This northern country is very healthy. The ciear, bracing atmosphere would al-most make a sick man feel well. The winter is perhaps two or three weeks longer than in the County of Wellington, and more snow falls. The summer is pleasant, only the mosquitoes and black files for five or six weeks are very trouble-some. They are all gone now, so that one can have comfort in working or walk-fing about. The land here is all "free grant," and costs the settler nothing. All that is re-quired is that the settler does "settle-ment duty," which is to clear fitteen acres and erect a dwelling house lottoft. Five years is the period allowed to do this, and at the end of that time if the settler has complied with the require.






