THE REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

OF THE

DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

1892.

In submitting the twenty-fifth Annual Report of the proceedings of the Association, the Council have pleasure in being able to state that the interest taken in the Association, both by Competitors and its Patrons, continues unabated. Although from exceptional causes the number competing at the Annual Matches for 1892 was about thirty less than the year previous, the Annual Matches were well attended and carried through to a successful completion within the time prescribed. The diminution in the number of Competitors this year is partly owing to the absence of Competitors from Her Majesty's Regular Army. In 1891 we had a contingent of Fifteen Officers, N.C. Officers and men; this year, however, the Navy was represented by two Petty Officers. One of who, C. Isaacs, won 1st Prize in Nursery Match.

There is little doubt besides that the absence this year from the season's shooting programme of the Ontario Matches lessened the number of competitors from that and other Provinces at the Ottawa Matches; breaking as it did the usual current of the competitions.

The changes made in the distribution of the Money prizes in the programme of this year appeared to give general satisfaction to the Competitors, and the addition of the "Battalion Match" was thoroughly appreciated by the Militia Force. For the introduction of this important Match the Association has to thank Messrs. Hiram Walker & Sons of Walkerville, Ontario, who generously offered to present a Challenge Trophy,

value \$500, for competition which, of course, the Council was very glad to accept, and in addition the Firm further offered to furnish annually an Individual Prize for the highest score made in the Match.

The introduction of the Nursery Aggregate was due to the liberality of four citizens of Ottawa, who subscribed sufficient to enable the Association to make this addition to the Programme, their names are: J. R. Booth, Esq., J. W. McRae, Esq., F. X. St. Jacques, Esq., Russell House and Captain S. Maynard Rogers, 43rd Battn.

The Hon. Mackenzie Bowell, late Minister of Militia and Defence, contributed a very handsome prize in the shape of a Silver Wine Stand to be awarded to the highest individual score in the Minister of Militia's Match.

The Council has again to thank His Excellency the Governor-General for his continued interest in the welfare of the Association as well as for his liberal contribution to its Prize List of Five Hundred Dollars.

To the Government and Members of Parliament the thanks of the Association are also due for the encouragement and assistance given to the Association by the liberal grant voted.

The Canada Club of London still continue their handsome Prize for competition by the Canadian Team at Bisley.

The Chairman of Council, Lt.-Colonel F. C. Henshaw, Montreal, gave \$100 towards the prize list of the Match named after him, and the Hamilton Powder Company of Montreal again contributed a like amount, whilst the Banks with their usual liberality contributed as under:—

To all these supporters of the Association the Council desires to record its thanks, as well as to Lieut. Thomas Mitchell, 12th Battalion who gave a Martini Henry Match Rifle for competition, which however, he won after shooting off a tie with Lieut. Weller of the 59th Battalion.

A most convenient Post Office was established on the Range during the Annual Matches, where stamps could be bought, letters received and forwarded, with three deliveries daily. This improvement was greatly appreciated by all engaged at the Matches, and the Post Master General deserves the thanks of the Association for the thorough manner in which this service was performed.

The telegraph and telephone arrangements were also ably carried out, and the Competitors' Marquee was well supplied with stationery and newspapers, very much to their satisfaction.

The Camp during the competition was for the first time lighted by electricity. This proved a great boon to the competitors, many of whom took up their quarters under canvas during the meeting. The admirable Electric Railway service renders the Camp and Rifle Range very easy of access.

At the Annual Meeting of Competitors held in Camp on the Rifle Range on the second evening of the Matches, a very strong opinion in favor of the exclusive use of the Martini-Henry rifle at the Association Matches was expressed, and it will be for the members to consider if anything can be done to further the wishes of Competitors in this direction.

The report of the Commandant of the Canadian Rifle Team at Bisley which follows this report will be found very interesting.

So much depends upon the manner in which the duties of the Staff are carried out, that the Council feels deeply indebted to the Officers who composed it, for their zeal and assiduity in the performance of their duties, and desires especially to mention the Chief Executive Officer, Major W. E. Hodgins, G.G.F.Gds., whose untiring energy rendered him of the greatest assistance all through the matches.

