we are at pence with all nations, that we have heen greatly blessed by Providence, and that the scourge, cholers, has been staid. Our felations with Great Britain are of a friendly character.—The recent alteration in the anxightion laws by Great Britain, and reciprocated in by us, are likely to prove materially advantageous. A slight interruption in the diplomatic relations with France has been terminated. Our minister had been received in that country, and one had been appointed to this government.

The suppression of the Expedition against Cuba is slightly alluded to.—The President studiously avoided interference during the conflict between Austria and Hungary. He stood prepared in case of success on the part of the Hungarians to welcome them among the firmily of nations.—He invested an agent with power to recognise their independence should circumstances justify it.

Our claims upon Portugal have been pressed with renewed vigor. During the late revolution at Rome our charge had been unable to present his letters of credence. The President recommends the cultivation of friendly relations with Wexico, and the faithful observance of treaties.—He recommends close relations of friendship with South American states burdering on the Pacific. A convention had been negociated with Frazil providing for the settlement of American claims. Calls attention to existing law's concerning the African slave trade, with a view of its more effectual faithful execution.

The President recommends a revision of the existing turill on a basis which shall augment the revenue, and does not doubt the right of Congress to encourage domestic industry; he thinks specific daties best adapted to prevent fraud; recommends duties high enough to protect home midustry. The applications of Ca ilfornix for admission into the Union, should receive the favourable consideration of leght houses.

A contract having been made with Nicaragua by a company composed of Americans, for the purpose of a ship cannot, the President has directed necessary suppor
