WHAT U.S. SOLD TO CANADA 62 PER CENT. OF IMPORTS. Special Commercial Agent Makes Report and Says Northwest Must Be Field for Future Invasion.

Washington, D.C., Nov. 25.—The United States sold Canada last year exports to the value of \$198,000,000. This amount constituted more than 62 per cent of the whole Canadian imports, but was only 11 per cent of the foreign exports of the United States. This statement is contained in a report of Charles M. Pepper, special agent of the department of commerce and labor, resulting from his study of the Dominion trade conditions. Besides selling goods to Canada, Mr. Pepper says 25,000 settlers went from the United States to its northern neighbor from January to October, 1905, and that the value of their effects was \$10,000,000.

WHEAT CORP COMPARED. Discussing the relation of the wheat production to population, the report estimates the yield in Canada this season at 1,000,000,000 bushels, or approximately equal to that of the State of Kansas. A production of 150,000,000 by 1910 is forecasted, provided crop conditions continue favorable and harvest hands can be obtained.

PARLIAMENT LIKELY TO MEET SECOND WEEK IN JANUARY. No Tariff Legislation Will Be Attempted for a Year—Ministerial Doings.

Ottawa, Nov. 26.—From the latest information gathered in government circles the next session of parliament will open the second week of January. This date was practically decided upon some time ago but subsequent developments in regard to the tariff inquiry placed the matter in an uncertain state. It is believed now that no effort will be made to prepare the legislation for next session. Gentlemen who have been in touch with the tariff commission since it went to Western Ontario given that the ministers do not intend to frame tariff legislation until next November. The parliament will be called together twice in 1906, the second time in November.