FINANCE.

The Treasurer's Statement of the Finances of the Association, duly audited, is submitted herewith.

Affiliation fees from Rifle Associations, including \$42.00 for Bronze Medals distributed, amounted to \$722.00, as against \$703 received last year.

The number of Affiliated Rifle Associations this year is as follows : viz.—Provincial 8, Regimental, County and others, 39.

The annual subscriptions received for the year amounted to \$226.00.

The Associate Members' fees received as qualification for competition in Matches, amounted to \$331, showing a decrease of \$20, as compared with last year.

The receipts from special donations amounted to \$930.00 as against \$640.00 received in 1891, an increase of \$290.00.

Special donations from Banks amounted to \$800, a decrease of \$25 as compared with last year.

The entry fees to Matches this year, including sighting shots, blow-off tickets, post entries and fines, exclusive of the charge for ammunition, amounted to \$4,504.59, as against \$4,424.67, received in 1891, an increase of \$79.92.

The receipts from the sale of ammunition this year amounted to \$1,287.60, as against \$1,101.46 received in 1891, an increase of \$186.14.

Cash Prizes and Badges amounted to \$7,568.34, as against \$7,299.31 last year, an increase of \$269.03.

The Bisley Team expenditure amounted to \$5,720.21 as against \$5,556.15 in 1891, an increase of \$164.06.

The receipts from all sources for the year, amounted to \$18,849.29, which with the balance of \$945.95, from last year, shows a total of \$19,795.24, on the credit side of the account.

The expenditure amounted to \$19,741.66, showing a balance of \$53.58, in favour of the Association at the end of the year.

In accounting for the comparatively small balance at credit of the Association this year, as shown by the Treasurer's statements in detail, it will be observed that the expenses attending the preparation of the ranges were large; this outlay was necessary to put the ground in good order for the competition, and consisted partly of permanent improvements which should save expense in future years; the cash prize list was materially increased, and remodeled, with a view of encouraging young shots and distributing the prizes more fairly in proportion to the scores made; the extension of the duration of the prize meeting from four to five days, necessitated by the improved programme and the desire expressed by the previous year's competitors to be given more time for extra series competitions, added greatly to the working expenses, especially in the pay of the staff; and the Bisley team expenses were increased by the additional cost of passage over that of last year, a charge which the Association could not control. On the other hand the receipts were reduced by the unexpected falling-off in the number of competitors, the cause for which has already been stated.

A detailed account of the expenditure made by Lt.-Colonel Massey, commanding the Bisley Team for 1892, will be found in the Appendix.

REPORT OF

LIEUT.-COL. F. MASSEY,

COMMANDING THE

BISLEY TEAM FOR 1892.

MONTREAL, Sept., 30th, 1892.

To Lieut.-Colonel the Honourable G. A. Kirkpatrick, President Dominion Rifle Association.

SIR.—The Canadian Bisley Rifle Team of 1892, paraded in the Drill Hall, Montreal, on Friday 23rd June last, and having been inspected by me, embarked on board the R.M.S. "Parisian" the same evening. All the Members were present, and with a single exception, were well uniformed. This latter defect was remedied by the time we reached Bisley, and the whole Team, I am pleased to report, presented throughout a most soldierly and creditable appearance. Leaving Quebec on Sunday a.m., 25th, we arrived in Liverpool on the evening of Monday, July 4th, after a pleasant voyage, during which Captain Ritchie and Officers of S. S. "Parisian," succeeded in making the passage very comfortable and pleasant to all concerned.

We proceeded to Cambridge for practice on Tuesday, July 5th, leaving Liverpool at noon via London & North Western Railway. The Team received while in Liverpool every possible attention from Mr. Dyke, Canadian Agent, and the whole arrangements of transport to Cambridge, Bisley and returned to Liverpool, were most satisfactorily performed by the L & N. W. Railway Co., every possible requirement and detail being carefully provided for, and promptly carried out. I have pleasure also in testifying to the universal courtesy received from all the officials of this and other Railway Co's during our stay.

