




## INTRODUCTION

Here are described its modest beginning, the development of its expansive policy, and its phenomenal growth. The history is supplemented by a chronology of events, a summary of the bank's position at the end of each year, and an Honour Roll of all the members of the staff who enlisted for active service in the Great War. The volume is presented as a record of past achievement and a source of inspiration for the future.

A Summary of its History  
from the year 1869 to the present date



HE Golden Jubilee, which The Royal Bank of Canada now celebrates, is but a milestone in the onward march of an institution which has developed with the Dominion, and stretched far beyond its bounds.

The bank had its origin in stirring times. Civil War in the United States was at its height. The North offered an eager market for all kinds of produce, while blockade-runners carrying on trade with the Southern Confederacy swarmed in the port of Halifax. Profits were phenomenal and the city was in its heyday of prosperity. The air was full of constructive schemes, and in order to increase trading facilities Messrs. T. C. Kinnear and John Duffus retired from the directorate of the Union Bank of Halifax to join a number of other influential citizens in a financial co-partnership under the name of the Merchants Bank. The objects and purposes of the new enterprise, with the names of its founders, were set forth in the following advertisement in the Halifax Recorder:

*"Halifax, 26th April, 1864*

"The subscribers having entered into co-partnership, under the name and firm of the Merchants Bank, beg respectfully to announce that on and after Monday next, the 2nd of May, they will be prepared at their banking house in Bedford Row to discount promissory notes and accep-

tances, make advances on approved securities, purchase and sell bills of exchange, receive money on deposit, and transact all other business matters connected with a *business* establishment.

The firm met with immediate success, and during the first five years of its operation earnings averaged nine per cent. per annum. At this time a change in the form of organization became obligatory. Confederation of the provinces, under the British North America Act of 1867, gave to the new Parliament of Canada exclusive jurisdiction in all matters pertaining to banks and banking, and it was foreseen that the Dominion Bank Act then under discussion would no longer permit the enjoyment of full banking privileges by co-partnership associations. It therefore became necessary to apply for a Federal charter, and an Act incorporating the Merchants Bank of Halifax received Royal assent on June 22nd, 1869. The authorized capital was \$1,000,000, of which at first, only \$500,000 was offered for subscription.

Such was the confidence inspired by the administration of the old co-partnership that more than one hundred prominent Nova Scotians availed themselves of the opportunity to become associated with the re-organization. On October 18th, 1869, the first general meeting of shareholders was held, and Messrs. William Cunard, J. B. Duffus, T. C. Kinnear, Thomas E. Kenny, John

Taylor, M. Dwyer and Edward Smith were elected directors. A statement of the business of the late proprietary institution up to October 1st was read, which showed a paid-up capital of \$300,000, a Reserve Fund of \$20,000, Deposits of \$284,656, Current Loans of \$266,970, and Total Assets of \$729,163. At the first meeting of directors on the following day Thomas C. Kinneear was unanimously chosen President.

Times had changed since 1864. With the surrender of the South, war-time prosperity had ended; the failure of the fisheries in '67 and '68 had caused great distress in the coastal villages of Nova Scotia; and the expiry of the Reciprocity Treaty with the United States had deprived Halifax of a paying trade in many commodities. It was a time for caution, and one of the by-laws of the bank, afterwards repealed, provided that no discounts whatever should be granted unless approved by the President and at least one Director. Business increased so rapidly that President Kinneear soon found himself unable to devote the necessary time to the duties of his office, and Thomas E. Kenny, son of one of the original founders, who had already given proof of outstanding ability, was elected his successor.

The former co-partnership had been local in its operations, but the new President had a vision of an expanding bank, and branches were opened at Pictou in 1870, at Antigonish, Bridgewater, Lunenburg, Truro and Weymouth in 1871, and at Sydney in 1872. So prudent was the administration of Mr. Kenny and his co-directors that at the fourth annual meeting he was able to make the announcement, unique in banking annals, that during the year 1872, with current loans amounting to \$1,278,850, the bank had not lost one dollar by bad debts. A dividend of eight per cent. was declared and \$40,000 added to the Reserve.

