The Rule of the Merchants, Growing Out of Feudalism, Made Bankruptcy of Fishermen—Politics Aggravated the Situation—Many People Starving.

(SPECIAL ST. JOHN'S, N. F., LETTER COL.)—Newfoundland today is a country without banks, without currency, without credit, without money, without trade, without industry. Its population is reduced to hopeless poverty.

The country was devastated by a financial cyclone in December, and the mischievous conditions are still being felt. The only British dependency in North America not included in the Canadian Dominion, it has been the dream of every Canadian Premier to "round off the land," thus forming a United Canada from the Atlantic to the Pacific. The French continued to give them a prior right of catch and dry fish.

This contention is repudiated by England, but the French continue to work to the disadvantage of the Newfoundland fisherman. Should the latter be permitted to work in the fishery in a certain harbor and a Frenchman enters and desires the place, he simply drives the fisherman out.
