# ANNOUNCEMENT FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR, 1875-6.

"THE COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS OF ONTARIO" is the name adopted in its corporate capacity by the Medical Profession of the Province of Ontario. Every legally qualified Medical Practitioner in the Province being a Member of this College, it will at once be understood that it is not an Institution for the teaching of Medicine.

The Medical Profession in Quario was first incorporated under this name by an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1866. This Act was subsequently repealed by the Legislature of Ontario in 1869, and now the affairs of the Profession in this Province are regulated by an Act passed in 1874, (87 Vic., cap. 80), which is commonly known as the "Ontario Medical Act."

By this Act, the "COUNCIL OF THE COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS OF ONTARIO" is empowered and directed to enact By-laws: for the Regulation of all matters connected with Medical Education; for the admission and enrolment of Students of Medicine; for determining from time to time the Curriculum of the Studies to be pursued by them; and to appoint a Board of Examiners before whom they must pass a satisfactory Examination before they can be enrolled as Members of the College, and thus be legally qualified to practise their profession in Ontario.

The Council moreover, has power and authority conferred upon it by this Act, to fix the terms upon which Practitioners of Medicine, duly qualified in other Countries, may be admitted as Members of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario; this being the only mode in which they can become legally entitled to practise their profession in this Province.

For the information and guidance of Students of Medicine, the Profession, and the public generally, the Council, in conformity with the "Ontario Medical Act," hereby promulgates for the Academic year 1875-6,\* the "REGULATIONS" which hereinafter follow, repealing all others heretofore in force.

### SECTION I.

### MATRICULATION.

 The Examinations in Preliminary Education will be held in Toronto and in Kingston, on the first Tuesday and Wednesday in January, April, July and October in every year.

2. Every Student of Medicine in Ontario must, before his Professional studies begin, pass a satisfactory Examination upon the following Subjects, viz.:

ENGLISH LANGUAGE, including Grammar and Composition, ARITHMETIC, including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions, ALGEBRA, including Simple Equations, GROMETRY, first two Books of Euclid.

And upon one of the following Subjects, (of which Students are recommended to select either Natural Philosophy, or one of the Modern Languages,) the Candidate having the option of naming the Subject upon which he\* will be examined, viz.:

GREEK, FRENCH,

GERMAN.

NATURAL PHILOSOPHY, including Mechanics, Hydrostatics and Pneumatics.

 The following are the Text-books to be used in this Examination. Where more than one is named, the Candidate may select the one upon which he will prefer to be examined. viz.:

LATIN—Cæsar, Commentaries on Gallic War, fifth and sixth Books; Cicero, Manilian Law; Virgil, Eneid, second Book.
GREEK—Xenophon, Anabasis, first Book.
FRENCH—Voltaire, Charles XII, first, second and third Books.
GERMAN—Adler's Reader, first part.
NATURAL PHILOSOPHY—Peck's Ganot; Sangster's first Book.

4. Evidence of having passed a Matriculation Examination in any

of the recognized Medical Institutions of Canada prior to July 1870, will exempt from Matriculating before the Examiners of the Council, upon payment of Ten Dollars.

- 5. Graduates in Arts, or Students having Matriculated in Arts in any University in Her Majesty's Dominions, are not required to pass the Matriculation-Examination, but may register their names with the Registrar of the College, upon giving satisfactory evidence of their qualifications and upon paying the Matriculation-fee of Ten Dollars.
- 6. Every Medical Student after Matriculating, shall be registered in the manner prescribed by the Council, and this shall be held to be the preliminary to his Medical studies, which shall only be considered to begin from the date of such Rogistration.

