### Household Hints.

Useful hints to housekeepers are the following: To clean a clock lay in the bottom a rag saturated with kerosene oil. The fumes will loosen the dirt, and it will drop out. To a few days remove and place another saturated rag in the clock, the fumes of which will lubricate the works. A small, stiff brush should be used for cleaning all vegetables that grow under ground. It will remove the dirt which often stains the hands. Another useful brush for use in the kitchen is a small soft varnish brush for brushing biscuits, bread, rolls, and pastry shells with melted butter. Fresh green vegetables will retain their bright color best if cooked underneath the cover of the kettle deadens any fresh coloring. Spinach will be much improved in water until nearly boiled in salted water and dropped into cold water until chilled. It should then be thoroughly drained, after which it is ready for use. Never use a whole egg to clear your coffee. If it is properly made from moments after it boils it is sufficiently cleared. At a meeting of the Municipal Council held at Chester, April 19th, 1907, the following resolution passed unanimously: "Whereas the extension of railways in the Province is necessary to the advancement of trade and the welfare of the commonwealth, and in view of the marked progress of the localities through which lines of railway pass, and whereas it is expedient that this country should be in the line of progress and ready to meet our opportunities; Therefore resolved: That the Municipality of Chester through the Council in session, do agree to give a free right of way to any railway company that will build a line of railway from Windsor to Chester via New Ross, tapping the Halifax S. W. R. R. at a point near Chester, thereby assuring to the Midland counties as well as our own back country a quick and easy route to the sea and an open winter port for any class of shipping."

### Care of Shoes.

An excellent preservative of shoe leather is vaseline. Have a box of oiled hands and when the shoes are taken off remove all mud and dirt, lace or button them, fill half full with oiled hands and stuff the tops with crumpled paper. When necessary to wear the shoes empty them and they will be found to have kept their shape, and will not be drawn if they were in the least damp when taken off.

There was a good representative attendance of citizens at the public meeting in Temperance Hall on Thursday evening of last week. Mayor Black presided in an impartial manner and succeeded fairly well in keeping the different speakers to the point. A resolution was moved by Mr. C. R. H. Starr and seconded by Dr. DeWitt, authorizing an expenditure of \$20,000 under the provision of the Act of the legislature passed last winter, for the purpose of installing and carrying on an electric light and power plant. A lengthy and at times animated discussion ensued, in which a number of citizens took part, the vote at the close standing 45 for 12 against.

An exchange says the first seizure of liquors in Truro under the new Provincial law, which affects carriers, was made Thursday morning, when officers Gass and Johnson seized four cases of liquors and part of another case, which they found in the warehouse of the Canadian Express Company's office there. We understand that a number of cases have been received at this station, but for some reason have not been seized. The law gives any inspector authority to examine, and if necessary, open any package suspected of being shipped in violation of the act, for the purpose of ascertaining whether such package contains liquor.

### The 'Brown Tail Moth.'

During the past two weeks the government has had from two to five men going through the Valley, giving instructions how to recognize and combat the 'Brown Tail Moth.' Prof. Cumming writes THE ACADIAN that he regrets to find that this serious pest is more widespread than was at first suspected. In order to encourage the further destruction of nests the Department of Agriculture will pay three cents each for every nest collected, morning or evening, when the caterpillars are in their nests. To insure the success of this work all school-teachers are asked to co-operate in receiving, counting and reporting to the Department of Agriculture in Truro the number of nests handed in by the various collectors. Any expense for postage, etc., incurred in this connection, will be paid by the Department. Should any teacher not be familiar with the appearance of the nests the Department will, on application, send an expert to identify the specimens. Here is an opportunity for the school-children to earn some pocket-money, and at the same time assist in warding off an attack of the most serious insect pest we have yet had to contend with in Nova Scotia. It is hoped that teachers and all others will in every way assist in this work.

The lecture given by Rev. W. R. Foot in St. Andrew's church on Wednesday evening, under the auspices of the Senior Mission Band, was a most interesting and instructive one. Rev. D. Wright presided, and after singing, scripture reading and prayer, introduced the speaker, who gave a very clear and interesting statement of the work being done by missionary enterprise in Korea. At the close addresses were given by Dr. R. V. Jones, Rev. L. D. Morse and Rev. Mr. McCabe, all of whom expressed themselves as having been intensely interested in the story told. The offering amounted to something over twenty-one dollars, which will be devoted to the Band's contribution to the missionary cause in Korea.
