Canadian Meat in England.

The following extract from the London Times of a recent date refers to what may become an important branch of our export trade:

Some carcasses of fresh Canadian beef and mutton, together with several turkeys, have been brought to Liverpool by the Allan steamer Scandinavia, Captain Smith, master.



Soft Weather in Mid-Winter.

The untimely closing of navigation, at a date the earliest on record, has been followed quickly by a long spell of weather so unusually mild that certain waters westward are open for the first time known to this generation in January. The Bay of Toronto is without ice, a phenomenon which recalls to the old settlers that it has not been so in mid-winter since the troublous times of 1837, when a vessel took from the wharf a large party of ladies and officials, who stood in fear of the rebels, whose movements inspired terror to that city. The mildness in that district is such that, for miles inland, from the shores of Lake Ontario, the trees are shooting out buds as they usually commence to do in April. Apprehensions are entertained that serious mischief will be inflicted on the fall wheat, should a seasonable severity set in before snow falls for its protection, as there is a large area of land now so wet that a keen frost would coat it with ice which would remain throughout the winter and kill any seed waiting to germinate in spring. Some Ontario farmers have their plows at work, taking time indeed by the forelock. Whether time will be gained by this some doubt, but the experiment seems reasonable, and in certain cases will doubtless facilitate surface drainage, and to that extent expedite operations, when time becomes so valuable to agriculturalists.—Witness Financial Review.
