

WELLAND, Aug. 17th, 1886.

By direction of the Warden, the County Council of the County of Welland met in Special Session, at Council Chamber, at 9 o'clock a. m.

The Warden remarked, in opening the session, that the present session was called at the instance of the special committee appointed to settle the matter of the Niagara Falls separation, as no definite arrangements could be made with the said town; that section 447, of chapter 174 would seem to direct that the award to be annulled

must be by application of either party interested to the Lieutenant-Governor; and after some further remarks, presented a telegram from the Town of Niagara Falls, stating that the town had appointed Judge Baxter as arbitrator on behalf of the town.

That the clerk of this council be instructed to prepare a memorial to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, asking that the amount of compensation fixed by the award made the Eleventh day of August, 1881, between this county and the Town of Clifton, now Niagara Falls, be reconsidered, and that the then existing arrangements shall cease from and after the 1st day of July, 1886, and that a copy of the award so made be sent with the memorial. Carried.

That whereas the municipal council of the Town of Niagara Falls failed to appoint an arbitrator within the time prescribed by statute after having received notice that an arbitrator had been appointed by the municipality of the County of Welland, on their behalf in the matter of settlement of compensation to be paid by the Town of Niagara Falls for the five years beginning July 1st, 1886, to the County of Welland;

And whereas this council has been informed that on or about the 16th day of August, 1886, the municipal council of the said Town of Niagara Falls did appoint George Baxter, Esq., Judge of the County of Welland, to act as arbitrator on their behalf in the said matter:

Be it resolved that the clerk be instructed to prepare a memorial to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, praying him to confirm said appointment; and in case the said George Baxter does not accept the appointment as arbitrator, that he will be pleased to appoint an arbitrator, as provided by the statute in that behalf. Carried.

Mr. Hobson gives notice that he will on to-morrow ask leave to Notices, introduce a bill to appoint a Game Inspector for the County of Welland.

Your Jail committee beg leave to submit this their report:

Your committee advertised for tenders for painting Court House roof and fence, and the fence around the Registry Office, and received three tenders, viz:

H. Schumacher\$175	00
Chas. McCarter 124	00
Peter McMurray 140	00

Your committee accepted the tender of Mr. Schumacher for the sum of \$175. This being the highest tender, it may seem strange to your honorable body that your committee awarded the tender in such a manner; but knowing that the painting before was done in an unworkmanlike manner, your committee thought best to award the contract to a responsible and efficient workman, choosing rather to pay a higher price for the work than to run any chance of a poor job.

Your committee also advertised for tenders for 70 tons of coal,

(large grate), and 10 tons No. 4 coal, and received two tenders, viz:

James Blackwell, at \$5.50 per ton for large grate, and \$5.95 for No. 4 coal.

F. M. Hagar, at \$5.55 per ton for large grate, and \$5.95 for No 4 coal.

Your committee accepted the tender of James Blackwell, at above rates. The coal has been delivered, and the chairman has issued his order for payment.

## MEMORIALS.

Re NIAGARA FALLS TOWN AND COUNTY WELLAND AWARD.

To the Honorable John Beverley Robinson, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Ontario:

The memorial of the council of the County of Welland, Humbly Sheweth:

Whereas the Town of Niagara Falls did withdraw from the County of Welland on 1st July, 1881, for the term of five years;

And whereas on the 1st day of July, 1886, the said term of five years expired;

And whereas the County of Welland did, on the Fifth day of June, 1886, appoint E. J. Senkler, Judge of the County of Lincoln, an arbitrator to act in conjunction with an arbitrator to be appointed by the said town, in readjusting the compensation to be paid by said town for ensuing five years; that the said town was so notified of the appointment through their clerk;

And whereas no appointment was made by the said town previous to the 16th day of August inst., contrary to the statute governing;