The year 1873 was an anxious one in Nova Scotia. The suspension in the month of April of the Bank of Acadia, followed by the closing of the doors of the Bank of Liverpool, caused the collapse of the business community in the section of the province in which they had operated. While the Merchants Bank of Halifax suffered some loss through customers involved in these failures, the President in his next annual report was able to announce the usual dividend and a further addition of \$40,000 to the Reserve. This fund was augmented by \$50,000 and \$30,000 respectively in 1874 and 1875 despite the universal trade depression which had followed the great financial panic in the United States.


During the first six years of its existence, three of which had tested the strength of older institutions, the bank had increased its paid-up capital from \$300,000 to \$900,000; its Reserve Fund from \$20,000 to \$180,000; and its Assets from \$714,948 to \$2,594,917. It had also extended its business to the neighbouring province of Prince Edward Island by the establishment of branches at Charlottetown in 1873 and at Summerside in 1874.

Hard times continued, not only in Canada but throughout the world, accentuated in Nova Scotia by a decline in wooden shipbuilding, which had long been the mainstay and chief industry of the province. Restricted circulation and the necessary contraction of loans and discounts lessened the profits of all banks; many reduced their capital and three failed. The utmost the Merchants Bank of Halifax could hope to do until the return of more prosperous conditions, was to retain the ground already gained, and to strengthen its organization.

Up to this time branches had been in charge of local men, often interested in other pursuits and not seldom politicians,

two becoming members of the Legislature. While they had rendered able service to the bank, it was felt that branch management in future should be entrusted to trained officials, and a policy was adopted that henceforth, as opportunity offered and vacancies occurred, only men who could give undivided attention to banking should be appointed local agents.

As the premises at Halifax had long been inadequate for the growing needs of the bank, it was resolved in 1876 to erect a structure suited to its requirements. One of the best sites in the city was secured and the building was ready for occupancy in May 1879. On March 3rd, 1880, the President stated "Our institution, in common with others, has carried its full share of the burden imposed by the dull times. It is now in a position to take advantage of any improvement in business when it arises." On this occasion Mr. Kenny also claimed with some pride that notwithstanding the long-continued commercial stagnation, the bank had always made a fair profit and had paid \$500,000 in dividends to the shareholders since its organization. At this meeting Mr. Michael Dwyer was elected to succeed Senator Northup, who had passed away in the previous April. Senator Northup had been the first Vice-President, and his excellent judgment combined with his intimate knowledge of the affairs of the province had contributed in no small degree to the steady progress of the bank.

By 1882 conditions in Nova Scotia had begun to improve, and the bank entered upon a period of renewed branch extension, chiefly in New Brunswick. But a more ambitious scheme was maturing in the minds of the directorate. The trade of Halifax was largely sea-borne and its merchants had long carried on a profitable exchange of commodities with its natural markets, the Bermudas, the Bahamas and the West Indies. In the hope of creating

a new field of business enterprise for the bank a step was taken which is thus recorded in the minutes:

*"30th March, 1882*

"Mr. Duncan, the Accountant, having been confined in his house through a severe attack of rheumatism, the President being of opinion that his (Mr. D's) health was not fully re-established, suggested a visit to Bermuda, to which the Board assented. Mr. Duncan was accordingly advised by his physicians to avail himself of this opportunity, as calculated to do him much good, and he was also authorized by the Board in the event of his finding a suitable opening to establish an agency of the bank at Hamilton."

Mr. Duncan upon his return reported that after considerable difficulty, and with misgivings as to its success, he had completed arrangements for an agency in Hamilton. This branch, after languishing for some years, was closed, as well as one established later at St. Pierre Miquelon. These seeming failures, however, were but stepping stones to future success, for the experience gained proved invaluable when the bank again entered the foreign field.

