Do what is next to thee; Love doth not measure; If not thy pleasure, Still thine the peace will be.

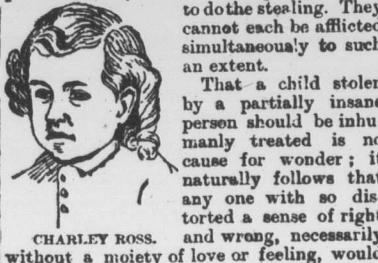
My boy sat looking straight into coals, From his stool at my feet one day, And the firelight burnished the curly head,

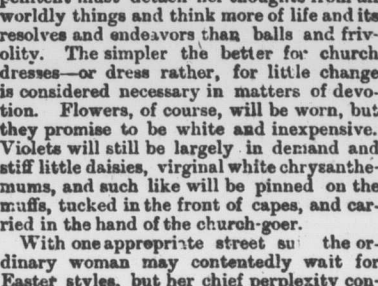

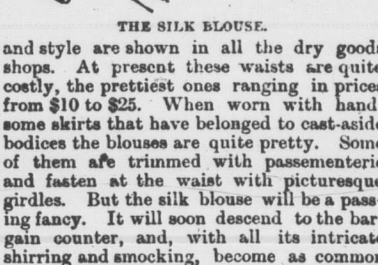
Why are children stolen? Not many of them are kidnaped in the hope of pecuniary reward; cases of this sort, such as the Charles Ross abduction, are rare.

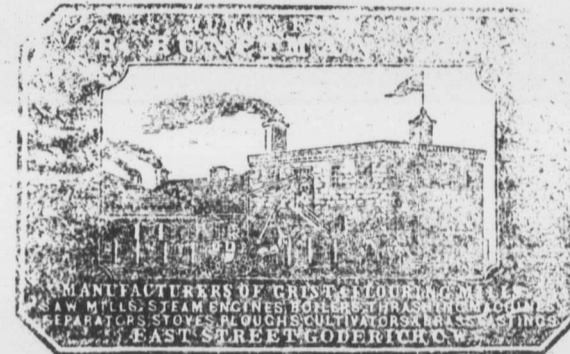

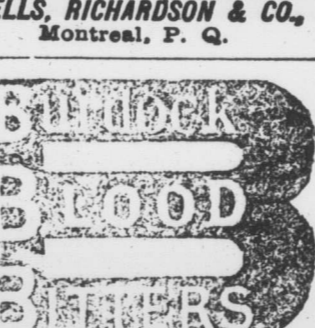