The Team practised at Cambridge, July 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th and 11th, arriving at Bisley on Tuesday 12th inst., at 1 p.m. From this time until Saturday, the Team had no opportunity of practising (except in a few special matches at 200 and 500 yards) until the match for the Kolapore cup was fired on Saturday 16th, this being the first opportunity our picked Team of 8 had of going over the ranges. I regret that the Canadians did not win first place, having lead the field by six points at 200 yards and tying Mother Country for first place at 500 yards, falling back to second place at conclusion of match, mainly, I think, owing to Members of the Team never having fired a shot at 600 yards on the Bisley Ranges previous to the actual firing of the Match.

I would suggest to the Council of the D.R.A. that they respectfully ask the Council of the National Rifle Association, to place the Kolapore cup match in second week of shooting as heretofore, and that all the Ranges be open during first week by pool matches or otherwise as they may deem best.

The N. R. A. Council invite suggestions from Competitors regarding arranging of Programme for 1893, and would, I am sure, give full consideration to any suggestions coming from the Dominion Rifle Association.

His Royal Highness The Duke of Cambridge, accompanied by a numerous and brilliant staff, visited our Camp on Friday, 15th of June. He expressed his pleasure at meeting the Canadians once more, and hoped they would continue to come, as they now formed an important part of the National Rifle Association meeting. His Royal Highness was much pleased with the appearance of the team, and wished them every success.

We are once more indebted to the Canada Club for a handsome Cup, which was presented on their behalf by Sir Charles Tupper, Bart., G.C.M.G., on the afternoon of the Garden Party given by the Officers and Members of the Canadian Team.

To The Earl of Waldegrave, Chairman; to Col. MacKinnon, Secretary, as well as to Executive Officers, the Canadian Team owe especial

thanks for cordial welcome and many courtesies extended by them during our stay at Bisley.

Sir Charles Tupper, Mr. J. T. Colmar, and Staff of the Canadian Government Offices, were indefatigable in their attention, and assisted greatly in the success of our trip. They cannot be thanked too much, and their many kindnesses, as well as the importance of those Offices in London, are fully appreciated by every Member of the Team.

A special Match with the Lee Metford Magazine Rifle, and Cordite Smokeless Ammunition, was given by Major Palliser, prize £20, the Rifles being kindly loaned by Lord Wellesley, Commanding First Battalion Grenadier Guards, then at Pirbright. Excellent shooting was made, considering the fact that the men never used this Rifle before. The 3 prizes of £10, £6 and £4 were won by the following :

The London Corporation Cup was won by Staff Sergeant J. A. Simpson, and the Canada Club Cup was taken by Private C. A. Windatt, he being second highest aggregate, it having been previously ordered by me that no Member of the Team should be the winner of both Cups.

I beg to recommend that practice be continued at Cambridge, as Pirbright, for many reasons, is unsuitable, and that the thanks of the Dominion Rifle Association be conveyed to Col. Roberts, Commanding the Cambridge University Rifle Volunteers, for his continued permission to practice on their Ranges, and for many kindnesses received during Team's stay in Cambridge.

I would also recommend that Cottage quarters be prepared in Canada of Canadian Architecture and materials for the Officers and Members of the Canadian Teams, who may visit Bisley in future, instead of spending large sums annually for hire of Marquees, etc. These Cottages could be

built here, and re-erected permanently at small cost. They could be made much more attractive and comfortable than even our present camp. The Social duties of the Camp were successfully carried out, the Garden Party given by Officers and Members of Team, being attended by over 400 visitors.

To Sir Donald A. Smith, is due thanks for entertaining the Team, and bringing them as Canadians, prominently before many distinguished people in England.

I deeply regret having to report that Lieut. J. E. Horsey was, through ill health, unable to continue his shooting at Cambridge, and though full of pluck, had finally to give up and did not fire a shot at Bisley, much to the regret of every member of the Team, who all sympathized greatly with him. In this connection, I would recommend that in future, certificates of health from the Regimental Surgeon for each prospective Member of the Team, be forwarded to the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association, at least one month previous to date of sailing of Steamer.

Behaviour of Canadian Team was exemplary, they appeared at all times well and properly dressed, reflecting great credit on the Militia Force of Canada.