Towards the close of 1882 Mr. Duncan was appointed Cashier, and on January 18th following, Edson L. Pease, who was the instrument of a great expansive movement in a later decade, became the Accountant at the Halifax office—after a period of eight years' service with the Canadian Bank of Commerce. In this year (1883) the paid-up capital stock was increased to \$1,000,000 and \$20,000 was added to the Reserve. Normal trade conditions had not yet been restored and many Maritime Province banks were finding it difficult to recover from the effect of past depression. On June 14th the Directors had declined to purchase the Merchants Bank of Prince Edward Island, which offered to sell out its interests. A little later a similar proposition was received from the Mari-

time Bank of Canada, which had its headquarters at St. John, New Brunswick. This institution had suffered severe losses and after an investigation of its affairs, conducted by Mr. Pease, the Board of the Merchants Bank decided not to recommend amalgamation to its shareholders. Four years later the Maritime Bank suspended payment, and only 10 $\frac{1}{2}$  cents on the dollar was received by its depositors.

The Merchants Bank of Halifax was not destined to pass through these trying times unscathed and in 1885 it suffered one of those heavy losses which occasionally all banks have to face. Two of Nova Scotia's greatest industries, largely indebted to the bank, passed into the hands of receivers. The profits of the year were wiped out and the Rest drawn upon for \$80,000. The trouble was taken at the roots and within three years the loss had been more than made good and the Reserve Fund restored to its former strength. Moreover, it was now realized that if enterprises of national importance were to be financed, the bank must become national in its scope—with capital and reserves so large that its position could not be shaken by local losses.

It was therefore resolved in 1887 to extend operations to the City of Montreal and to appoint Edson L. Pease manager of the new branch. To build up a business in a centre which was the headquarters of so many powerful banking organizations was no light undertaking, but progress was steady. Soon the first premises became inadequate; more desirable quarters were secured, and with the opening of agencies in the city—east and west—the Merchants Bank of Halifax became firmly established in the metropolis of the Dominion.

This had been accomplished during a period when the development of Canada was retarded by world events. The failure of

Baring Bros. in 1890, through default of the Argentine Government in payment of its obligations, created a suspicion in England as to the soundness of all foreign investments and temporarily checked the flow of capital to the Dominion; while the passage of the McKinley Tariff Bill lessened exports to the United States. Three years later occurred the worst panic in the history of the Republic, following President Cleveland's Venezuelan Message, and this crisis had its reflex in Canada, causing great depreciation in the market price of securities.

Through all this financial disquietude, and notwithstanding the low rates obtainable for call money—sometimes one-fourth of one per cent. in England and one per cent. in New York—the Merchants Bank of Halifax continued to strengthen its position. It added year by year to its Reserves and in 1895, to meet the requirements of its growing business, increased the paid-up capital stock to \$1,500,000.

At this time (1895) Newfoundland suffered its second great disaster. The fire which had devastated its capital city in 1892 was now followed by failure of all its banks, and a branch was opened in St. John's to assist in the restoration of banking accommodation in the stricken Colony.

In 1898 Mr. Duncan ceased his exclusive management of the institution, although he remained for one year longer in charge of the head office in Halifax and of the branches in the Maritime Provinces and Newfoundland. During the fifteen years of his administration deposits had quadrupled; the reserve fund had been increased by nearly \$1,000,000 and the total assets by more than \$7,000,000.

With the commencement of an era of business prosperity throughout the Dominion in 1897, renewed expansion, under the

direction of Mr. Pease, was determined upon. Branches were opened in the British Columbian mining towns of Nelson and Rossland and at the port of Vancouver, and in the following year in Grand Forks, Nanaimo and Victoria. No sooner had this leap been made to the Pacific coast than advantage was taken of an opportunity which had arisen in another direction.