### SEČŤÍON II.

### MEDICAL CURRICULUM

- 1. Every Student after his Matriculation has been registered, must spend a period of Four years in actual Professional study, except as hereinafter provided.
- 2. Graduates in Arts of any College or University recognized by the Council, will only be required to pass Three years after graduating, in attendance upon Medical Lectures before being admitted to their Final Examination.
- 3. Every Student shall attend Medical Lectures for at least Three Sessions of six months each, and the said Three Sessions must be included in the first three years.
- 4. Each "Six-Months Course" shall consist of not less than One Hundred Lectures.
- 5. Every Student must attend the undermentioned Courses of Lectures\* in a University, College or School of Medicine approved of by the Council, viz

Two Courses of Six Months each upon ANATOMY, PRACTICAL ANATOMY,

\*No certificate of attendance upon any Course will be accepted if the Teacher-lectures upon more than one Branch of Medical Science, nor if he delivers more than one Lecture daily. However, the Lecturer on Medicine may lecture upon Clinical Medicine; the Lecturer on Surgery, upon Clinical Surgery; and the Lecturer on Materia Medica, upon Botany and upon Medical Jurieprudence. Furthermore, no certificate of pupilage, nor of attendance upon Lectures, in the Province of Ontario, will hereafter be accepted, if the person certifying the same be not a duly Registered Practitioner, excepting in the Subjects of Botany and Chemistry.

- 7. Every Student before being admitted to the Final Examination hereinafter mentioned, must have spent a period of Six months in the office of a regularly qualified Medical Practitioner,\* in compounding medicines.
- 8. He must have attended the practice of a General Hospital for Eighteen months.
  - 9. He must have attended Six cases of Midwifery.
  - 10. He must, before being registered as a Member of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, have passed all the Examina-

<sup>\*</sup> The words "regularly qualified" are applicable only to Practitioners registered according to law.

tions hereinafter prescribed; and he must have attained the full age of twenty-one years.

- 11. (a) All persons from recognized Colleges outside the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec, who desire to qualify themselves for Registration in this Province, must pass the Matriculation-Examination established by the Council, and attend thereafter one full "Winter-Course" of Lectures in some one of the Ontario Medical Schools, and such other Course or Courses as may be necessary to complete the Curriculum required by the Council, and shall pass, before the Board of Examiners appointed by the Council, all the Examinations hereinafter prescribed.
- (b) Nothing shall exempt residents of Ontario, who after this date elect to pursue their studies outside of the Province of Ontario, from passing Four years in the pursuit of their Professional Studies; such Four years to commence at the date of their passing the Matriculation-Examination before the Examiners appointed for that purpose by the Council.

### SECTION III.

### EXAMINATIONS.

- 1. The Professional Examinations are henceforward to be divided into three Annual Examinations, and a Final Examination.
- 2. The Final Examination is to be undergone at the end of the Fourth year.
- 3. The following Branches will be the Subjects of the First-year's Examination, viz:

ANATOMY, of the Bones, Ligaments, Muscles, and the Viscera of the Chest and Abdomen.

PHYSIOLOGY, of Locomotion, Respiration, Circulation and Digestion.
CHEMISTRY, Inorganic.
BOTANY.

4. The following Branches will be included in the Second-year's Examination, viz:

ANATOMY, other than that of First year,
PHYSIOLOGY, other than that of First year, with Microscopic Anatomy.
CHEMISTRY, THEORETICAL AND PRACTICAL, other than that of First
year.
SANITARY SCIENCE.

5. The Third-year's Examination will include:

ANATOMY, Surgical and Demonstrative, PATHOLOGY, Medical and Surgical, MEDICAL JURISPRUDENCE, SURGERY, Operative, MIDWIFERY, Operative. 6. The Examination for the Fourth year or "Final" Examination will include:

TOXICOLOGY (optional for third or fourth year),
MATERIA-MEDICA AND THERAPEUTICS,
THEORY AND PRACTICE OF MEDICINE,
MIDWIFERY, other than Operative, AND DISEASES OF WOMEN AND
CHILDREN,
SURGERY, other than Operative.

 The Third and Fourth years Examinations will be as Clinical and Demonstrative as possible.

