By the Ships *St. Andrew* and *John Bull*, London papers to the 22d, and Liverpool to the 30th July have been received at New York.

The intelligence from England is not apparently of much importance. The Municipal Corporation Bill chiefly occupied the attention of the House of Lords, and the Irish Church Bill that of the House of Commons. Lord Minto's declaration in the House of Lords respecting the consequences of the treatment which the members of that body might give to the measure of Corporation Reform is of a very singular character and must have had its origin in some suspicion that their Lordships would reject the Bill. The remarks in question, by the Prime Minister, will be found below.

For the copious extracts of the late news which we are enabled to give, we refer the reader to the *New York Commercial Advertiser*.

England.

The municipal corporation bill, as introduced in the House of Commons, has passed the upper house on the 20th, but, of course, no legislation is afforded, on which reliance can be placed, as to its ultimate destiny. A motion was made by Lord Stratford, that the corporation of Canterbury should be heard by committee before the bill was read a second time; but it was voted, that if the privilege should be allowed to one corporation body, all others might demand the same, which would create an intolerable delay.

It was finally settled that two or three days after the bill was read a second time, the corporation of Canterbury should be heard by committee, and that the bill should be taken into consideration by their lordships. A petition connected with the bill gave rise, on the 27th, to a remark from Lord Melbourne, which appeared to create some alarm.

"He assured their lordships that he held them in the utmost respect—that, acting with all due clamour, he believed and knew that their authority would be well fixed, their dignity well assured, their rights and powers well and permanently secured. That, in his judgment, and according to his knowledge, there was nothing that in itself was more dignified, than the power which the Queen could, in the name of the people, give to any corporation body, but that a tax was laid upon the speculations of the press and the curiosity of the people, by an unexpected proceeding of the proceeding general, when on the 25th, announced that the bill had passed, and recommended the others to the mercy of the court. The sentence was expected to be declared about the middle of August."

France.

The advices from Paris are to the 27th: the papers were much occupied with descriptions of the "Three Days" of which that was the first. A grand funeral service was performed in all the churches, in memory of those who fell; the second and third days were to be devoted to rejoicing. Egypt.

The latest advices from Madrid were of the 19th of July, via Paris; from the seat of war no later than had been previously received. Disturbances were expected at the capital on the 16th, which was the anniversary of the battle of Albuera, when the English were defeated last year, but the measures of the Government were so energetic, that the day passed off in quiet. Officers who arrived at Bayonne, stated that they encountered no difficulty or obstruction on their way to Madrid. In consequence, the Minister has published an exposition, requesting the Queen Regent to order the departure of all officers sojourning in the Spanish capital to their garrisons and depots to carry the law of the Urban Code into effect. Measures were taken to establish military tribunals; to require all military officers of all the provinces to establish military tribunals; to require all public employees to attend at their posts; and to deprive all persons in the service of pay and allowances in case of their joining the revolutionaries. This exposition was the effect of the disturbance at Saragossa. The Queen approved of the report, and directed all the measures suggested in the communication of the London press.

The Mediterranean.—Lord Wharncliffe regretted the expressions which the noble lord (Melbourne) had thought proper to address to their Lordships; he would leave it to the noble lord himself to consider whether it was right and convenient to be there dignifiedly. His lordship, however, was too much engaged in the business of the State to be there dignifiedly. He said their dignity, rights, privileges, authority, were now firm enough; but he intimated " beware how you trifle with them." "GENTLEMEN—I beg to inform you, and to request you will make it known to the next manager that on Wednesday next, at 11 o'clock, Lord Melbourne and I will be ready to see any gentleman who may be desirous of contracting for a new loan, under the provision of an act passed in the third and fourth year of his Majesty, for the reduction of the national debt.
