Kingston papers on Saturday looked at it this way: "News: The Queen's College boys are in fairly good condition, and will endeavor to give a good account of themselves. As was remarked by one of the boys as the train was pulling out, even if they don't win in Toronto they will try to keep the score down, and then 'look out for fun' next Saturday. Sullivan said that this was the hardest race he ever rowed. 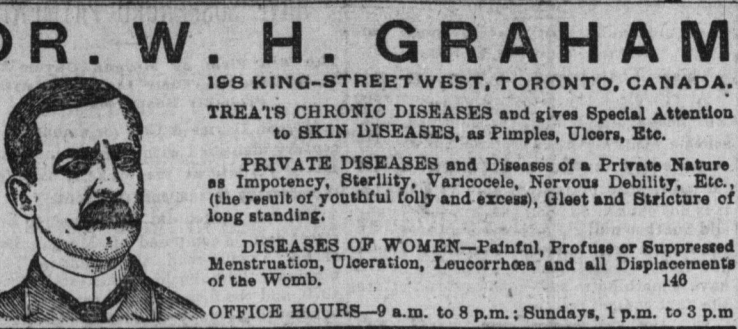
