King Amadeus Determined to Abdicate.

The Cabinet to Tender Their Resignations. Gaffney's Pretended Insanity a Ruse.

He Will be Hanged on Friday.

A Sea of Fire. Horrors of Drowning Passen-

gers.

Mardid, Feb. 10 — Midnight.— At eight this evening King Amadeus announced to Senor Zorilla, that he was determined to adhere to his resolution to abdicate. Since Saturday last, when his Majesty declared his intention of quitting the throne, the Ministers have strenuously endeavoured to dissnade him from doing so, but their efforts have proved futile.

The announcement that the abdication, is certain creates a profound sensation, but tranquility prevails.

A royal message announcing the determination of the King will soon be submitted to the Cortes. After its presentation the Cabinet will tender their resignations.

London, Feb. 12. — No further news has been received from Madrid.

The announcement of the abdication produces profound sensation in Berlin.

The German papers hint that it was caused by French intrigues.

The ten millions dollars Erie loan convertible bonds were subscribed yesterday. The lists will remain open two days longer. The indication is that there is great confidence in the Watson, administration.

Buffalo, Feb. 12. — The jury of inquisition appointed to decide as to the insanity of Gaffney, the murderer, have agreed that he is perfectly sane. He will accordingly be executed here on Friday next. Titusville, Pa., Feb. 12. — Further developements of the disaster on the Alleghany Railway show further loss of life. Several tanks of oil were precipitated down an embankment, the oil suddenly igniting and spreading rapidly in every direction, carrying flames some distance out on the 'water of the river, cutting off every way of escape for drowning passengers, except through a lake of fire. In some instances they plunged undorneath the flaming waves, and swam to points of safety. The coach was of iron, and turned over once and a half, plunging its occupants into the fire, and holding them there as if by a wall.

Toronto Correspondence.

Our spell of severe weather has been bllowed by a week of really fine, mild,

enjoyable weather, with its almost invariables concomitant, the "epizootic." People really began to anticipate an early spring, but we suspect, from the sharp turn assumed by Jack Frost this evening, their anticipations are decidedly premature. Still it is marvelous how greatly the snow has disappeared during the last few days, and wheels are about as numerous on the streets as runners. Toronto is still well supplied with entertainments suitable to every taste. Professor Martin has been nightly, during the past week, treating crowded houses to specimens of his skill in legerdemain, &c.; whilst Mrs. Martin has been equally electrical in her wonderful exhibitions of clairvoyance. The Professor has been liberal in the way of presents to his audience, and on one occasion, after the performance, a couple of men might be seen triumphantly bearing on their shoulders a bureau as the product of their presence at and investment of 25c in the Wizard's entertainment; another man was lucky enough to obtain \$10, whilst sundry jokes were cracked at the expense of those who were fortunate enough to draw from the "lucky bag" such useful articles as toy cradles, &c.

Possessing more courage than prudence, he seems to be very fond of going for "Big Thunder," who has promised to look up "Charley's' antecedents, with a view to a well-deserved drubbing. I am told not a tithe of the Billingsgate that was uttered on the occasion referred to was reported. When Mr. Bethune's bill, having reference to labitual drunkards, was being debated, "old Caivin," as he styles himself, was on hand to deliver himself in its favor, declaring at the same time he had been a tectotaller for 40 years, and during that time not one drop of drink had gone down his neck. Abdication of the Spanish

Abdication of the Spanish Throne.

The Carlist insurrectionary movement in Spain has increased so rapidly, and the extent of their operations become so alarming, as to occasion the gravest apprehension. The weather has been very stormy recently, and snow storms so prevalent that the royal troops have been powerless to suppress the rebels.

In addition to this a new trouble has arisen, and the king has abdicated the throne. It would appear that his Majesty had a disagreement with his Ministry, which caused an estrangement and considerable illifeding. In November last the General of the Artillery, Don Hidalgo, was promoted to the Captain Generalship of the Basque Provinces, whereupon the majority of the officers of that branch of the service resigned their commission, protesting against the promotion as irregular and unjustifiable, and refusing to serve under the newly-appointed Captain-General, because he participated in the massacre at Saugil Barracks in 1866. Finding his new position so uncomfortable, Don flidalgo resigned, and the officers renewed their resignations and entered a protest. The Ministry disregarded them, and, appealing to the Cortes, obtained a unanimous vote of confidence. King Amadeus, who disapproved of the appointment of the objectionable character in the first instance, feels the insult, and has abdicated the throne. The view is considered gloomy, and a bitter civil war, it is thought, is inevitable. is considered gloomy, and a bitter vivil war, it is thought, is inevitable. The streets of Madrid are filled with crowds of excited people. The Cortes have already adopted a Republican form of Government, by a vote of 259 against 32. Further rews from Spain will be looked for with interest.