The close of the Spanish-American war found the island of Cuba—a land of latent possibilities with inadequate banking facilities—about to enjoy a stable government after a long period of civil disturbances. The time seemed favorable for the introduction of modern banking methods, and Mr. Pease visited Havana in November, 1898, to enquire into the advisability of opening a branch in that city. So greatly was he impressed with the future prospects of the island that he recommended the Board of Directors to enter the new field without delay. The Peace of Paris, by which Cuba was granted independence, was signed on December 10th, 1898, and a month later, before ratification of the treaty, a branch of the bank was established under the management of W. F. Brock and of the former acting United States Consul and Consul-General for Cuba, J. A. Springer. After a year's service in Cuba Mr. Brock returned to Canada and F. J. Sherman and O. A. Hornsby, the latter now President of the Trust Company of Cuba, were appointed to act with Mr. Springer as Joint Managers. The bank soon gained the confidence of the public and the success of the Havana branch was the forerunner of a movement which already has encircled the Caribbean and stretched far down the eastern coast of South America.

As much of the Cuban trade had been diverted from Spain to the United States and exchange transactions with the Republic soon formed an important part of the business of the bank, this

entry into the West Indies hastened a step which home needs had long rendered desirable, and an agency was established in the City of New York in May 1899. Later in the year a branch was also opened in Ottawa.

More money was required for all this expansion, and \$500,000 of new stock was issued at 100 per cent. premium, and almost entirely paid up by the close of 1899. At the annual meeting of February 14th, 1900, a further issue of \$1,000,000 was authorized.

At the same meeting another proposal of far-reaching importance was submitted to the shareholders. The bank had become an international institution and it was felt that a more comprehensive title should be adopted to accord with its position. A change of name to The Royal Bank of Canada was therefore recommended and approved. Parliamentary sanction was applied for and obtained and the new name came into operation on January 2nd, 1901.

In the following year, with the unanimous consent of the shareholders, a sale of 5000 shares of the capital stock of the bank at \$250 per share was made to a number of prominent Americans among whom were the Blairs of New York, G. F. Baker, President of the First National Bank, New York, J. J. Mitchell, President of the Illinois Trust & Savings Bank, Chicago, Ogden Armour, Norman B. Ream, P. A. Valentine and Marshall Field, of Chicago. The purchase was made after a thorough examination of the affairs of the bank, and the connection thus established proved most beneficial to its interests.

The bank's growing business in Cuba was further extended by the purchase in 1903 of the assets of the Banco de Oriente in Santiago, and in 1904 of the Banco del Comercio, Havana, and its sphere of influence was widened when on September 14th of

the same year it was appointed Agent of the Government for the distribution throughout the Island of \$31,000,000 awarded to the Army of Liberation, which constituted fifty per cent. of the amount of the soldiers' claims. So satisfactorily was this commission executed that in the following year the contract was extended to the distribution of the remainder of the award, \$30,-000,000. As faith in its stability and conservative management became general, much of the wealth which had been hoarded during the years of political unrest was entrusted to the bank. Deposits steadily increased and branches were opened in Camaguey in 1904 and at Matanzas and Cardenas in 1905.

Meanwhile, with the commencement of a new century, the field at home had swiftly widened. There was great industrial activity and agricultural prosperity, and new settlements were springing up throughout the Canadian North-West. The bank prepared for another forward movement and at the annual meeting of February 14th, 1906, the shareholders approved the proposal of the Board to change the head office of the bank from Halifax to Montreal, the natural centre for expansion. Parliamentary sanction was obtained and on March 2nd, 1907, the head office was transferred. Additional directors were elected in harmony with the projected development and Thomas Ritchie, of Halifax, after serving many years as Vice-President, retired in favor of Herbert S. Holt, of Montreal. New stock of \$900,000 was issued at \$110 per cent. premium and \$900,000 was added to the Reserve. During 1906 and the three succeeding years the bank more than doubled its branches; fifty were opened in Ontario and the North-West and five in Cuba, while the business in the West Indies was further extended to San Juan in Porto Rico, and Nassau in the Bahamas.