8. The first three Annual Examinations are in all respects the same for every Candidate.

- 9. Any Candidate who at his various Examinations passes creditably in three or more Branches, but fails in the others, shall receive credit for the Subjects successfully passed, and only be compelled to pass in the other Branches at a subsequent Examination.
- 10. In the event of any Candidates for Examination desiring to be registered as Homceopathic Members of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, notice of such desire must be given to the Registrar, so that their Examination may be conducted by the Examiners appointed for that purpose; but prior to the acceptance of such notice from these Candidates (which notice shall be considered confidential by the Registrar), the usual fees must be paid. The Registrar shall then inform the Homceopathic Examiners of the fact of such application having been made, that they may be propared for the examination of the Candidates, whose names shall not be divulged. All regulations of the Council inconsistent with the above are hereby repealed.
- 11. The next Medical Examinations will be held in Toronto, beginning on Tuesday, 28th September, 1875, in the Convocation-Hall of the Toronto University. Due notice will be given of the time and place of the Examinations to be held in the Spring of 1876.\*
- 12. Students who present themselves for examination at the Spring Examinations of 1876, having completed Three "Six-months Courses" of Lectures will be examined upon the Subjects heretofore included in the "Primary-Examination."
- 13. Until the 17th day of July, 1876, the Examinations will continue, as heretofore, to be divided into "Primary" and "Final;" nevertheless it will be optional with any Student, who at the Spring Examinations of 1876, shall have attended Two "Six-Months

### SECTION IV.

### EXAMINATIONS.

Rules for the Guidance of the Board of Examiners.

- No Teacher in any School of Medicine in Ontario can hold the position of Examiner on the Subjects upon which he lectures, or upon which he may have lectured within six months prior to the date of the Examinations.
- 2. Each Member of the Board of Examiners will prepare the Questions for the Written-Examinations upon the Subjects allotted to him by the Council. Any Examiner may be present at any of the Examinations, and there must invariably be not less than two Members of the Board present at every Examination.
- 3. The Questions proposed to Candidates will be dictated to the at the beginning of the Examination upon each Branch, or Sub-division of a Branch, but they are not to be circulated in printed form, nor allowed to be seen by any one.
- 4. Each Examiner will deliver to the Registrar, after the Examinations, a copy of the Questions which were proposed by him at the "Written-Examinations," with the view to their being ultimately printed under the direction of the Council, if it should be considered advisable.
- 5. The written answers to the Questions are to be handed to the Registrar, who will open the envelopes, in which they are hereinafter directed to be enclosed, and to each set of papersaffix a Number by which the author will be known by Examiners during the Examinations. The Registrar will then deliver the papers to the Member of the Board of Examiners appointed by the Council to examine upon the Subject.
- 6. The papers, when delivered to the Member of the Board of Examiners appointed by the Council to examine upon the Subject, are to be by him examined, and the relative value of the answers marked by means of Numbers, ranging from 0 to 100, in the Schedule which will be furnished to him by the Registrar.
- 7. The values awarded by the individual Examiners to the answers of Candidates are not to be subject to revision, except by an appeal to the Executive Committee, or (if desired), to the Council.
- 8. The papers on the "General" Subjects of Examination are to be finally submitted to the whole Board for approval or rejection; and

those upon the Homospathic Subjects, to the Examiners approved of for that purpose by the Representatives of that System in the Council.

9. The "Oral-Examinations" are to be conducted by the whole Board of Examiners, any Member of which may put such questions as may to him appear proper, to any Candidate, upon any of the "General" Subjects of Examination.

10. The passing or the rejection of any Candidate is to be decided by a vote of the whole Board of Examiners.

11. The "Written-Examination" shall be concluded, the answers valued by the Examiners (whose decision in the Special\* Subjects shall be final), the Schedules compared, and, so far as the "Written-Examinations" are satisfactory to the Board, the decision must be recorded in favor of the Candidate, before he is brought face to face with the Examiners in the "Oral-Examination."