Major W. C. Macdonald of Toronto, proved a painstaking and very efficient Adjutant.

The winnings of the Team under all circumstances were highly creditable, and while the conditions were somewhat against them this year in change of programme and weather, each one did his best to win, making for the 19 Members who competed, a higher average than in previous year.

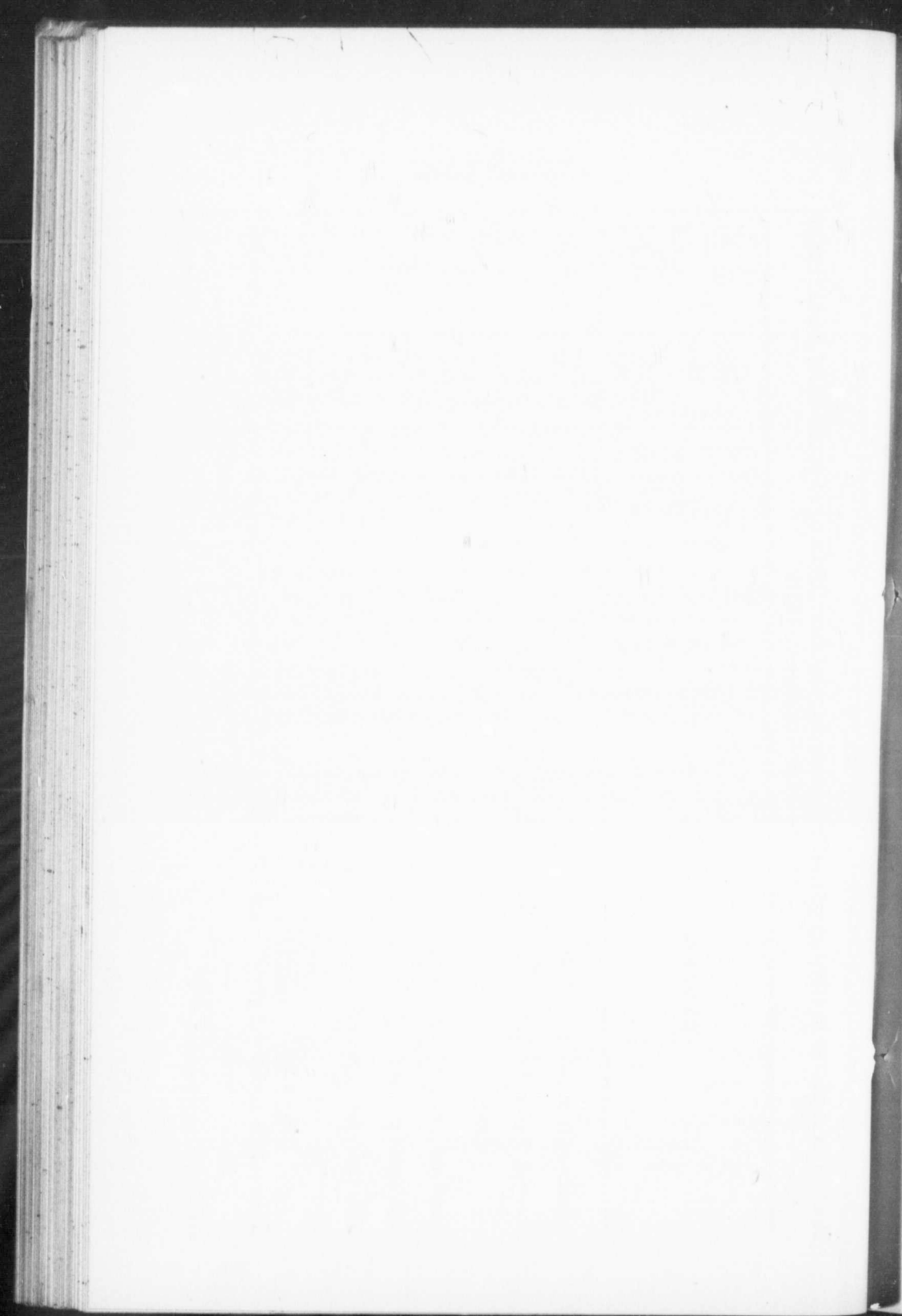

Competitors' Meeting, held August 30th, 1892.

