loss considerable, and Commander Kruus and others have been captured.

Boers Near Johannesburg. The Pietmaritzburg correspondent of The Daily Mail says: Boers are active near Johannesburg and Pretoria, exchanging shots with the British outposts, and it is reported that parties of Boers are hovering around Johannesburg.

MEAGRE NEWS FROM AFRICA.

Skirmishing at Many Points, Boers Retiring After Stubborn Resistance—Nootkatchadach Losses.

London, Dec. 23.—Since Lord Kitchener's despatch of Wednesday last, reporting the crossing of the Orange River into Cape Colony by two bands of Boers, nothing official concerning events in South Africa has reached the public. Last night the news was meagre. Reports were received from Cape Town that the railway had been looted in three places north of De Aar.

A column of 500 of all arms, under command of Major Shute, left Colesberg Dec. 18 by the Philippolis road to investigate a farm at Hamfontein. The Boers had been beaten off by the Jagers before the relieving column arrived. Two wounded Boers were captured. Our losses were not heavy but two killed and twelve wounded.

A Sharp Fight. A Standard despatch, dated Dec. 18, says a sharp encounter took place with a party of Boers near Kalk's Spruit, 10 miles south of the railway. One of the Boer parties numbered 200. Both sides routed after obstinate resistance. One Boer was killed and two wounded. The British force lost two wounded and a quantity of live stock and forage.

The Losses at Nootkatchadach. Many people of all classes gathered about the War Office last evening, anxious for the welfare of friends in the war, and especially for that of those connected with the Nootkatchadach battle. At a late hour a list of the casualties, non-commissioned officers and men was posted, showing that 60 had been killed and 152 wounded.

ANOTHER CANADIAN REGIMENT.

Anglo-Canadians Ask Whether Canada Should Not Have Some Troops in South Africa.

London, Dec. 22.—(Special via Montreal)—Lord Kitchener has evidently made earnest appeals to the British Government to despatch immediately large drafts of mounted infantry to hasten the end of the war; some say he has asked for 40,000 men.

New Zealand is sending another contingent and Anglo-Canadians are wondering whether, as Canada has sent a contingent to South Africa now, the Straits Colonies being the result of private military aid, Canada may not have a second corps of 500 mounted men from the Northwest to be raised and equipped by the Canadian Government.

HEAVY COST OF ARMY MULES.

British Agents Have Begun Buying Horses and Mules Again in Southern States.

Kansas City, Mo., Dec. 22.—Captain Heritage of the British army is purchasing 50,000 cavalry horses and mules for the British army in South Africa. He came here more than a year ago to buy horses and mules, but the unexpected renewal of hostilities has made the purchase of more horses and mules necessary. As fast as the animals are inspected and bought they will be sent to New Orleans and shipped to Cape Town, Durban and New London, on British transports, some of which are now on their way to the United States. One shipment of the animals will be taken to South Africa by Lieut. David Moberly, leaving New Orleans soon after January 1.

Mules Cost \$300 Per Head. Lieut. Moberly said: "By the time the horses and mules are landed in South Africa they cost the British government \$300 a head. This is a large price for an animal which will be fit for service only six weeks. Most of the animals die because of the change in climate. They must cross the equator in going to South Africa, and the hard heat of the tropics kills them rapidly. The average death rate on shipboard is 52 to the 100. A mule which dies after a horse is purchased in Kansas City it is landed in South Africa after January 1.

"So great is the demand for horses at the front that it is impossible to give them the needed rest after crossing before entering into service. Consequently they go to the front in a wretched condition, and, not getting a sufficient amount of food, they soon die."

Over 100,000 Have Been Bought. "Since the beginning of the war England has purchased over 1,000,000 head of horses and mules in the United States. New Orleans to South Africa. Government transports will be kept very busy from now on carrying the horses which England will need in South Africa, and which have been ordered purchased in the United States.

JOINT NOTE IS NOW SIGNED

What the Foreign Powers Demand of the Chinese Envoys—All Irrevocable.

INDEMNITY TAKES TIME TO RAISE.

Walderssee Is Still Fighting With the Celestial Troops as Latest Reports Relate.