### Rules for Candidates when in the Examination-Hall.

12. Each Candidate will receive from the Registrar a Ticket, upon which a Number will be written, referring to a seat in the Examination-Hall to be occupied by the Candidate at each Examination; the Ticket will also contain a list of the Subjects upon which the Candidate is to be examined, and it will entitle him to be admitted to the Examination-Hall during the progress of the Examinations upon such Subjects, but at no other time.

18. . Candidates must write the answers to the Questions given out by the Examiners, legibly and neatly upon one side only of whole sheets of paper, and the Number given with each Question is to be put at the head of the answer to it. The sheets are to be paged and fastened together in regular order, by means of paper-fasteners, at the upper left corner, in such a manner as to have the first page facing outwards to the view; they are then to be folded neatly and enclosed in an envelope, on the outside of which each Candidate is to write his name. The packet is then to be handed to the Registrar, or to some one deputed by him. Neither signature, number nor sign by which the writer could be recognized by the Examiner, is to be written or marked upon any of the sheets enclosed in the envelope.

14. The Questions of the Examiners in the Homeopathic Subjects will be handed in writing, at the beginning of the "General" Examination on the same Subject, to such Candidates as have given notice to the Registrar in accordance with Section III, Sub-sec. 10. They shall write the answers to these Questions in the same Hall with the other Candidates, and hand their papers, when finished, to the

<sup>\*</sup>By "Special Subjects" those in the Homœopathic System of Medicine are meant.

Registrar, in the same manner as provided for the other Candidates, to be by him given for examination to the Homeopathic Member of the Board of Examiners appointed to examine upon that subject.

- 15. If any abbreviations are used in answering the Questions, Candidates must be careful that they are such as are generally understood, or which cannot be mistaken.
- 16. No Candidate will be allowed to leave the Hall after the Questions are given out, until his answers have been handed in.
- 17. No Candidates will be allowed in the Hall during the hours of Examination, except those who are actually undergoing examination.
- 18. Any Candidate who may have brought any book or referencepaper to the Hall, must deposit it with the Examiner before the Examination begins.
- 19. Candidates must not communicate with each other while the Examinations are going on, neither by writing, signs, words, nor in any manner whatever.
- 20. Candidates must conduct themselves with decorum during the Examinations. They must bear themselves towards the Examiners with the utmost deference and respect; and they will not be permitted in any manner to manifest approbation or disapprobation of any Member of the Board of Examiners, during the progress of the Examinations.
- 21. Any infraction of the above rules, will lead to the exclusion of the Candidate who is guilty of it, from the remainder of the Examinations; and he will not receive credit for any Examination-papers which he may have handed in to the Registrar, previous to his being detected in such misconduct.



### REMARKS ON

THE

### PENAL CLAUSES

OF THE

### ONTARIO MEDICAL ACT

FOR THE GUIDANCE OF MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS.

The following rules are intended for the guidance of Members of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, in carrying into effect the "Penal Clauses" of "The Ontario Medical Act."

Members will bear in mind that no prosecution can be successful unless the evidence against the accused party is sufficient to bring the case within the rules hereinafter laid down.

All communications with the officers of the Council will of course be considered strictly confidential.

The "Penal and General Clauses" which are referred to, are Section XXXIV and the Sections which follow it of the Medical Act of Ontario, 87 Vic., Cap. 80.

### SECTION XXXIV.

This clause enacts that any registered Practitioner convicted of felony shall thereby forfeit the right of registration, or if already registered his name by direction of the Council, may be erased.

RULE I.—In the first case, the Registrar should be furnished with the christian and surname of the party, and the offence for which he was convicted, together with his last known address, and the place and Assize at which he was tried.

RULE II.—In case any Member becomes aware that a party who has been convicted of felony intends to apply for registration, he should communicate to the Registrar the facts mentioned in Rule I., so that they may be of record in a list for that purpose kept by the Registrar.

