PREMIER WHITNEY AND HIS CABINET MAKE INAUGURAL BOW IN MASSIVE HALL

Reception Tendered Mr. Whitney Proves to Be Happy Ceremony, Introducing New Government to Tory Toronto.

The prophet may be without honor in his own country, a newly-made premier of the Conservative persuasion, is on a vastly different plane in the hearts of his fellow-citizens. What mattered it that the wind blew a mimic hurricane and swirled sharp pricking clouds of snow in the faces of the crowds who thronged the downtown streets? The time of rejoicing had come and good old Tory Toronto was going to make the best of it weather or not. It was a celebration of an event unique in the history even of this city of demonstrations great and not infrequent. Fate or Providence had something to do with the reception to the leader of the late loyal opposition in the Ontario house falling upon the evening of the inauguration of his government, but it was a happy combination of circumstances that will be remembered for many years. Fully 2000 took part in the procession, and over half that number carried flambeaux, and as the parade wended its way along York and King and Yonge streets, with the blustering of colored stars filling the sky, the parade took the appearance of a fiery serpent, affording, if not exactly a brilliant, at all events an impressive spectacle. It was all more, more and more so, as the old stalwarts who, as he trumped along, told the young champion that his first vote in the last month, how he remembered the time of the old quoted Sandfield Macdonald government, called his torch with the same brightness as the many youngsters who had butted in for the occasion with the 15 years honor, have the pleasure of marking "my ballot thus" to sustain in power the government whose advent they enthusiastically last night. The ward members gathered in their own halls and proceeded to the Queen's. When the Third Ward boys came to the Queen's, they were met by Dr. Beattie Nesbitt stepping it out to the skirt of two waving pipes just like the old days, he said so afterwards at Massey Hall.

A NIGHT OF THANKSGIVING.

It was not just a mere parade of several hundreds of enthused party workers tendering a reception to their leader, nor was it a demonstration of triumph over a dethroned party of opposite political ideas. Rather was it an epoch making event, and not of the city alone, but of the country as a whole. There was a novelty in doing honor to a Conservative premier of Ontario—the first in thirty odd years. There was no spirit of exultation in the remarks of Premier Whitney or his ministers. A respect for the responsibility of their position and an appreciation of the lesson of the wrath that an outraged populace vented upon those who misused the confidence hitherto reposed in them: so much was indicated and so much was felt.

PARENT LOSES CONTROL REBELS TO OUST HIM

Three Dissatisfied Ministers Who Retired From Cabinet Have Majority of the Legislature Behind Them.

Quebec, Feb. 8.—(Special.)—Supporters of the three resigned ministers of the Parent government, to the number of 48, met last night at the Chateau Frontenac and passed a resolution approving of the action of the three dissatisfied members and pledging to support them in the future. This is a majority of the members of the assembly. The Parent faction, numbering 38, met in the parliament buildings and was in session until 12:30 this morning. When session broke up all those present would say "The meeting has been adjourned." STRIKERS PROMISE VIOLENCE.

Situation at Loda Remains Uncertain and Masters Inactive.

Loda, Feb. 8.—The situation here remains uncertain, and nothing definite has been known until Friday, when some of the largest manufacturers have decided, after paying off to-morrow, to open their mills and give the men a last chance to return to work. The masters say that if there is no response they will close their mills indefinitely. Little hope is expressed that the strike will be settled, the men apparently are frightened by the violence of the agitators. Many of the masters oppose concessions, fearing that it will handicap them in competition with Moscow and St. Petersburg, where wages already are lower than here and the hours of work longer.

Wanted Col. Hendrie in Charge of a Department.

Hamilton, Feb. 8.—(Special.)—It is impossible to disguise the fact that the people of Hamilton, both Conservative and Liberal, feel deeply disappointed because Lieut.-Col. John S. Hendrie was not chosen as minister of public works or placed in charge of one of the departments in Premier Whitney's cabinet. They cannot understand how a man so eminently qualified, as they believe, was passed over, and they hope that he will not be forgotten when the premier makes the changes in his advisers that he has hinted are likely to be made in the near future.


ALL SAFE.