According to time-honored custom, the annual meeting of competitors for the ventilation of grievances, was held in the large Council tent on the ranges on Tuesday evening 30th August. The Chairman of the Executive Committee, Lt.-Colonel White, presided, and Lt.-Colonel Bacon acted as Secretary. There was a large attendance of shooting men, the tent being completely filled. The Chairman opened the proceedings by inviting suggestions from those present.

Captain Rogers, 43rd Battalion, expressed a hope that more wind-flags would be placed on both sides of the range to indicate the power of the-wind.

The Chairman said the suggestion was a good one, and would be attended to without delay. He quite agreed that on no range in the world did the wind blow from so many quarters at once as it did on the Rideau range. (Laughter.)

Lieut. Pringle, 10th R. Co., brought up the old question of the quality of the ammunition. He thought it hardly fair that when riflemen had been practising with '91 ammunition all summer they should have '92 ammunition served out to them at these matches.

The Chairman said he was assured by Colonel Panet, Deputy Minister of Militia, that the same powder was used in the '92 ammunition as in '91.

Staff-Sergt. Dent, Royal Grenadiers, said he and other competitors had examined the ammunition and it was noticed that the grains of powder were not even in color, some brown grains being noticeable, although the regulation color is black.

Lt.-Colonel Panet, Deputy Minister of Militia, assured the competitors that the powder was the same as used last year. It was English powder, carefully tested in England, and again at the cartridge factory. He suggested the formation of a Board to hear all complaints of this kind and examine the quality of the ammunition before matches. He would, however, call the attention of the Superintendent of the factory to the fact alluded to by Sergt. Dent and Lieut. Pringle. This year's ammunition (1892 brand) was served out because it was asked for.

Captain Rogers remarked that the markers had been heard to say that in many cases the bullets had entered the targets sideways, proving something to be wrong with the bullet.

Lt.-Colonel Pennington Macpherson said that as one of those who scored badly this year, he could assure the meeting that to clean his rifle he was obliged to use methylated spirits, so badly was it fouled.

Staff-Sergt. McVittie, an old shot, had experienced the same thing.

Major Clarke advised the use of the newest and best powder obtainable, and would have it tested before the D.R.A. meeting by a competent Committee.

Lt.-Colonel Wright thought there was something wrong with the rifle itself. When you go beyond 500 yards, he said, you are outside the competent range of the Snider. It is time anyway to do away with the Snider and use the Martini-Henry exclusively.

Lt.-Colonel Hood corroborated the reports as to bad powder. One sighting shot fouled his rifle so that two succeeding shots at 600 yards fell two hundred yards short of the target, and it took the armourer an hour to clean the barrel. He deprecated the continued use of the Sinder rifle, and hoped this would be the last meeting at which it would be used.

Major Hughes, M. P., Lindsay, stated that Canadian riflemen going to Bisley were seriously handicapped from the fact that nearly all the home matches were shot with the Snider. He favored the adoption of the Martini-Henry.

After remarks from Major Clark, Major Mason, Staff-Sergt, Henderson, Major Hartt and others, Pte. Burns, 92nd, St. John, N.B., moved, seconded by Staff-Sergt. Dent. "That the council of the D.R.A., take proper measures to ascertain the quality of the ammunition before adopting it for use at the annual matches."

The resolution was carried unanimously.

Lieut. T. Mitchell, 12th Battalion, moved: "That in the opinion of the meeting, Martini-Henry rifles should hereafter be used entirely at the annual meetings of the D.R.A." In making the motion, Lieut. Mitchell said that it was a farce to select men for Bisley from those who stood high in the Snider aggregate, many of whom were indifferent shots with the Martini. (Hear, hear.)

Major Hartt said the riflemen of New Brunswick had unanimously passed a resolution urging the D.R.A. to adopt the Martini exclusively in the Ottawa matches.

The resolution was carried unanimously.

Captain Hartt, St. John, wanted to know about the system of inspecting the markers in the butts.

