The Train Broke in Two.

Truro, July 17.—This morning at 1 o'clock a special train from Halifax in charge of Conductor T. V. Christie, broke apart in three sections between Shelburne and Miller's lake. The rear part, pulled with the middle section, and Conductor Christie, who was on the platform, was thrown over the rail of the van by the force of concussion, but retained such a firm hold that the left shoulder got dislocated, causing him to relax his hold.

Head first toward the left shoulder, the wheels, but was unsuccessful, whereupon the van passed over one of his legs, crushing it in a fearful manner and causing a terrible loss.

POINTS ON BUTTER-MAKING. CLEANLINESS NEXT TO GERMINATION IS THE IMPORTANT BRANCH OF INDUSTRY.

The question was asked recently why it was that average domestic butter-makers were obliged to accept such low rates.

It was justly argued that cleanliness was next to germination with American housewives, and that their skill as butter-makers had never been questioned.

Perhaps the subject may seem to some to have been over-thrashed, but I think that it can be reviewed with profit many times a year.

Milk generally begins to sour from the bottom and sides of the vessel, and as soon as thickening takes place more butter globules can escape to the surface to form cream.

The application of cold to the bottom and sides of the vessel containing the milk directly after it has been drawn from the cow and aerated will quickly send the cream to the surface, where all of the after-fermenting to the degree of lapping, cannot add to its quality or quantity.

Even if you wish to ripen cream for the churn, it is quite deleterious to let that sourness take place at the bottom of the vessel.

What domestic butter made by the old plan has not been more or less troubled with milk specks in butter.

Remember, you get no more cream by allowing milk to lapper and, and you injure the quality of what has already ripened.

In this yield, provided you use ice or cold water about the set milk, you obtain the largest possible yield of cream, and of the best quality.

Do not consider that you are making a humiliating concession to let an instrument tell you what long experience has told you in the past.

Whether the churn you use is a wooden or stone one, do not be afraid of using an abundance of scalding hot water on its interior day it has been thoroughly washed.

You cannot see bacteria with the naked eye, but you know that boiling water is deadly to them.
