TELEGRAPH PER ATLANTIC CABLE.

Despatches to the Evening Mercury.

London, Dec. 2, midnight.—Prime Minister Disraeli has published an address announcing and defending the resignation of the Ministry. He reviews the progress of the Resolves in favour of the Disestablishment of the Irish Church. Believing the country would not sanction such a measure the Government awaited the Elections, for the holding of which all expedition was used. The result shows that the Ministry cannot command the respect of the new House of Commons, therefore they feel it due to their own honour, and to the policy supported by them not to continue unnecessarily in office a single day, deeming it more consistent with the attitude they hold to the convenience of public business and the influence of their party to resign at once, instead of waiting for the mesting of a Parliament in which they must be in a minority. While taking this course they do not modify their opinions, and are more than ever convinced that Mr. Gladstone's proposition is wrong in principle and probably impracticable, and one which even if practicable would be disastrous to the nation. They are ready to support Reform in the Church of Ireland, but will still offer uncompromising resistance to the policy enunciated by Mr. Gladstone.
