One of the foulest murders that ever diagraced the annals of Canada was perpetrated within half a mile of this village on Saturday evening. The excitement here and in the country is intense and the wrime is the sole topic of conversation. Even in Hamilton great indignation is expressed at the foul murder of one who was so well and favourably known to the citizens. The particulars of the murder as far as can be gleaned are as follows:—The deceased, Abel McDonald, aged between 50 and 60 years, was returning on Saturday night from Hamilton, where he had been with a load of grain, for which he was set upon by some person or persons unknown and rebbed and here was been consequent.
