ONE OF THREE COUNTERFEITERS NO ALDERMAN SEEKING RE-ELECTION IS REJECTED. PREVENT HIS ARREST LICENSE REJECTION DEFEATED

John Horton Surrenders Himself to Authorities at Flint, Michigan, and Confesses That He Was One of Two Who Decided to Kill Her.

Flint, Mich., Jan. 1.—(Special to The World.)—John Horton gave himself up tonight, confessing that he had a hand in the murder of Mrs. Marie Hart at Hamilton, Ont., last October.

Horton was killed because she had threatened to tell the police about himself and two Mexicans, his partners, who were passing counterfeit money.

He does not say that he did the killing, but admits having a hand in it. GAVE HIMSELF UP.

Horton struck town Saturday night. Tonight he went to the county jail and told the officers that he wanted to give himself up.

Then he took from his pocket a circular gotten out by the police at Hamilton telling of the finding of the body of an unknown girl near that city on Oct. 8, and offering a reward for any information that would lead to the arrest of the murderer.

After the officers had read the paper, Horton, without further questioning, told his remarkable story.

CHAMBERLAIN'S MANIFESTO NOT HOSTILE TO BALFOUR

Declare His Policy is Practical, That of Opponents But a Theory.

London, Jan. 1.—Joseph Chamberlain issued his election manifesto today. After vigorously attacking the new government, which he describes as essentially a "Home Rule, Little Englander" government depending for its existence on Irish votes, he devotes himself entirely to an exposition of his fiscal policy, especially to the subject of colonial preference, which he speaks of as the first item in the constructive program of the Unionist party.

In a total vote cast of 28,751 according to returns as compiled last night, Emerson Coatsworth is elected Mayor of S. E. Spence by a majority of 4101. Every one of the six wards contributes to this result. The vote is the largest ever polled in Toronto, excepting only that of last year, when it ran as high as 28,382.

The decisive defeat of Mr. Spence came as a surprise, that he would be beaten appeared probably enough, but that he should be so overwhelmed by his opponent was not to be foreseen. Mr. Spence's own view is that he went down through the powerful organization of the Citizens' Committee.

Mr. Chamberlain declares that he believes the Unionist party to be absolutely agreed regarding these aims, and admits there may be some differences of opinion when the time comes to discuss the methods by which these aims are to be accomplished.