Lt.-Colonel White replied that markers were superintended by the Assistant-Commissioner of the Dominion Police, who was aided by two non-commissioned officers, and most faithfully discharged the duties of inspection. This was the general opinion of the meeting.

Captain Rogers said he thought the rule requiring Canadian representatives to Bisley to be properly uniformed before leaving Canada should be rigidly enforced. He thought the inspecting officer at Montreal should have the power to rule any man off the team who had not his

proper dress. Some men had gone to England with outfits which no pawnbroker would buy for a shilling. (Laughter.)

Major Macdonald, 48th, said some Bisley competitors had only been gazetted as officers a week or two before the departure of the team, and consequently could not procure their uniforms in time, but immediately on arriving in England they did so, and in all competitions they appeared properly uniformed. (Applause.) He noticed an improvement at Bisley, and that was that sighting and blow-off shots were included on the one ticket. He moved, seconded by Captain Rogers, "That sighting and blow-off tickets be dispensed with, and the cost of sighting and blow-off shots be included in the entrance moneys, one sighting-shot to be taken at each range, the blow-off shot to be optional."

The motion was adopted.

Then there was some complaint about the squadding. Some marksmen said they had been squadded with the same men all through.

Lieut. Mitchell, 12th—"Well, I was squadded with my brother all day, but as he's from Winnipeg and I from Toronto it's no proof of improper squadding." (Laughter).

Lt.-Colonel White—"Of course nobody can keep the run of shooting families that scatter all over Canada." (More laughter.)

It was decided to count all shots through the target upon their merit, irrespective of indications of ricochet other than the throwing of dust into the butts. Also to start the Rideau match on the following afternoon early enough to allow competitors ticketed for 6-10 p.m. to fire at 4-10 p.m.

On the suggestion of Major MacDonald, it was decided that the Secretary, Lt.-Colonel Bacon, should communicate with the Secretary of the National Rifle Association, advocating the opening of the Extra Series Matches at Bisley during the first week of the competition.

The meeting then adjourned.

“That \$700 be paid to Messes. Askwith and Neville in full of all demands.”—Carried.

Several claims for refunds of entry fees from competitors holding D.R.A. Silver Medals were considered, and it was resolved—

“That where the claims for free entry were not made in accordance with Rule 4 of the Constitution, they could not be entertained.”

CONSTITUTION.

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

1. That the Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

2. Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year, and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association for the current year upon payment of the sum of \$1.00, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches, but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3. Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

4. Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion

Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its *bona fide* members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete free of entrance fee in the "Dominion of Canada" and "Affiliated Association" matches at the first Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association at which he is present after he wins the medal; provided always that the name of the winner and details of the matches at which it is won shall have been communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such prize meeting.

5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, to be named by the Council.

The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

7. There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8. There shall be a Council of members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions :

Fourteen	[14]	from Ontario.
Ten	[10]	" Quebec,
Six	[6]	" New Brunswick,
Six	[6]	" Nova Scotia,
Four	[4]	" Manitoba,
Four	[4]	" British Columbia,
Four	[4]	" Prince Edward Island,
Two	[2]	" each of the North-West Territories so soon as Associations are formed therein and affiliated with the Dominion Rifle Association, as Provincial Association,

one-half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Associations of the respective Provinces at their Annual Meeting; the names of those elected by the Provincial Associations to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Associations on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form a quorum.

9. The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.

10. The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members, and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during its term of office, the same may be filled up by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be *ex-officio* members of the Executive Committee.

11. The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with the Association, and the Deputy Adjutant's General commanding districts, *being members* of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

12. There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.

13. The Council shall have the arrangement of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or

essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14. The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

15. The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.

16. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held in Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they, or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

17. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

18. The Annual Business Meeting of the Members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa, on the third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.

19. A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the

Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any members or competitor attending the matches, but no changes in the Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.

20. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all Members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

GENERAL BY-LAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION.

ADOPTED AT

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

Meeting of
Council.

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary
Meetings.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by the Chairman, or by any four of the Members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the Meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such extraordinary Meetings.

The Council to
keep minutes of
all proceedings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purposed by the Secretary, and open to inspection of any Member of the Council.

