It was this conduct which gave rise to "MAGNA CHARTA," by the aid of which English History took the direction of securing constitutional liberty by Administrative Law. It asserted the rights and powers of Englishmen to be greater than the king. It systematized the scattered frag-ments of liberty, and it formed the first and greatest Publick Act of Anglo-Saxons, Normans and Englishmen, who by it established their identity and their unity for all time to come.
