Eclipses.—There will be four eclipses this year, as follows:

I. An annular eclipse of the Sun, March 6th; invisible in America, but visible in Europe, Asia, and Africa.

II. A partial eclipse of the Moon, early Wednesday morning, March 20th; visible throughout America. Size, 0.813 of the Moon's diameter on the southern limb. See table below.

III. A total eclipse of the Sun, August 29th; invisible in Canada and the United States; visible in South America.

IV. A partial eclipse of the Moon, Friday evening, September 13th; visible in America generally. Size, 0.704 of the Moon's diameter on the northern limb. See the annexed table.

NOTE.—The Moon's place in this almanac shows the constellation and degree of the same that the Moon is in at about 7 o'clock P. M. Pisces is regarded as the first constellation, and Aries as the second. The signs and constellations of the same name are different, being 30° apart, and Aries is the first sign, and Taurus the second, while they are the second and third constellations. To find the signs, add 30° or a sign.
