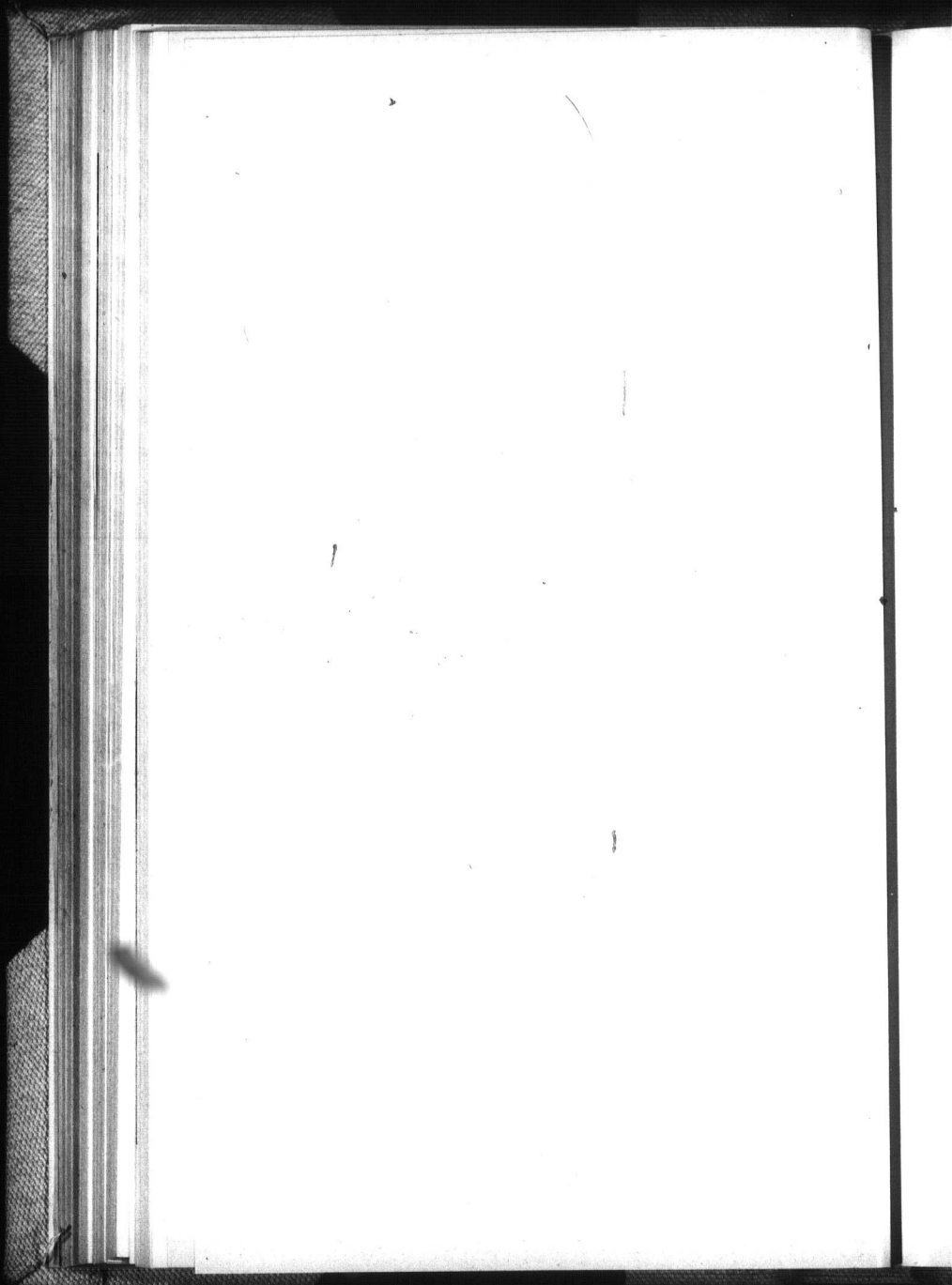

PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME.

The forty-third annual meeting of the Protestant Orphans' Home, Dovercourt, Road, was held yesterday afternoon, and the large assembly room of the building was filled to the doors.

Mayor Kennedy presided, and among those present were Mr. J. K. Macdonald, Rev. Dr. H. W. Davies, Rev. C. H. Mockridge, D.D., Rev. Dr. Burns, Rev. Anthony Hart, Dr. Hunter, Dr. Awde, Major Leigh, Mr. J. J. Kelso, and Mr. Huson Murray. The meeting was opened with prayer by Rev. Dr. Davies. The children, who were tastefully dressed and arranged on the platform, then gave a part song, which was well received.

