WILSON'S POLICY IS WAITING ONE

Steady Pressure Upon Huerta is Expected to Bring Desired Results.

RUMORS ARE DENIED

U. S. Has No Intention of Cutting Off Communications Summarily.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 17.—(Can. Press.)—That the United States in its policy toward the provisional government in Mexico is content to await the outcome of the steady pressure being exerted to bring about the downfall of the Huerta regime was apparent today in official circles here.

The mills of the gods grind slowly," was the declaration of one high official of the government in discussing the developments. The president was not at all aroused by reports that Mr. O'Shaughnessy, the American charge d'affaires, was about to quit Mexico City, and it was stated that no orders had been given either to Mr. O'Shaughnessy or John Lind at Vera Cruz, to leave Mexico.

No Vital Change. The president told callers during the day that while there had been some change in the Mexican relations as to persons there had been no essential change in the circumstances to which he had referred the other day as seeming favorable to a solution of the difficulties.

The president, it is said, is confident that the financial basis of the Huerta regime by the United States and the great foreign powers will be a powerful factor in bringing about the end of Huerta.

In discussing the persistent rumors that Charge O'Shaughnessy was about to take his departure, leaving the American embassy's records in the care of one of the ministers representing the foreign powers, Secretary Bryan stated flatly that neither the charge nor Mr. Lind had any conditional instructions, and intimated that both were acting under precise instructions from Washington in every step in the negotiations.

Indications based on the few admissions of the state department officials are that no action is contemplated at present that would precipitate a crisis in the situation. On the other hand it was remarked that no one here can foretell what action Gen. Huerta might take in the City of Mexico that would bring about such a crisis.

Contradictory Views. Secretary Bryan has been informed by Mr. O'Shaughnessy of the resignation of Manuel Garza Aldape as minister of the interior, but he has heard only rumors of the intention of Gen. Blaquet to surrender his portfolio as minister of war. While in some quarters there was a disposition to regard cabinet changes as the forerunner of disintegration of the Huerta regime, in others it was pointed out that it might mark the adoption by Gen. Huerta of a more active and vigorous policy and one more defiant of the United States government.

An early development of his purpose is expected in view of the fact that in the ordinary course of events he must submit his special message to congress not later than Thursday.

ALDAPE LEAVES MEXICO.

VERA CRUZ, Mex., Nov. 17.—(Can. Press.)—Manuel Garza Aldape, who recently resigned his office as minister of the interior in the Mexican cabinet, arrived here this morning from Mexico City and went on board the steamer Panama, accompanied by his wife and children. He was escorted to the quay by the local officials. He is en route to Paris to take up his duties as Mexican minister to France.

FEAR CUTTING OFF OF MEXICO CITY

Railroad Communication With Vera Cruz Reported to Be in Danger.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 17.—(Can. Press.)—The possibility of an interruption of railroad communication between the City of Mexico and Vera Cruz, which is now practically the only outlet for the capital, is giving considerable concern to the officials here and it is said that any attempt to thus completely isolate Americans and other foreigners in the Mexican capital would result in quick action by the United States to prevent it.

