Mrs. Lulu Prince-Kennedy Found Guilty of Murder in the

Her Father and Brothers to Be Tried for Complicity.

CRIME COMMITTED JAN. 10

Her Conduct While in Jail Five Months Baffled Officers No

in the criminal court today decided that Lulu Prince-Kennedy was guilty of murder in the second degree for having killed her husband, P. H. Kennedy, on January 10 last, and assessed her punishment at ten years in the penitentiary. When the verdict was read this remarkable 20-year-old prisoner, whose cool, indifferent manner has for five months baffled the jail officers who have had her in charge, looked straight ahead of her. She neither burst out crying nor moved a muscle. Later she expressed interest, but nothing more, in the formal call ing by the clerk of the cases pending against her father, C. W. Prince, and her brothers, Bert and Will Prince, who are charged with conspiring to kill Kennedy.

While Judge Wofford was dismissing the jurors who had sat on the case for twelve days and reached their verdict after eleven hours' deliberation the prisoner sat with her chin resting on