The Secretary, Mrs. Leigh, then read the annual report of the Lady Managers. During the year the Home was free from sickness. The number of children admitted since June last was 99, as follows:—Boys 51, girls 48. As far as could be ascertained, they were all from the city and province with the exception of three born in the United States. According to religious denominations they were classified as follows:—Anglican 61, Presbyterian 10, Methodist 16, Baptist 10, and two Protestants not otherwise specified. The average number of children each month was 194, and the average number of inmates 204. The number discharged from the institution was 84. Of this number 60 children were taken out by relatives, and 14 were apprenticed. A paragraph in the report expressed warm thanks to the Government for appointing a Superintendent of neglected children for Ontario. Another paragraph stated that the late Secretary was now the wife of the Belgian Consul at Brooklyn, Mrs. Mali. Reference was made to donations received. The Reports of the Secretary and Treasurer were read by Major Leigh.

The statement of the treasurer, Mrs. R. L. Cowan, showed that there was a balance last year of \$614.27. The receipts during the year were \$9,634.48. The expenditure was \$8,556.16, leaving a balance on hand of \$1,692.59.

Rev. H. W. Davies, D.D., then moved the adoption of the reports in a brief address. This motion was seconded by Dr. Awde, and the reports as read were adopted.

Dr. Hunter then read the report of the medical staff, which was very brief, and stated that the health of the children had been exceptionally good. A vote of thanks to the medical staff was moved by Dr. Burns.

A hearty vote of thanks to the retiring managers and officers was moved by Mr. J. K. Macdonald.

Mr. J. J. Kelso made a brief address explaining the work of the institution, of which he is superintendent, and the plan adopted.

Mr. Kelso moved a vote of thanks to the chairman, and the meeting closed with prayer by Rev. Dr. Burns.

THE FORTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME, 1894.

In laying their Annual Report before the public, the Lady Managers feel that they have had a very quiet and uneventful year, no great incidents have marked its course; the ebb and flow of the tide of children has been almost unvarying from month to month, and it is with sincere and devout thanksgiving to their Heavenly Father, they record the small amount of illness, and the ultimate recovery of the invalids, in every case. The children who had been removed to the Isolation Hospital and Sick Children's Hospital returned, evincing that the greatest care had been bestowed upon them.

Number of children admitted since last June 99. Boys 51, girls 48. As far as could be ascertained they were from the city, with the exception of three born in the United States; two from Peterboro Allandale and Euphrasia, one each from Weston, Trenton, Wingham, or other parts of Ontario.

According to their religious denominations they may be classified in the following manner:—Church of England 61, Presbyterian 10, Methodist 16, Baptist 10, and two Protestants not otherwise specified.

The average number of children each month has been 194. The average number of inmates, altogether each month, 204.

In the usual phraseology, 84 children have been "discharged" from the Home—38 boys, and 46 girls. Of this number 60 children, 25 boys and 35 girls, were taken out by relatives; 14 children were apprenticed, eight boys and six girls, in every case going to the country, as it is considered a more wholesome life for young people; four were sent to the Isolation Hospital and Hospital for Sick Children, and returned in a few weeks; one boy was placed in the New Boy's Lodging, after his return from his place, as he was too old to remain in the Home—one girl was sent to another Institution—A little girl and boy were adopted by people without children of their own—a small boy was admitted one day and went away the next, without waiting to be taken by his relatives. A girl went to a lady for a short time, then returned and was apprenticed to a farmer's wife; this had to be entered as two girls, although it is only the same one twice over. In this way it is shown how the 84 children have left the Institution.

Since writing the above, some cases of measles have gone to the Isolation Hospital.

The Lady Managers wish to express their hearty thanks for the kindness and care their children have received in the Isolation and Sick Children's Hospitals.

In November an apprentice having left his place, the case was investigated, when by the advice of his friends, he returned to stay to the end of his time, and from the last accounts he was well and happy.

One family feeling the pressure of hard times offered a horse, of which the boy was fond, instead of wages; this was agreed to, but it is not to occur again; the Managers stipulated for a "good sound horse," telling the boy to take care of it, as it would cost him \$50. A Humane Leaflet on the care of horses was sent to him.

