made for feeding racks for hay and grain under shelter, as sheep have great aversion to water, soaked grain, or fodder; the drier the food, better it suits them. They prefer to take their water separate, and should be brought where they can have convenient access to it, if not all times, yet as often as twice a day at least. When supplied in the yards they will drink frequently. To winter sheep successfully it must be done under the eye of the owner, or one equally interested, and must give due attention to the daily wants of the flock. In mild, damp weather, sheep consume sparingly, compared with cold, dry weather, and the supply needs to be proportioned to their wants, or great waste will be made.

PREPARATIONS for the labours of the coming seed time can now largely made,—fences, tools, seeds, and no less important plans for work can be got in readiness in this time of comparative leisure.

any are engaged off their farms at this season, in work, perhaps, bringing in more ready money, but particularly of far less advantage to themselves, as farmers. Others idle away the winter to grumble at bad food, crops and the hurry of farm life. With the new year there is room for hope, and to "turn over a new leaf" in the volume of progress. The farmer, if not anxious for improvement, is never at a loss for employment upon his land in the winter. There are a thousand things he can do to enhance the comfort and thrift of his stock, and to increase the amount and value of manure. And it should not be forgotten that the richer and better stock are fed, the more rapid and profitable their growth, and the greater value their manure.

THE fertilizing properties of bones have long been placed beyond question; the great difficulty has been to make their fertilizing properties easily and cheaply available. Bones are used in three ways:—1st, cracking them with a sledge hammer into small fragments; 2nd, by grinding into powder; and 3rd, by dissolving in sulphuric acid. Bones

contain other valuable enriching substances besides the phosphates which is dissipated by burning, but is wholly saved by dissolving in sulphuric acid. Bone dust or burnt bones may be sowed over the surface, harrowed or ploughed in; but the paste made by dissolving should be made dry by mixing with peat, sawdust or ashes, before spreading. The more finely it is made, the more speedy its action, making a most efficient and durable dressing for the land, in durability exceeding any other material in use. Bones decomposed in compost heaps of alternate layers of good soil, (one-half an ox-cart load to a ton of ground bone,) with sprinkling of salt, will always be the cheapest form of phosphate.

How few persons know the value of raw hide. It seems strange to them sell all their skins for a very small sum. Take a strip of well-dried raw hide an inch wide, and a horse can hardly break it by pulling back,—two of them he cannot break any way. Cut into narrow strips, shave the hair off with a sharp knife, to use for bag strings; the most effective bags will outlast two sets of bags. Farmers know how annoying it is to send bags and have them returned *minus* the strings. It will outlast common iron (common) in any shape, and is stronger. It is good to put around a broken thill—better than iron. Two sets of raw hide halters last a man's lifetime,—if he don't live too long. In some places they use raw hide log-chains to work cattle with, cut into narrow strips

and twisted together hawser fashion. It is good to tie in for a broken link in a trace chain. It can be tanned so it will be soft and pliable like harness leather. The only trouble is it will last too long. For whips, cut in strings about one inch wide at the top, and about eight ten feet long, running to a point, with a cracker eight inches long; the crack of it may be heard as far as you can an Enfield rifle.

MUCH is lost by the imperfect, thin, and uneven seeding of meadows. Bare spots and thin grass, amounting, as they very often do, to one fourth of the whole surface, would make a total loss of five acres every twenty acre meadow. Sometimes the loss amounts to much more. The importance of thick and even seeding is not sufficiently appreciated. Thin or bare patches in existing meadows may be covered with grass.

of this implement of tillage. A seed-bed of clean, mellow, fresh turn earth, is a pre-requisite to the sowing or planting of all crops. Loosening and pulverization of the soil is the first great object of operation of ploughing; another is the complete mixture of the parts which the soil is composed, and to bring up the under soil to the surface. The destruction of weeds is another object of the use of the plough; burying the manure is the last object. Ploughing is therefore necessary, and the more perfectly it loosens and pulverizes the soil, the more easily will it be penetrated, and the more numerous will be the roots put until the whole soil is filled with their hair-like fibres. To expose soil to the action of the atmosphere has long been the practice of

ers and reduced condition. The harness should be examined frequently to see that it fits well and to prevent chafing. It will be observed when horses are ploughing the traces draw downward, and when attached to a waggon, horizontally; the back straps should therefore be lengthened a little when they are removed from the waggon to the plough. Rainy days should be devoted to clearing out all the rubbish from the stable and see and have them kept clean and well purified. Examine all pair tools, and have them all in perfect order for use when required. Grease waggons and carts, oil harness, brush up stables, examine and render perfectly clean all seed for sowing and planting.