On October 26th, 1908, Mr. Thomas E. Kenny died at Hali-

fax, and the following tribute to his memory appeared in the Annual Report of that year: "During the whole of his Presidency of nearly forty years, Mr. Kenny devoted his rare and conspicuous talents to the furtherance of the welfare of this bank. By his death the bank has lost an able financier and a wise counsellor, and every member of its staff a warm friend."

During his tenure of office the bank had grown from local to international importance, with a paid-up capital of \$3,900,000, Reserve Fund of \$4,600,000, total assets of \$50,470,000, and 107 branches.

At a special meeting of Directors on November 16th, 1908, Herbert S. Holt was elected President, and Edson L. Pease, already a Director, became Vice-President and also retained the general management of the bank.

The accession of the new president marked the inauguration of a still broader policy, and the bank now effected a series of four great mergers. By the purchase of the assets of the Union Bank of Halifax in 1910 the whole territory of the Maritime Provinces was covered and a branch in Port of Spain, Trinidad, added to the West Indian service. This was followed in 1912 by the absorption of the Traders Bank of Canada, which had one of the best connections in Ontario, a province in which the Royal Bank hitherto had not been largely represented. Four years later the Quebec Bank was taken over. This historic institution had weathered the financial storms of a century and its branches materially strengthened the Royal Bank in the Province of Quebec. In 1918 the organization was balanced throughout the Dominion by the acquisition of the Northern Crown Bank with a number of well-located branches in Western Canada. There were now no cities and but few towns in Canada in which the bank was not re-

presented. These mergers resulted also in the addition to the Board of men possessing an intimate knowledge of the needs and resources of the new territory, and E. F. B. Johnston, K.C., of Toronto, was elected 2nd Vice-President.

While these amalgamations were taking place the bank had acquired by purchase two important connections in foreign fields. It became established in the principal trading centre and port of Central America by taking over in 1912 the Bank of British Honduras at Belize, and a long desired entry was made into the only British possession on the southern continent by the acquisition in 1914 of the Bank of British Guiana. This step was taken not only on account of the growing trade with the Dominion but because of the undeveloped possibilities of the Colony.

The wave of prosperity in Canada had reached its crest in the year 1912. Too much of the money which had flowed into the country had been used in land speculation, unsound company promotion, and municipal extravagance, instead of in productive enterprise. The inevitable reaction from this reckless spending, which the banks had done all in their power to check, was followed by widespread business depression, increased by the sudden outbreak of war. The Minister of Finance, Sir Thomas White, promptly introduced emergency measures which controlled the situation. A general moratorium was averted and amidst almost universal financial upheaval Canada experienced no grave disturbance. The Directors, however, deemed it prudent to prepare for any contingency which might arise and in point of liquid assets the statement presented for the year 1914 was the strongest thus far submitted.

Under the exigencies of war Canada now sprang to the pinnacle of endeavor, and the resources of her financial institutions

were taxed to the uttermost. The demand for foodstuffs about to arise in Europe was foreseen and the Royal, in common with other banks, encouraged the farmer to increase production. Acting under special legislation, advances were made for the first time on seed grain and to breeders of cattle. The bank also shared in proportion to its paid-up capital, in loans aggregating \$345,000,000, to the Imperial and Dominion Governments for the purchase in Canada of munitions and other war materials and grain.

A marvellous industrial and agricultural expansion and the sale of commodities at record prices enabled the Dominion to make an astounding financial recovery and she was transformed from a debtor to a creditor nation. Advantage was taken of this great improvement in the monetary situation to float a series of internal loans, from the proceeds of which she not only provided for her own war needs but extended credit to the Allies. The bank supported these loans in every way and through its branches assisted in receiving and recording subscriptions, and in delivery of the bonds.