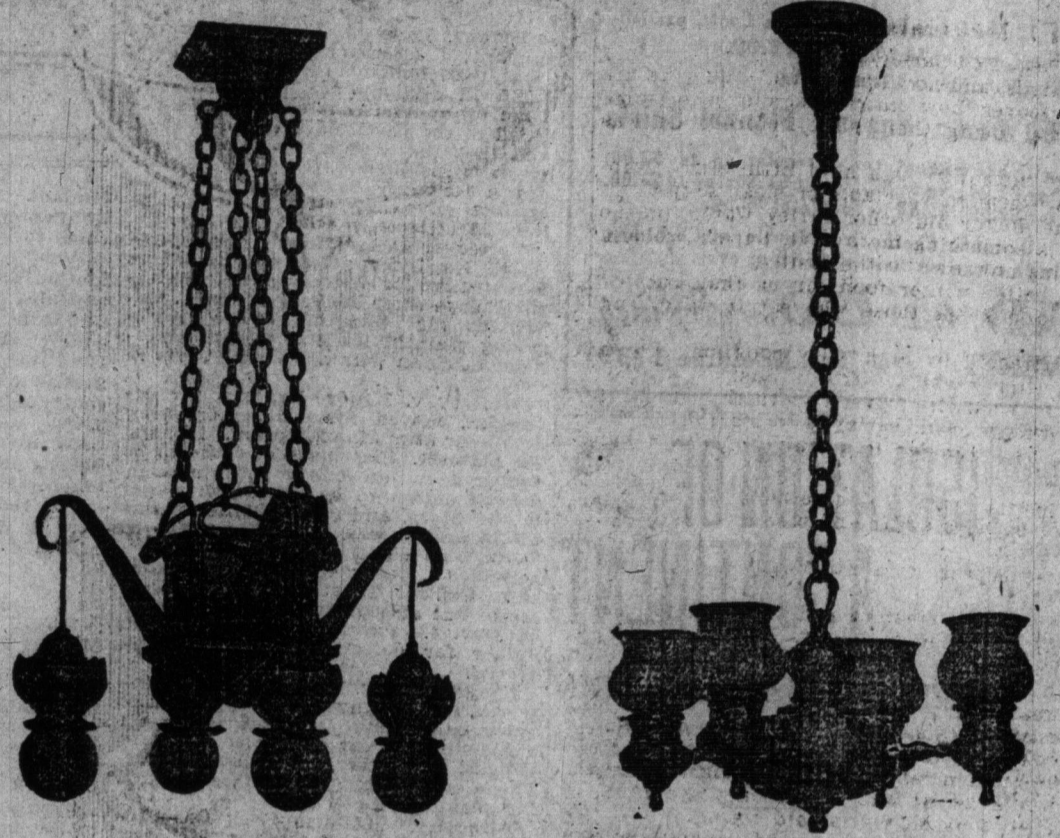
ENGINEER KILLED BY STRIKEBREAKING CREW

PROTEST LODGED AGAINST MORRIS

Many Charges Put Forth by Petitioners Who Ask for Disqualification.

MONTREAL, Nov. 17.—(Can. Press.)—The election of Mr. James Morris as M.P. for the County of Chateauguay was protested this afternoon, when petitions to unseat and disqualify him were deposited in the superior court office in Valleyfield. Bribery by himself and by agents by payment of money, promises of public offices, undue influence, defraying transportation, treating, intimidation and furnishing vehicles illegally, are among the charges against the Conservative M.P. and his agents.

Four petitions covering the charges were deposited, sworn to by the following electors of Chateauguay County: Alex. Mills, brickmaker, of Ormstown; James Robertson, farmer, of North Georgetown; Robert McFarlane, farmer, of Howick Station, and Philmore Mallette, artist, of Chateauguay Village.

The petitions pray, not only that Mr. Morris be unseated, but that he be disqualified also as an elector of Chateauguay County for seven years. Mr. Morris' Liberal opponent was Hon. Sydney Fisher, ex-minister of agriculture.

The four petitions in connection with the election protest, together with other documents, and the statutory \$1,000 to guarantee the costs in the trial, were deposited in the superior court office in the presence of the petitioners, Messrs. Mills, Robertson, McFarlane and Mallette. They were accompanied by W. K. McKeown, one of the Montreal counsel for the petitioners, who will have a charge of the case, and Ludger Cotebeque, the crown prosecutor for the district of Beauharnois. The crown prosecutor appeared as attorney for the case. Besides the petitioners, three other eminent counsel have been retained in the case, R. C. Smith, K.C., J. L. Perron, K.C., and Aime Geoffrin, K.C., of Montreal.

The document in connection with the election protest will be sent on to the respondent at once. In this case the ordinary course has been departed from, and instead of waiting until the last minute to file the protest the petitioners have anticipated the date of expiry, which is Nov. 20. The papers in the proceedings have been in the course of preparation for several weeks past.

WHEN SIR JOHN A. BECAME CONVERTED

Evangelist Crossley Throws Interesting Sidelight on Old Chieftain's Life.

MONTREAL, Nov. 17.—(Canadian Press.)—Some new light on the subject of the conversion of Sir John A. Macdonald was given by the Rev. H. T. Crossley, the evangelist, in the course of his sermon in the Westmount Methodist Church on Sunday night. "The Rev. Mr. Hunter and myself opened a revival meeting in Ottawa," Mr. Crossley said. "Sir John A. Macdonald was present at these meetings three nights a week for seven weeks and a half. All present prayed hard for the conversion of the 'Old Chief,' and their efforts did not go unrewarded; for one evening I received an invitation to dine with Sir John and Lady Macdonald.

"No wine was on the table and Sir John said to me, 'I was never skeptical. I had a good Presbyterian father and mother, and in my younger days attended the Methodist camp meetings. I have been a great sinner, however.' "One night near the close of our meeting he stood up singing beside Lady Macdonald, and shortly afterwards his surrender to Christ. Three years after this he died a good Christian man. One of the first we expect to meet as we pass thru the pearly gates is Sir John; who we regard as our greatest son."

LONDON, Nov. 17.—The stock market opened weak today, influenced by the Mexican situation but recovered generally in the afternoon. Mexican ralls fell from one to four points and recovered about half the points on repurchases, while home ralls were strong on the labor outlook. A small failure in the home ralls was followed by a recovery of 3-16, owing to the monetary stringency. The other sections opened weak with the ralls falling from 1/4 to 1/2 lower, but later in the afternoon the closing was covering. Trading was limited after the session. The closing was covering. Money was scarce and the market discount rates were firmer.
