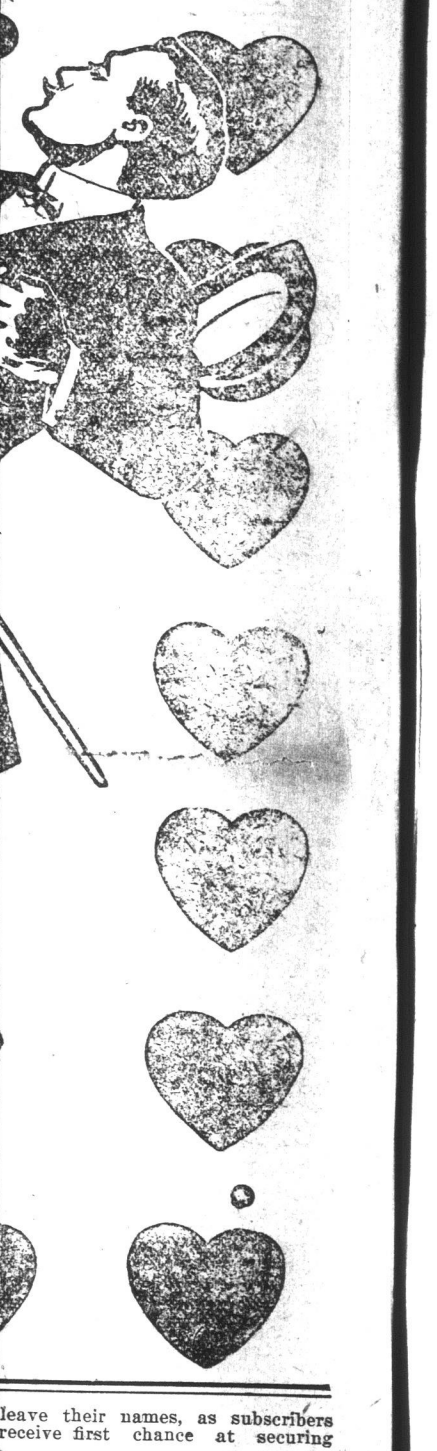

NEW BILLS IN LEGISLATURE

Synopsis of Some of the Measures Introduced at this Session. Of the bills brought down and advanced along this course through this legislature for this session the following is a brief synopsis:

CREDITORS' RELIEF. The bill to promote priority among the execution creditors, to be called the "Creditors' Relief Act, 1902," makes provision for the doing away of all such priority unless the claims be for wages or salaries to the extent of three months' pay...

TO PROTECT CHILDREN. The bill introduced by Honorable Wm. Prentice amending the Children's Protection Act which was read a first time yesterday, extends the provisions of the act to the city of Vancouver...

TO AMEND THE JUDGMENTS ACT. The bill which was given its first reading yesterday contains but a few amendments to the act as it now stands...

INTERPRETATION ACT. The bill to amend the Interpretation Act was introduced by the Honorable the Attorney-General. Its sections regulate the time in connection with statutory laws, and provide for the recovery by or from penalties of various kinds...

AID TO HOSPITALS. The bill to regulate public aid to hospitals has also been advanced so far as its second reading. After instructing the board of council, the municipality it provides for the regulation of the amount of aid given by the following provisions:

Hospitals where the total number of days' treatment in a year shall not exceed five hundred, the sum of five hundred dollars.

Where the total number of days' treatment shall exceed five hundred, the sum of one dollar for the first one thousand days' treatment.

Where the total number of days' treatment shall exceed one thousand, the sum of two hundred dollars for the first one thousand five hundred days' treatment.

Where the total number of days' treatment shall exceed one thousand five hundred, the sum of five hundred dollars for the first one thousand five hundred days' treatment.

Where the total number of days' treatment shall exceed five thousand, the sum of one thousand dollars for the first five thousand days' treatment.
