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ANNUAL MEETING.

ST. ANDREW'S HALL, KINGSTON, APRIL 13TH, 1887.

The Annual Meeting of the congregation was held at 7.30 P.M.

The Rev. Mr. Mackie was elected Chairman, and opened the meeting with prayer.

Mr. T. D. Minnes was appointed Secretary.

Mr. D. Gibson presented the Managers' Report and movel its adoption.-Carried.

Moved by Mr. G. M. Macdonnell, seconded by Mr. J. Duff,

That the following be a Committee to assist the Managers in canvassing the congregation for increased subscriptions to the revenue of the church, with power to add to their number, to report at meeting to be held on May 5th: --Messrs. G. Newlands, Dr. Strange, Wm. Fee, Wm. Massie, Prof. Harris, H Mooers, Dr. Fowler, Wm. Shannon, John Du ff, G. M. Macdonnell, and Dr. Dickson.

The Session Report, the Ladies Home Mission Report, and the Organ Fund Report, were read and adopted.

The Sunday School Reports were read.

Moved by Mr. James Minnes, seconded by Mr. Wm. Massie, Jr.,

That the report be received and adopted, and that a special collection be taken at both services on the first Sabbaths of June and November for the funds of the Sabbath School.—Carried.

On motion of Mr. James Minnes, seconded by Mr. D. Gibson, the four retiring Managers, Messrs. Irving, Ross, Craig and Minnes were reelected.

Mr. D. Gibson gave notice that at a meeting of the congregation to be held on Thursday, May 5th, he would move that the fiscal year of the congregation end on the 31st day of Dec. in each year, and the annual meeting be held on the second Wednesday in January in each year.

The Benediction was pronounced and the meeting adjourned .

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KIRK-SESSION REPORT.

The Kirk-Session in making their Annual Report to the congretion, feel how difficult it is, perhaps impossible, to say anything definitely as regards the spread and progress of true religion throughout the congregation. They hope, yea they believe, that under an earnest ministry much enduring good has been accomplished both in leading into spiritual life, and in leading on to higher christian attainments. The Moderator is not without many private assurances that this has been so, and there are many indications visible to all, that the Spirit of Life is in our midst, ready to make us still more meet for the Master's Service.

During the year the Sacrament of Baptism was administered to 12 children, 20 persons were received into full Communion on profession of their faith, and 6 on presenting disjunction certificates. There were 15 deaths in connection with the congregation. The Communion Roll shows a membership of 338.

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REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGERS.

ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, 13TH APRIL, 1887.

The Managers regret that the financial statement herewith submitted is not more satisfactory; a deficit still remains and the hope expressed in the last report has not been realized A close examination of the figures, however, is not discouraging. The liabilities, which last year amounted to \$594.26, now stand at \$820.35, an increase of \$225.59; but against this we are pleased to note that the revenue is larger than last year by \$269.14.

The extraordinary expenditure has been \$283.61 for repairs and \$105.75 for insurance; the latter item being premium for three years. But for these disbursements, amounting together to \$389.36, our liabilities would have been reduced from last year, and as these expenses will not occur this year, it is evident that all our liabilities and the current expenses of this year can be met by a slight increase of revenue.

The circular issued last month requesting increased subscriptions was cheerfully responded to by a few, but the amount realized did not bring about the desired result. It is hoped that these increased subscriptions will be continued and that many other contributors will see their way to do likewise, after having read the present statement with its explanations.

Your Committee also expect to augment the present revenue considerably by a thorough personal canvass of the congregation at an early date, and looks forward hopefully to a liberal and hearty support to their efforts.

By request of the Presbytery it will be necessary to make our fiscal year end 31st Dec., and we recommend that the annual congregational meeting be held on the third Monday of January in each year. Steps must be taken at this meeting to comply with the wish of the Presbytery.

In consequence of this change your Committee suggest that no pamphlet be published at this date, but that it be issued at the end of the year for the current twenty-one months, when it is hoped your Committee will be in a position to report a satisfactory state of the finances of the congregation.

The retiring Managers are Messrs. W. Irving, A. Ross, W. G. Craig and James Minnes.