Finance Com-
mittee.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three Members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting.

Treasurer to de-
posit sums re-
ceived in Savings
Banks.

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence by some of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

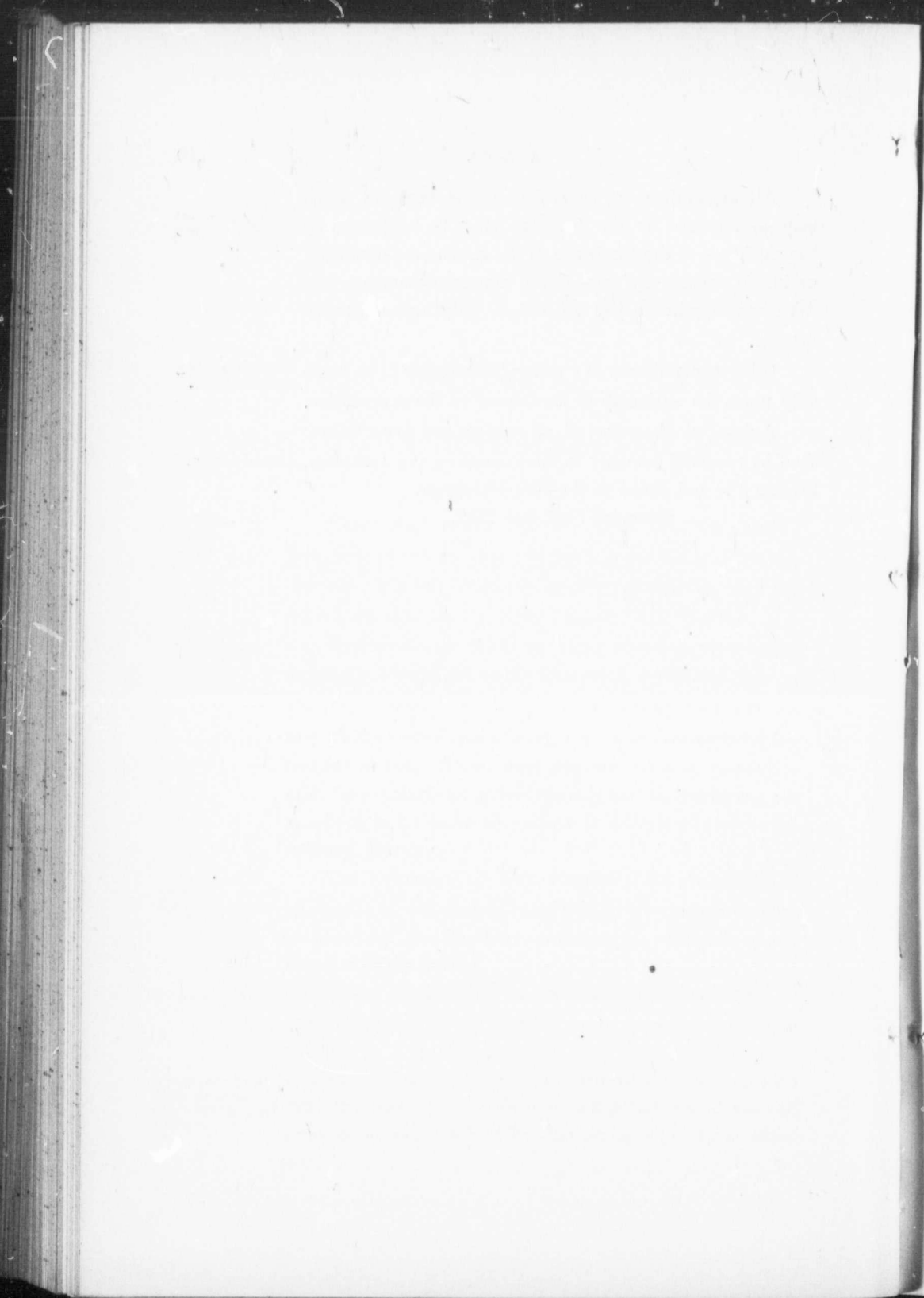
