The adrontuses of the carver is such, that he copies every stroke exterly. How work is sometimes so usually executed, it is difficult to distinguish a book that is written from one which is purioted. The board thus carved or engraved, generally contains the characters for two pages. When the work of the carver is completed, it is taken by the printer, laid level and fixed in that post on.
