8. New Westminster Bifles Prize.

Open to members of the Active Militia. Ranges, 300 and 500 yards. Seven shots at each range. Snider Rifle, Government issue. Entrance, 50 cents.

1st Prize, a Silver Card Receiver, presented by the officers of the New Westminster Rifles.

2nd Prize, a Vase, presented by the non-commissioned officers of the New Westminster Rifles.

9. Association Prizes.

Open to members of the Association. Range, 400 yards. Seven rounds. Any Rifle. Entrance, 50 cents.

Grand Aggregate Prizes.

For the highest aggregate score in all competitions, except Nos. 7 and 10, Gold Badge of the British Columbia Rifle Association, Silver Medal of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, and \$15.00.

For second highest, Silver Badge of the British Columbia Riffe Association, and \$10.00.

To the competitor making the fewest misses in all competitions, except Nos. 7 and 10, a Silver Cup presented by Lieut. Jackson, N. W. Rifles.

To the competitor making the fewest outers in competitions restricted to the Active Militia, a silver Card Receiver, presented by Asst.-Surgeon : Trew, N. W. Riffes.

Bull's-Cyc Prizes.

For the greatest number of Bull's-Eyes obtained by any competitor in all competitions except Nos. 7 and 10, \$10.00.

For next highest, \$5.00.

Pool.

There will be a Pool-Target each day from 10 A.M. to G P.M. Range, 200 yards. Any Rifle. Any Position. Pool Tickets, ten cents each, may be obtained from the officer in charge.

Three-fourths of the daily proceeds of the Pool will be divided each day among the holders of Bull's-Eye tickets.

Any person may become a member of the Association on payment of \$1.00 to the Secretary.

REGULATIONS.

This meeting of the Association will be conducted under the direction of the Range Committe, appointed by the Council, and in the conduct of the meeting the following Regulations are to be observed together with such directions as may be given by the Range Committee from time to time.

1. The Bange Committee shall decide all disputes, and their decision shall be final. Any competitor disputing or refusing to comply with their decision shall be debarred from further competition at this meeting and shall forfeit any entrance fees he may have paid.

2. The Range Committee shall, each day, appoint one of their number whose duty it will be to take charge of the shooting for the day and to test the Rifles of all Prize-winners.

3: In competitions restricted to the Active Militia, competitors must appear in the full or undress uniform of their corps.

4. Any objection on the score of a competitor's dress must be raised BEFORE he takes up his position to shoot.

5. Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection when required.

6. No fixed or artificial rests, nor straps or any other contrivance attached to the wrist will be allowed. The forearm and hand must be clear of all support.

7. No entries shall be accepted for any competition after the firing of such competition has commenced.

8. Ties shall be decided as follows:

(A) If at more than one distance, by the range totals in inverse order.

(B) By the fewest misses.

(c) By the fewest outers.

(D:\ By the fewest mag-pies.

(E) By the fewest inners.

(F) By the value of each shot in inverse order.

(G) /Ties for the aggregate, by score at the last match.

9. Any objection to the scoring of a shot must be made before the next shot, is fired; as the marker's signal is in all cases final the objection only extends to the registration of the score by the Register-keeper.

10. Efficiency to be understood as having been a bona fide member of of the corps to which the competitor belongs previous to the 1st July, 1881, and as having performed the number of drills authorized by General Order in that behalf for 1880.81 or 1881.82.

[~] 11. A cap-cover with or without a cap under it will be permitted in matches restricted to the active militia.

In cases not provided for in these Regulations those of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association for 1881 shall govern.

SIGHT.ING SHOTS.

A sighting shot will be allowed at each range, except in Team Matches, on payment of ten cents. One additional sighting shot may be had on payment of 20 cents.

RIFLES.

"SNDER RIFLE"—either of Government issue or of Government pattern: minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs; sights--government pattern, may be temporarily blackened but not whitened or otherwise colored.

"ANY RIFLE"—minimum pull of trigger, 3 lbs; sights—any description except telescopic and magnifying.

TARGETS.

The description of Targets and marking adopted by the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association (1881) will be used. Misses will not be signalled.

AMMUNITION.

In competitions restricted to "Snider Rifles" none but Government ammunition shall be used, which may be obtained on the range; price, 50 cents per 25 rounds.

POSITION.

The shooting at all ranges may be in any position.
