





This school will have 18 rooms of which 6 will be used for vocational education. The govern-ment vocational grant will cover 50 per cent. of that part of the building de-voted to vocational purposes. The Fredericton High School is to open a vocational department under a vocational committee in Fredericton with two teachers in January. These teach-ers both have practical experience in commercial life. The government will pay 60 per cent. of their salaries and 50 per cent. of their equipment. The board will hold a course in storage batteries and ignition in Jan-uary and February in Fredericton, open to garage men of the province. This is the first time a course of this kind will have been run in New Brunswick. It is reported there are 14 communi-ties carrying on day school work in vo-cational subjects during the present term. During the summer 40 communities