The tropical region of the West Indies and Central and South America found under war conditions an unlooked for and highly profitable opening for increased trade. With Germany blockaded, the field became the nearest available source of supply for sugar, and on the production of this staple all energies were concentrated. Other products sold at high prices and wealth accumulated. Keeping pace with this development, and the growing business with Canada under the Reciprocity Treaty of 1913, the Royal Bank rapidly extended its operations. Cuba was entirely covered with branches and a chain formed through the West Indies. Costa Rica was entered at San José (1915) and South America still further penetrated by the opening of branches in 1916 in Venezuela, with the approval and support of the British Government.



Distinction had been reflected upon the bank in January, 1915, when the Order of Knighthood was conferred upon its President, Herbert S. Holt.

Early in the following year, at the annual general meeting, a new office was created and Edson L. Pease became Managing-Director, C. E. Neill succeeding him as General Manager.

The war period had been for the bank one of enormous growth. Its assets increased by more than \$54,000,000 in 1916, by \$82,000,000 in 1917, and by \$92,000,000 in 1918. These results were attributed by Mr. Neill to four causes—"prosperous conditions in Canada and the West Indies, the advantageous location of branches, co-operation on the part of Directors, and a loyal and efficient staff."

Meanwhile the honor of the bank had been worthily upheld overseas. Where a whole nation responded so nobly, no special distinction can be claimed for the part in the conflict borne by one institution, but the long roll of 1,493 enlistments tells how eagerly the men of the Royal Bank answered the call to arms. The proudest page in its history is the record of those who for our security served so valiantly, and of the unreturning, who to service added sacrifice.

The branches already established in foreign fields had proved both advantageous to the bank and of the utmost importance from a national standpoint. Not only had improved facilities been afforded to Canadian exporters where they already had trade connections, but new ground had been broken for their enterprise. A further advance in this direction was made in 1918-19 by the opening of branches in Spain, at Barcelona; in France, at Paris; in Brazil, at Rio de Janeiro; in Argentine, at Buenos Aires; and in Uruguay, at Montevideo.

## THE ROYAL BANK OF CANADA

Reviewing the past success of the bank in this expansive policy at a meeting of shareholders held on January 9th, 1919, Mr. Pease made the following statement:—

“Our foreign deposits have always exceeded our foreign commercial loans, as the Government returns show. The present excess is over \$15,000,000. We have now had twenty years' experience of banking in Cuba, the West Indies and Central America. During this period our losses have been infinitesimal—much under the percentage incurred in Canada, because the business represents chiefly the movement of staples, accommodation paper being inconsiderable. That Canada's trade is benefited by these branches is shown by the numerous business enquiries received. At the same time it cannot be said that we have neglected home interests. The number of our branches in Canada exceeds that of any other bank.”

The efforts of the bank to extend its facilities abroad resulted in April, 1919, in a reciprocal working arrangement being entered into with one of England's greatest institutions, the London County Westminster & Parr's Bank, Ltd., with its network of more than 700 branches in the United Kingdom, France, Belgium and Spain. Through the purchase by this London bank of 10,000 shares of Royal Bank stock Canadian, American and British interests were linked and the bank became representative of a strong economic Anglo-Saxon union.

On November 30th, 1919, its fiftieth anniversary, The Royal Bank of Canada, with a paid-up capital stock of \$17,000,000, reserve fund of \$17,000,000, deposits of \$419,121,000, loans of \$284,083,000, total assets of \$533,647,000, 622 branches, and a staff of 5,176, had gained a place in the list of the great banks of the world.

### CHAPTER 59

AN ACT TO INCORPORATE THE MERCHANTS BANK OF HALIFAX

[Assented to 22nd June, 1869]

WHEREAS the Honorable Edward Kenny, William Cunard, *Preamble* Thomas C. Kinnear, James Merkill, John Tobin, Thomas E. Kenny, Jeremiah Northup and James B. Duffus, have by their petition prayed that they might be incorporated for the purpose of establishing a bank in the city of Halifax, in the Province of Nova Scotia, and whereas it is desirable to grant the prayer of their petition: Therefore, Her Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:

1. The several persons hereinbefore named and such other persons as shall become shareholders in the corporation to be by this Act created and their assigns, shall be and they are hereby constituted and declared to be a corporation body corporate and politic by the name of the "Merchants Bank of Halifax," and shall have power to acquire and hold real and immovable estate for the management of their business not exceeding in annual value five thousand dollars, and may sell, alienate or exchange the same and acquire other instead.

