THE IRISH HOME RULE BILL.

PASSES ITS SECOND READING BY A MAJORITY.

Brilliantly Assailed by the Opposition And as Brilliantly Defended by Mr. Gladstone—No. 10, Downing Street, Government Raika—The Premier Repeats an Oration on the Result.

London, April 21.—The Home Rule bill passed its second reading to-night by a majority of 43.

The members of the House of Commons who voted in favour of the bill were 113 in number. The opposition numbered 70.

Mr. Gladstone's speech was a masterpiece of logic and eloquence. He pointed out the necessity of Home Rule for Ireland and the benefits it would bring to the Irish people.

The opposition, led by Mr. Chamberlain, argued that Home Rule would lead to the disintegration of the British Empire and the loss of Ireland's connection with the rest of the world.

Mr. Gladstone's reply was equally powerful. He stated that Home Rule was a necessary step towards the achievement of Irish self-government and the well-being of the Irish people.

Does a Money Panic Threaten the United States?

Financial matters here have been assuming an alarming nature in the United States. Their silver legislation has disordered things. Signs of the coming trouble were to be seen months ago, but no one would make a move to avoid the threatened storm.

Concurrent with this silver disturbance there has been a prodigious expansion of the United States budget. The pension list alone has been swollen by hundreds of millions; and now, in view of the demand for tariff reform and a falling off in the revenue, comes the call that the Government shall do something to relieve the financial situation.

We believe that things in the United States will be at a silver lull in a few days, that gold will be at a premium, that American securities will be returned to ship loads, and that only those who made their contracts on a gold basis will escape loss in the readjustment.

In the meantime The World begs to observe that the politician or business man who is counting on "sleeping tariff reform" in the United States in the near future is almost certain to be disappointed. It will not be this year, but some other year.

The American Naval Spirit. Harper's Weekly protests against the movement afoot in the United States to build an enormous navy. This jingo spirit manifested itself recently in the effort to annex Hawaii. To the argument in favor of a great navy, that American commerce must be protected, The Weekly says the only thing American trade has to fear is "the legitimate business competition of other nations."

Just as a revolver is seductive as to manslaughter so is a great navy likely to lead its owners into war. The American naval officers are beginning to dream of "brilliant actions." Papers of the culture of the New York Sun are feeding this flame. With all which statements of Harper's Weekly The World is pleased to agree, but when we turn back the files of that excellent pictorial paper and notice with what pertinacity its pages are covered with illustrations of man-of-war life, as for instance on the first page of this week's issue, we are almost led to suspect that Harper's Weekly had an order from the Navy Department at Washington to create and cultivate a naval spirit, even if all the time-honored pictures of British warship life had to be reproduced.

The City Should Intervene. The railway crossing difficulty in the East End is a somewhat mixed affair. It is hard to locate the responsibility for the continuation of the electric service over the Don, but it is a fact the cessation is causing a great deal of inconvenience to the people in the East End, and unless the status quo is altered before the 31st of May such a howl will be raised by the Ontario Jockey Club and those interested in the Woodbine races that something will have to be done. As the matter now stands, the following section of the Dominion Railway Act has not been complied with:

The railway of any company shall not be crossed, intersected, joined or united by or with any other railway, whether constructed under Dominion, provincial or municipal authority or otherwise, unless the place and mode of the proposed crossing, intersection or junction or union are first approved by the Railway Committee, etc.
