Pupils from a considerable distance have been attracted to our school, and already there are about a dozen in senior leaving class, as well as candidates for the various honor departments of Toronto University. The staff consists of George H. Reed, B.A., Toronto University, specialist in classics; Thomas C. Dolige, B.A., Toronto University, specialist in mathematics; Miss Mary Annis, B.A., Toronto University, specialist in modern languages, and Miss Mearns, first A. specialist in English.

Rothschild's Bomb Throwing Unknown.

Paris, Sept. 6.—This man who attempted to explode a bomb in the vestibule of the Rothschild's banking house in the Rue La Fayette yesterday, still refuses to reveal his identity. All he will say about himself is that he is a deserter from the army. In the hope of obtaining information as to the man and his antecedents, the police will distribute 50 photographs of him in the various tribunals throughout France. The analysis of the contents of the bomb taken from the prisoner shows that it was composed of 70 grammes of chlorate of potassium and 15 to 20 grammes of ordinary gunpowder.

LABOR CONGRESS OFFICERS.

Three Important Resolutions Passed at the London Conference. London, Ont., Sept. 6.—The Labor Congress elected officers this morning as follows: President, Patrick J. Jobin, Quebec, re-elected by acclamation; Vice-President, Alex. Macdonald, Ottawa, re-elected by acclamation; Secretary-Treasurer, George W. Dower, Toronto, re-elected by acclamation; Executive Committee: Quebec—J. P. Ryan, Montreal; H. Laforce Langevin, Quebec; John Scott, Quebec; Ontario—D. A. Carey, Toronto; J. W. Patterson, Ottawa; John Flett, Hamilton; Manitoba—C. J. Stewart, Winnipeg; Small, W. J. Hodgins, Winnipeg; British Columbia—George Bartley, Vancouver; William McKay, Victoria; Thomas Salmon, Nanaimo, Victoria.

The only fight was over the election of the Ontario delegates. The lucky candidates were: George T. Sealie, Toronto; Michael Powell, Jr., London; R. Hessel, London; W. S. St. Pierre, Ottawa.

Quebec was selected as the next place of meeting. The other places voted were Kingston, Brantford and Montreal.

Cheap Money Wanted. The Dominion Government will be asked to issue all money at a low rate of interest, and to declare at the same time that all banks shall be banks of deposit only. The Provincial Governments will be requested to issue non-interest-bearing bonds as a loan, and a law to enable municipalities to do likewise for the purposes of public expenditure.

Repeat the Two Acre Exemption. The first row between the new unionists, the Socialists and the old Unionists occurred when the bill, passed at the last Ontario Legislature, which provides that grounds exceeding two acres in cities and towns may be taxed as farm lands, was under consideration. The committee reported that it would be advisable to insist on its repeal.

Delegate Stewart of Winnipeg gave notice of motion with the idea of obtaining the presence of the Congress in that city in 1897.

Pay Wages Weekly. On motion of J. Hawthorne of London it was decided to petition the various Provincial Governments to amend existing laws dealing with the subject of wages, so that all employees shall in future be paid weekly and in the current money of the Dominion.

Just before adjournment for luncheon Vice-President C. O. Currie of the Patrons of Industry put in an appearance and made a short speech. He regretted exceedingly the fact that the representatives of the Patrons had not been present at the different sessions of the Congress. He believed that the amalgamation of the two classes would make a great organization.

Renowned Sale of "The Mammoth." It was rumored yesterday that the Mammoth Building in King-street east had been sold by the Messrs. Thompson to a large agricultural implement concern. Mr. Joyce Thompson was interviewed, and said to a World reporter: "There is positively no truth in the rumor that the building has changed hands. Negotiations for a sale are pending with several parties, but we have not committed ourselves to any of them."

"Are the Massey-Harris Co. or the McCormick Co. of Chicago interested?" asked the reporter.

"Well, we have been negotiating with the McCormick Co. with a large seed concern, but as far as we are aware the Massey-Harris Co. have no desire to purchase the building, although they have rented a portion in the rear for several years. The McCormick Co. are, I believe, desirous of having a large show room in the city."

"Why do you wish to sell the building, Mr. Thompson?" "It is the intention of the firm to discontinue business."

"Yes, the business will be practically transferred to the John Eaton Company, as all the members of the Thompson firm have taken an equivalent amount of stock in that concern. The King-street store will not be closed, however, until Christmas, and perhaps not then. As to the sale of the building, you may say that at present we do not know who will be the purchaser."

Oxford and Cambridge Cricketers. On Thursday evening the Oxford and Cambridge cricketers visited the Exhibition and were met on the grounds by the chairman of the Specialty Committee, ex-Adm. Score, and other officials and were by them suitably entertained and conducted through the Exhibition. They expressed themselves as being highly pleased with their reception.
