THE RISING IN IRELAND.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11.—The oath was administered to Aldrich and the New York senators. A committee was appointed to inform the president that the senate was ready to receive any communication he might please to send. The committee reported that the president stated he would communicate in writing with the senate tomorrow. At noon the cabinet convened at the residence of Jones, all the members being present. It is believed Wilson and McVeigh will retire to-night. The president has a hundred non-commissions to send to the senate, and the general impression is that the final appointment of the senate will be possible in two or three days. One of the first subjects for the attention of the president will be the retirement of the army and navy. General McDowell will be one of the first officers to be retired, and Colonel Rogers will be his successor. Admiral Rucker and Howell will be retained.

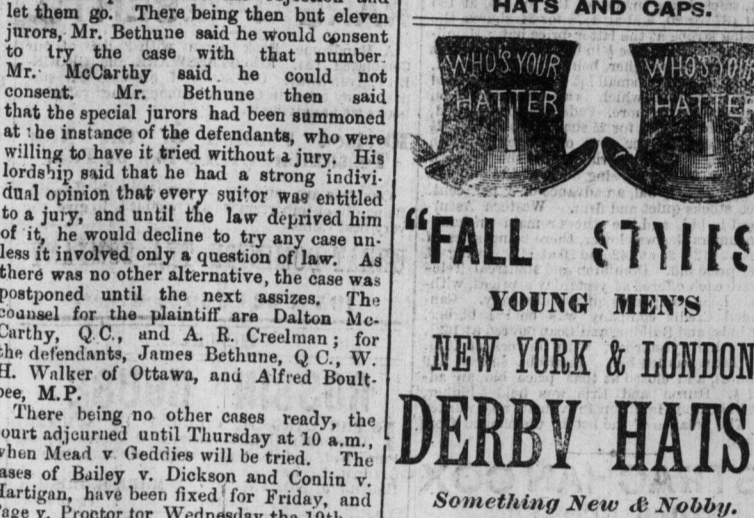

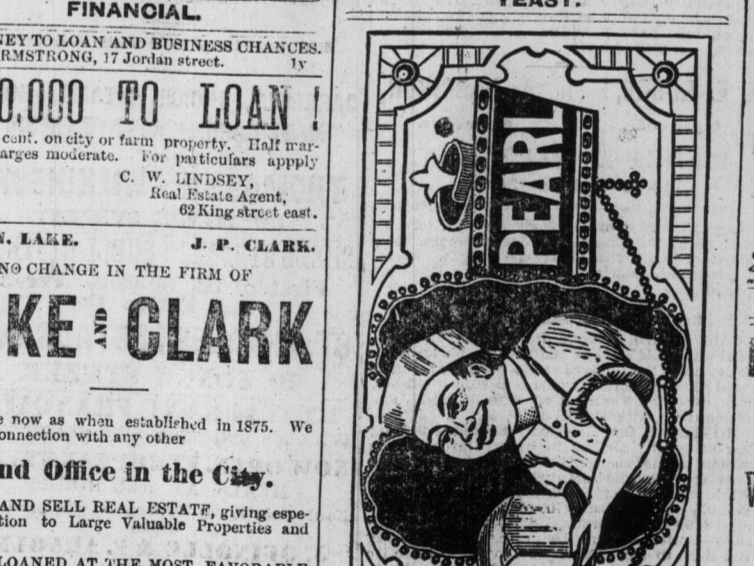
