An Act to amend the Post Office Laws.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Post Office Preamble. Laws, in the manner hereinafter provided: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

I. There shall be payable on all Newspapers sent by Post Rate of Postin Canada, except " Exchange Papers" addressed to Editors age on Newsand Publishers of Newspapers, such rate of Postage, not papers. exceeding one cent on each such Newspaper, as the Governor in Council shall from time to time direct by regulation, and 10 such rate shall be payable on all such Newspapers posted on or after the first day of July next.

2. So much of any Act as provides that Newspapers posted Inconsistent within this Province shall pass free of Postage, in cases other enactments than those in which they will be free under this Act, is hereby 15 repealed.

3. In order to adapt the operations of the Post Office Rates convertto the Decimal Currency, the internal letter postage rate shall ed in dec mal be changed from three pence to its equivalent of five cents per currency. half ounce; the charge for advertising a dead letter from three Marthings to two cents; the charge for returning a dead letter to the writer, from one penny to three cents; and in all cases where a one half-penny or penny rate of Postage is chargeable, those rates shall be changed to one cent and two cents respectively.

25 4. To promote simplicity and economy in the business of Extra rate on the Post Office, all letters posted in Canada for any place letters not within the Province, and not prepaid, shall be charged seven prepaid. and a half instead of five cents per half ounce on delivery; and on letters posted for the British Mails, for the other British 30 North American Provinces, or for the United States, when not prepaid, there shall be charged such addition to the ordinary rate, not in any case exceeding a double rate, as the Post Master General may agree upon with the Post Office Authorities of those Countries, for the purpose of enforcing pre-pay-35 ment.

5. The Post Master General may establish a Parcel Post, Parcel Post and Parcels other than letters and not containing letters, may may be estable be sent by such Parcel Post, and when so sent shall be liable to such charges for conveyance, and to such regulations as the 40 Governor in Council shall from time to time see fit to make.

6. The Post Master General shall not be liable to any party Non-liability of Post Master for the loss of any Parcel sent by Parcel Post. General.

Wilfully destroying parcels, &c.

7. Wilfully and maliciously to destroy, damage, detain or delay any Parcel sent by Parcel Post, shall be a misdemeanor.

8. To inclose a letter or letters, or any writing intended to 5 serve the purpose of a letter, in a Parcel posted for the Newspapers or Parcel Post, shall be a misdemeanor; and to inclose a letter, misdemeanor or any writing, or to make any written marks to serve the purpose of a letter, or to inclose any other thing, in a newspaper posted to pass as a newspaper, at the rate of postage applicable 10 to newspapers, (except in the case of the accounts and receip of newspaper publishers, which are permitted to pass folded within the newspapers sent by them to their subscribers,) shall be a misdemeanor.

Money order system may be extended to order and from the United Kingdom.

9. In order to carry into effect an arrangement which has 15 been made between the Imperial Government and the Government of this Province, the Governor in Council may, by regulations to be from time to time made, extend the Money Order system, so as to include the granting of Money Orders on Post Masters in the United Kingdom, and the payment of Money 20 Orders drawn by such Post Masters on Post Masters in this Province, on such terms and conditions as he may deem expedient.

Foreign Newsthe Post Office.

10. It shall not be lawful to bring any Foreign Newspapers, &c., paper, or any Foreign printed publication not liable to a duty 25 to be brought of Creations. only through of Customs, into this Province in any other way than through the Provincial Post Office; And any such Newspaper or publication brought into this Province otherwise than through the Post Office, shall be forfeited and may be seized and forth-30 with destroyed by any officer of the Customs or of the Post Office as prohibited goods, and the person bringing in the same shall be liable to the like penalty as a person bringing in goods prohibited by the Customs laws, and recoverable in like manner; --- But this prohibition shall not apply to one copy of 35 any such Newspaper or publication brought into the Province bond fide by any Traveller for his own use.
