perhaps is much more important to the consciences of their peoples." The New Yorker Staats-Zeitung says that "Germany's spokesmen have been insistent that their opponents in the war state definitely and concretely what they are fighting for. It is now the Central Powers' move and they should
be equally willing to restate their war aims as unequivocally as the United States and Great Britain
have stated theirs.' have stated theirs.