Now, farmers, is the time to look after your mowing machines, rakes, hand rakes, forks, &c. See that they are all in proper order.

time has come and harvest will soon be here. Take your mowing machine into your workshop the first leisure or rainy day, and overhaul thoroughly. By putting your machine in good order before having commences, you are ready to commence haying one or two days before your neighbour,—who leaves his machine to fix until the day he wants to commence mowing. Be sure and have a good horse rake. Next to mowing machine in point of labour-saving, is the horse rake. Clean your barns and sheds. Barns and sheds in which you intend to store your grain and hay, should be thoroughly cleaned of all the hay and refuse stuff that will collect there during the winter. By doing a week or two previous to filling your barns, you give the rats and notice to quit, as it leaves no harbouring place for them. These, many other things that may be put in shape before harvesting commences, will save the trouble of doing it at a season when you have the time to spare to do it.

THE following receipts for washes for buildings or fences will be found satisfactory in use and wear:—Take a clean barrel that will hold water, put into it half-a-bushel of quick lime, and slack it by pouring over it boiling water sufficient to cover it 4 or 5 inches deep, stirring until it is slaked. Dissolve in water, and add 2 pounds of sulphate of zinc, (white vitriol), and 1 pound of salt, which will cause the wash to harden on the wood work in a few days; add sufficient water to bring to the consistency of thick white-wash. To make a pleasant cream colour to the above wash, add 3 lbs. yellow ochre. For fawn colour, add 4 umber, 1 lb. Indian red, and 1 lb. lamp black. For grey or stone colour add 4 lbs. raw umber and 2 lbs. lamp black. Fresh or caustic lime

The best pasture land, especially while young, can be ruined by feeding too closely and unseasonably,—late in autumn, early in spring time. The practice of top dressing grass lands in autumn is becoming more appreciated, the advantage being two-fold : first, mechanical protection from exposure to winds and cold ; secondly, enriching effects of the liquid manure carried down by rains among grass roots. If once the experiment is tried, it will most likely be repeated. It succeeds remarkably well on heavy and strong soils.

The time for planting may vary considerably with circumstances. If the buds have been dug up early before the buds have swollen, and have it must be well healed in, they may be set out safely, even after the leaves on young, cuttings with them,—they are commonly nearly all left behind; stems and autumnal buds are not of much value without roots. If this point has been carefully attended to, and the roots have been well spread out in every direction; first, when set, and placed compactly in fine earth, they cannot fail to live; there is no use in losing one in a thousand. After that the great requisite is to keep the surface mellow and well cultivated. Small trees are preferable for general transplanting, for the reason that you obtain more roots in proportion to the size of the tree, and what is better, the necessity of amputating trunk and branch will not exist. Trees taken from open lands have a preference over those taken from the forest;

on running at large in the highways without keepers. Some pretended that they belonged to the town or county where they were located and that each individual had a right to use them for pasture. This is good enough up another point, not quite so agreeable. If counties or towns thoroughly cleared the highways, they would readily be required to make and maintain one-half of all the fences on the lines thereof, which would make a heavy and perpetual tax on the community, and be a great relief to individuals. But the common law of England, of some four hundred years standing, settles this matter very justly, where it says, "The King himself, has no right to the highway, except for purposes of travel and passage,—that the trees and stones, except such as are needed for repairs, with all other minerals, and the grass, belong to him through whose land the way passes." Consequently, then, highways belong to those from whose lands they are taken, for all purposes except travel and the right

An important advantage in spreading manure over fields, instead of leaving it in large heaps, is that the latter will ferment, and unless properly supplied with absorbents, much volatile fertilizing portions will be lost. Manure finely spread, and finely diffused through the soil by repeated harrowings, and by ploughing, or by being washed into the earth, is thus more finely diffused than could be effected by the fine teeth of the harrow, is far more efficient than if thrown in lumps over the surface or imperfectly ploughed under in lumps.

