

SCRAP IRON ASSESSMENTS.

How a Great Injustice Is Being Done to Ordinary Citizens Under the Present Law.

The following is a carefully prepared and absolutely correct summary of Chap. 6, 62 Victoria, "An Act to amend the Revenue of the Province of Ontario," passed April 1, 1900, and shows its results up to date.

In entering upon the subject it is advisable that a brief reference be made to the Assessment Act.

Section 2, subsection 10, defines personal property as goods, chattels, interest on mortgages, dividends from bank stocks, money, notes and accounts at their actual value, and all other property except real property.

Section 25 says that real and personal property shall be levied equally upon the whole rateable real and personal property.

Section 28 says that real and personal property shall be assessed at their actual cash value as they would be appraised in payment of a just debt from a solvent debtor.

Section 30 says that the personal property of an incorporated company shall be assessed against the company in the same manner as if the company were an unincorporated company or partnership.
