of the Association, an! whenever he shall be so required loy the Board of Directors; he shall, as such Secretary, make written report of the pre ceedings and condition of the Association, he shall issue all notices and perform all such other duties as devolve upon such officer by the Act of Incorporation of the said Assuchation or the by Laws thercof, and by the lawful ordere of the Board of Directors of the Association.

Treasurer
(d) The Treasurer shatl receive and safely keep all moneys and valuable papers of the Association. He shall cause to be entered in books kept for that purpose a correct statement of all moneys received and disbursed on account of the Association, which books shall be open at all reasonable times to the inspection of the members chereof, at the annual meeting of the Association, and at such other times as he may be required to do so by the Board of Director: The Treasurer shall present a complete statement of the receipts and disbursements of the Association at the liat meeting for the year of the Board of Directors, in whith shall be shown the expenses of management, under separate and distinct heads. and shall perform such other duties is may be required of him in comnection with the finances of the Association by the Act of Incorporation and by the Liylaws thereof, and e lawful order and resolutions of the Poard of Directors. report of any expenditure made contrary to the Act of I corporation of the Association, ne by the By-I aws therenf.
and generally do and perform all acts devolving upon Aud tors, or which may be required by the said Directors.
(g) The Cemmittees named in Section il of this By-lay shall, under the direction of the General Manager and Boar! of Directors, make all arrangements for and have the contril of all exhibits in their respective departments at all exhib.tions of the Association, but the Board of Directors shall decide upon the amount of prizes to we offered, and all othor expenditures in connection with the Association upon reports from the respective Committees.
20. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or special mecting of the Board of Directors, called for that purpose, by a majority vote of the whole number of Directors, notice in writing having been given to each of the contemplated change.
21. The former By-Laws of the Association, passed hy the Board of Directors on the 20th of March, 1900, shall he and are hereby repealed.