2. The business of the Corporation shall be under the management of a President and not more than eight directors, and such other officers as may be found necessary.

The capital stock of the Bank hereby incorporated shall be one million of dollars, divided into ten thousand shares of one hundred dollars each, and two hundred thousand dollars of the said stock shall be subscribed for and paid up before the first day of November next, and a further sum of one hundred thousand dollars of the said stock shall be subscribed for and paid up at such time not later than the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy, as the directors shall appoint, and the remainder thereof, at such time or times as shall be prescribed by future legislation in that behalf, but no instalment shall in any case be called in unless thirty days' previous notice shall have first been given, in two at least of the newspapers published in Halifax, of the time and place appointed for the payment of instalments.

### CHAPTER 103

#### AN ACT RESPECTING THE MERCHANTS BANK OF HALIFAX, AND TO CHANGE ITS NAME TO "THE ROYAL BANK OF CANADA"

[Assented to 14th June, 1900]

WHEREAS the Merchants Bank of Halifax has, by its petition, *Preamble* prayed that it be enacted as hereinafter set forth, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:

1. The name of the Merchants Bank of Halifax is changed *Name changed* to "The Royal Bank of Canada," but such change in name shall not in any way impair, alter or affect the rights or liabilities of *Existing rights preserved* the said Bank, nor in anywise affect any suit or proceeding now pending, or judgment existing either by or in favour of or against the said Bank, which, notwithstanding such change in name, may be prosecuted, continued, completed and enforced as if this Act had not been passed.

2. Before this Act shall take effect, a general meeting of the *When Act shareholders* of the said Bank shall be called for the purpose of *to come into force* considering it, and a resolution accepting and approving thereof shall be passed by the shareholders present or represented by proxy at such meeting, and a certified copy of such resolution shall, within fifteen days after the passing thereof, be published in *The Canada Gazette*, and this Act shall take effect from the date of such publication.

### CHAPTER 104

#### AN ACT TO AMEND THE "ACT RESPECTING THE MERCHANTS BANK OF HALIFAX, AND TO CHANGE ITS NAME TO THE ROYAL BANK OF CANADA"

[Assented to 7th July, 1900]

**H**ER Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

1. Section 2 of the Act of the present session intituled *An Act respecting the Merchants Bank of Halifax, and to change its name to the Royal Bank of Canada* is repealed, and the following section is substituted therefor:—



### CHAPTER 157

AN ACT RESPECTING THE ROYAL BANK OF CANADA

[Assented to 13th July, 1906]

WHEREAS the Royal Bank of Canada has by its petition *Preamble* prayed that it be enacted as hereinafter set forth, and it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

1. The chief office of the Royal Bank of Canada is hereby changed from the City of Halifax, in the Province of Nova Scotia, to the City of Montreal, in the Province of Quebec.

2. The provisions of chapter 59 of the statutes of 1869, intituled An Act to incorporate the Merchants Bank of Halifax, and any amendments of the said Act, in so far as they are inconsistent with this Act, are hereby repealed.

3. This Act shall not take effect unless and until it has been submitted to a general or special meeting of the shareholders of the said bank and is approved of by a majority of the votes of the shareholders present or represented by proxy at such meeting and entitled to vote thereat, and provided that notice of such meeting and of the proposed change of head office was duly given; and thereupon the foregoing sections of this Act shall come into force upon the publication thereof in the *Canada Gazette*, and the Secretary of State of Canada shall cause them to be so published upon receiving a certificate under the hand of the president and the seal