Washington, Dec. 22.—The text of the joint note of the powers demanding certain conditions from China was issued to-day. It has been signed by all the foreign ministers at Peking. Reparation for the murder of Baron Von Kettler and Chancellor Su Yuzan is demanded. The Boers must be punished and official examination of towns suspended. The importation of arms is forbidden, indemnities are demanded, the destruction of forts is ordered and foreign legations will hereafter be guarded by their own troops.

Perhaps the most important clause in clause 10, which reads as follows: "An Imperial Decree. The Chinese Government to cause to be published during two years in all the newspapers a perpetual prohibition, under penalty of death, of membership in any anti-foreign society."

(11) Enumerating the punishments that shall have been inflicted on the guilty foreigners with the suspension of official examinations in the cities where foreigners have been murdered or have been subjected to cruel treatment; and (12) Furthermore, an Imperial Decree, ordering that the Government-Generals, Governors and all provincial, vicinal or local officials shall be held responsible for the maintenance of order within their respective jurisdictions; and that, in the event of renewed anti-foreign disturbances or any other fractions of treaty occurring and which shall not have been suppressed and the guilty persons punished, they, the said officials, shall be removed and forever disqualified from holding any office or honors.

DESPATCH FROM WALTERSEE

Tells of a Skirmish Between German Troops and Chinese Regulars Dec. 15.

Berlin, Dec. 22.—The following despatch from Field Marshal Count Von Walderssee, dated Peking, Friday, Dec. 21, has been received here:

"A column despatched from Pao Ting Fu, commanded by Major Hain, engaged a force of Chinese, probably Dec. 15, at Lung Ting Shen, 90 kilometers northeast of Pao Ting Fu. Our losses were not heavy and two non-commissioned officers were killed. The Chinese losses were considerable."

A column was sent Dec. 19 from Tien Tien, commanded by Col. Graber, to Yeh Tien Hsin, 100 kilometers northwest of Tien Tien.

The last obstacle having been removed, the joint note was signed to-day by all the foreign Ministers, including the envoy from the Netherlands, who arrived only recently. The note will be delivered to Li Hung Chang and Prince Ching, the Chinese plenipotentiaries, as soon as the former shall have sufficiently recovered from his indisposition.

The Chinese close to Li Hung Chang still prefer to believe, despite the signing of the note, which they did not believe, that the principal negotiations must be carried on in Europe or America, the note, for, as they say, some power or powers might not be satisfied with the indemnity had been paid in full, which would mean the occasion of further for the Chinese, as it cannot be expected that the Chinese will make what would be a matter of fact it will take several years.

Peking, Dec. 22.—Li Hung Chang, answering an enquiry from the foreign envoys regarding his health, said he believed he would be able to attend the meeting to-morrow, and, in order to accept, was Prince Ching, the preliminary joint note. The note will be presented by the Spanish ambassador, with a few words, as possible to a hope of a prompt reply to the draft, which has been completely prepared, with every desire to soothe the anxiety and not to be held toward the nation, and of a further hope that the Chinese plenipotentiaries will accept of the conditions of the joint note without delay.

We Change to Be Opened. Paris, Dec. 22.—The semi-official press announces, in confirmation of the reports, that the Viceroy of the Province of Huh Pei and Hsü Nan declares that Wang Chang will be made an open port.

Without "Losing Her Face." London, Dec. 22.—Morning news writing that official Chinese declare that China will accept all the conditions of the joint note without "losing her face."

A FIRE IN MONTREAL.

H.A. Wilder's Furnishing Establishment Damaged to Extent of \$5000.

Montreal, Dec. 23.—H. A. Wilder's furnishing establishment on St. Catherine street was rather badly damaged by fire to-night. The loss is estimated at about \$5000.

Evidently Some Mistake. Quebec, Dec. 23.—In regard to the statement that the men of the 7th Battery refused the request of Lord Roberts to remain a little longer in South Africa, there is evidently some mistake. A letter has been received here to the effect that Mr. A. T. O'Leary, lieutenant in command of the 7th section of the Battery, together with a large proportion of non-commissioned officers and men, had volunteered to stay in South Africa until the war was definitely over.