The Lady Managers desire to offer their warmest thanks to the Government for appointing a "Superintendent of neglected and dependent children for the Province of Ontario," and will gladly avail themselves of his services to visit any cases that may arise requiring such supervision; but happily as far as they can judge, their children have found good homes, with people who know how to treat them: As one letter said, "we treat him with kindness which savours of adoption," and another, "The lad grows, keeps himself up and is happy."

The Authorities at the City Hall, in January, asked for statistics of the Home, for ten years, which were carefully compiled by the Secretary. No doubt they intend to give an additional grant, they were so well satisfied. It is a great pleasure to have His Worship here to day.

The Late Secretary Miss Maria Mullin, now Mrs. Mali, kindly sent a donation of \$10 to the home. She is the wife of the Belgian Consul at Brooklyn, and cherishes an interest in her former work in Toronto.

The Lady Managers cannot thank Mr. Huson Murray sufficiently for all his labours on their behalf. He still continues performing his good offices as Solicitor, but he feels rather dubious about the Home receiving any benefit from the estate of the late Mr. Frost. Nor must the Managers fail to acknowledge with sincere gratitude the kindness of the ladies of St. Peter's Church (or Guild) for the sewing they did for the inmates of the Home, which was most useful and highly appreciated where there are so many children to clothe; and their warmest thanks to Miss Johnson for her instructive tuition in the Kindergarten, from which the children have gained so much useful knowledge in household work.

The late Mr. John Buckley kindly left a legacy of \$200 to the Protestant Orphans' Home

A clergyman of the Church of England wrote to know if one of the boys, in whom he was interested, had been baptized, and whether it was the custom of the Home to have them baptized? The answer was "yes, if in doubt," as in the case of the boy found in the Park, who could not tell his name; but *not* the children of people of other denominations, who can see to such things for themselves.

The sum of \$8 was allowed to the Superintendent of the Sunday School for prizes.

This little extract may not be amiss here; some one in parting from his apprentice, at the end of his time, wrote, "he was *truthful*, and that is one of the grandest things with a boy."

What might have proved a very disastrous fire occurred, owing to the defective setting of the kitchen range, by which some of the adjoining wood was badly scorched and charred; but providentially found out and checked in time, by Sergeant Major Wilton, the boy's Superintendent, in the night, for which the friends of the Home cannot be too thankful. In writing about it, the agent of the Western Assurance Company said, "considering the noble work that is being done by the Institution, and its marked success, we have thought it right to ask you to accept a cheque for the amount."

Another correspondent writes "Thank you, very much, for the Report, which is most interesting reading for one who has been so closely identified with the Home from its inception; looking back to the humble frame house on Bay street, with its first inmates, it seems almost incredible that the stately mansion on Dovercourt Road should have sprung from that feeble effort."

The Bishop of Athabasca was present, and saw the children receive their presents from Santa Claus. He spoke of the little Indian children, of the north, who are learning to know what Christmas means.

To show the good feeling existing, on their third year in the Home, the boys presented their Superintendent with a walking stick, and Nurse Wilton with a pickle jar, she returning the compliment with new blue ties. On the 25th anniversary of Miss Wheelwrights coming as Matron, the Lady Managers presented her with a handsome silver entree dish, suitably engraved, and a letter expressive of their appreciation of her long and faithful services.

Sincere thanks are offered to the Medical staff for their kind services; to Mr Graham, to the lady teachers in the school, and to those who have interested themselves in the children;

to the Toronto Railway and the Steamboat Companies, who have given many delightful excursions to them during the holidays, and to the public who have kindly subscribed towards the funds for their support, as well as to the tradesmen and merchants, who have assisted in various ways. A new market waggon was a very useful present from Mr.——, and Mrs. Carlyle's treat of ice cream was as much liked as ever.

The resignation of Mrs. Lightbourn, (who has not been well) from the Board, is much regretted by all. The other members are very glad to have Mrs. VanKoughnet with them this year.

In compliance with a request to do so, the Board elected five delegates to represent the Home at the National Council of Women of Canada. The Secretary attended the first Annual Meeting at Ottawa, and found it most interesting.

The visit of Mrs. Kirkpatrick and the Lieutenant Governor last year, and his kind words, are still remembered with pleasure.

In concluding this report, the following letter from the Rev. Ernest White, will be read with interest:—"If you will kindly arrange as soon as possible, it will be more satisfactory, about sending a girl to the country, and I trust that God Almighty may be guiding us in thus dealing with one of His creatures, and that His richest blessings may be vouchsafed to all those engaged in this high and Godly work."