### SECTION XXXIX.

This Section refers to procuring registration by false or fraudulent representations or declarations, verbal or written, and the penalty to persons aiding or assisting therein. Rule III.—As to "fraudulent representation," be prepared to prove

(1) any false representation that the person applying makes to
bring himself within any of the eight clauses in Schedule "A"
to the Act. Such as the alteration, falsification, or forgery of a
certificate from any School or College—as mentioned—or of any
School or College recognized by the Medical Council. Any
material alteration of a Certificate amounts to forgery thereof.
A "material alteration" is of the date, name of person, or other
fact in the instrument. (2) That the party seeking registration
was not practising in Ontario prior to 1st January, 1850,
and had not attended one course of lectures at any recognized
School. (Sec. XXII, Sub-sec. 2.) (8) In case of Homeopaths
and Eclectics, any false representation that the person seeking
registration had been practising prior to 1st January, 1850,
or for the last six years in Ontario (prior to the date of this
Act coming into force, 24th March, 1874.) (Sec. XXII, Subsec. 2.)

### SECTION XL, SUB-SECTION 1.

This clause is as follows:-

"It shall not be lawful for any person, not registered, to practise Physic, Surgery, or Midwifery in the Province of Ontario, for hire, gain, or hope of reward; and if any person not registered under this Act, shall, for hire, gain, or hope of reward, practise or profess to practise Physic, Surgery, or Midwifery, or advertise to give advice in Physic, Surgery, or Midwifery, or advertise to give advice in Physic, Surgery, or Midwifery in the Province of Ontario, he shall upon a summary conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace, for any and every such offence, pay a penalty not exceeding One Hundred Dollars, nor less than Twenty-five Dollars."

Rule IV.—(1) If accused attempt to prove any registration, see that it be done according to Section XL, by the production of the Register with Registrar's certificate. (2) If he hold himself out to the public as a Physician or Surgeon, proof by parties aware of the fact, or the production and proof of advertisement, or proof of sign or notice in other form, published or circulated by him or by his agent, must be forthcoming. (8) If he has attended persons, and treated or prescribed for complaints or illness, the fact may be proved by a patient, and sometimes by the Druggist making up prescriptions signed or ordered by him; but in this case it must also be proved that he received pay or stipulated for it. (4) If he has taken fees, or been paid for Medical or Surgical services rendered, the best proof will be the evidence of the party who made the payment. (5) Where payment has not actually been made, and he has rendered an account, or has made some bargain for remuneration with the patient, the production and proof of the account, or the evidence of the patient will be necessary.

### SECTION XL, SUB-SECTION 2.

"Any person who shall wilfully or falsely pretend to be a Physician, Doctor of Medicine, Surgeon, or General Practitioner, or shall assume any title, addition or description other than he actually possesses, and is legally entitled to, shall be liable, on conviction thereof before a Justice of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding Fifty Dollars, nor less than Ten Dollars."

Rule V.—(1) Put him to proof of registration as above. (2) Prove that he has published or used cards, handbills, or other sign or means of circulating either the title of "Dr." or the letters M.D. or M.B., or any one of the additions or titles mentioned in the table of abbreviations in Medical Register, or any other description which would lead the public to believe him to be a Practitioner.

### SECTION XL, SUB-SECTION 8.

This Clause is nearly to the same effect as the one preceding, but it will be found chiefly to apply to such Members of the Profession as have neglected or refused to register, and to Practitioners who assume titles to which they are not legally entitled.

### HOW TO PROCEED TO PROCURE A CONVICTION.

Go to the nearest or most intelligent Magistrate and lay information, which may be sworn to, either on information and belief, or positively. (See forms below.)

The Magistrate thereupon issues his summons, or if he think fit, a warrant, for the arrest of the party; and if the party served with a summons do not appear, the Justice may on oath or affirmation substantiating the matter of the information, issue his warrant for the arrest of the party so summoned. In case of a warrant issued in the first instance, the Justice shall furnish a copy thereof, and a copy must be served on the party arrested at the time of his arrest.

In case of an adjournment of the case when the party accused is under arrest, the Justice may take bail.
