Some indication of the enormous consumptive capacity of the United States may be gained by a study of the live stock movement during the present year. Up to Oct. 1, Chicago, Kansas City, Omaha, St. Louis and St. Joseph had received 338,008 hogs and 5,462,138 sheep...

THE WORLD OUTSIDE

We print the above article from The Chicago Live Stock World for the benefit of our numerous patrons in the farming community. The increase in the consuming power of the United States home market is striking, and it is to be remembered that the extraordinary volume of receipts has been steadily absorbed by the domestic demand...

It should also be noted that together with the large decrease in United States hog receipts, there has been an accompanying falling off in average weights that, as compared with the previous year, is a year ago. The deduction is that the western states in the matter of hogs are less able to keep pace with the market than they are in the matter of cattle.

The lesson for Canadians to take from these statistics is that, unless present conditions are due to merely temporary causes, the development of the United States home market may leave the British market more and more open for live cattle and dead meat from the Dominion.

We are aware that a large number of progressive Canadian farmers are feeding a larger number of cattle this season than usual, and we will endeavor, as heretofore, to give such reliable information in our columns as shall enable them to market their cattle, hogs and sheep to the best advantage.

HELP TO FIGHT WHITE PLAGUE

It argues well for the campaign against tuberculosis that the church is taking an active part in the fight. The pastoral letter addressed to his diocese by the Anglican Bishop of Ottawa constitutes a hopeful sign of the times. In urging his people to personally and individually engage in active warfare against the dread white plague, his lordship shows that in being a good churchman he is a useful citizen, alive to what makes for the welfare of the community. CAMPS AT SIMILKAMEEN.

Percy Godenrath Gives His Impressions of a Trip Thru Them. Grand Forks, B.C., Oct. 16.—(Special.) Percy F. Godenrath returned to-day after a sixteen days' saddle trip thru the mining camps of Similkameen.

Speaking of his trip, Mr. Godenrath said: "At Princeton, the coal basin is being exploited at a depth with aid of bore drills. The greatest depth attained was 1000 feet by the Ashnola Coal Company. At a depth of 700 feet the bore passed thru two seams of six and four feet, separated by small partings of a few inches."

"William Blomgren, M.E., informed me that these were upper seams in the series which consists of three zones, and he estimated that the whole of the coal-bearing strata would be passed thru at a depth of 1500 feet."

"The Hot syndicate sank some 500 feet, and its reported bore passed thru seams aggregating forty-three feet of coal. It was good in the opinion of the Osoyoos and Similkameen Coal Company and the Exploration Company of British Columbia. It is a very good exposure of twelve feet of solid semi-bituminous coal. This showing is a highly encouraging one."

"Great interest is being manifested in Princeton coal basin, and the prospects are highly encouraging."

"The Great Northern Railway has Engineer Baldwin and staff making reconnaissance of passes thru Hope Range in the mountains of the province, containing precious metal and coal, ranching, timber and farm lands."