Local Letters, if pre-paid, 3 cents per half ounce.

Local Letters, if unpaid, 5 cents per half ounce.

If a letter is posted partially unpaid, the charge on delivery will be the same as if wholly unpaid, deducting, however, any amount that may have been pre-paid upon it. Letters mailed for delivery at the office where posted, 1 cent each; must be prepaid by stamp, otherwise they will be returned to the writer. Letters are re-directed from one place to another without any further charge. On letters remailed from the Head Letter Office, 5 cents additional.

Letters to Non-commissioned Officers and Privates, whether in Her Majesty's Service or Canadian Volunteers whilst on active service, if pre-paid, for two cents each, when not over the  $\frac{1}{2}$  ounce.; if over  $\frac{1}{2}$  ounce, ordinary letter rates.

On letters for P. E. Island, the charge is 3 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz., if unpaid, 5 cents; to Newfoundland  $12\frac{1}{2}$  cents—pre-payment required.

Postage on letters to British Columbia and Vancouver's Island 10 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.—must be pre-paid. An additional sea-rate from San Francisco is charged on delivery. The rate to Red River, via United States, is 6 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.—must be paid in advance.

Letters for the United States is 6 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz., if pre-paid; if unpaid, or only partially paid, 10 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  ounce.

Letters sent by way of the United States, if addressed via New York, may be forwarded to the Brazils, Acapulco, Aspinwall, Costa Rica, Guatemala, Cuba, Mexico, Nicaragua (Pacific side), Panama, San Thomas, Sandwich Island, Venezuela, and the British West Indies, 10 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. which must be pre-paid by postage stamps.

To Bermuda, the British and Foreign West Indies, by British packet from Halifax, monthly, the charge is  $12\frac{1}{2}$  cents, which must be pre-paid.

Via New York to Guadaloupe, Hayti (St. Domingo), Martinique, Port Rico, Santa Cruz, the postage is 22 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. By the sea route to Bolivia, Ecuador, Valparaiso, Honduras, Mexico, via Havanna, Nicaragua (Gulf of Mexico side) Callao, Lima, 34 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.

Letter rates to the United Kingdom, if by Canadian Packet and man Line from Halifax, not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.  $12\frac{1}{2}$  cents. Exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. and not exceeding 1 oz., 25 cents. Exceeding 1 oz. and not exceeding  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz.,  $37\frac{1}{2}$  cents, and so on increasing, one rate of postage for each additional  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. If letters for the United Kingdom are posted unpaid, they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling in addition to the postage on delivery.

The postage on letters by the Cunard line from New York, is 15 cents per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz., and an additional 15 cents for every  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz., with a fine of 6d. sterling if posted unpaid or only partially pre-paid.

**Mail Matter exempt from Postage.**

All mailable matter, sent to or by the Governor-General, or sent or from any Public Department at the Seat of Government at Ottawa, or to or from any member of the Legislature at the Seat of Government during the Session, or ten days before the meeting of Parliament. Letters on Her Majesty's Service passing between the United Kingdom and the Dominion of Canada to any of the Imperial Military Departments.

The registration fee on letters circulating in the Dominion, P. E. Island and Newfoundland, is 2 cents; on letters to the United States, 5 cents; and on those for the United Kingdom, 8 cents; for British Colonies, 25 cents; for France, and letters passing through France, an amount equal to the postage rate. The registration fee, together with the postage, should be pre-paid by postage stamp.

The object of registration is not to make the Postal Authorities responsible, but in order that a letter or package may be traced through various offices through which it passes, and when loss is sustained by the negligence or carelessness of any party through whose hands it has passed, such individual is bound to make good the amount or value of such package.

#### Parcel Post.

Parcels may be posted for circulation in the Dominion only, at the following rates, which must be paid in advance:—

Not exceeding 8 ounces 12½ cents; above 8 ounces and not exceeding 1 lb., 25 cents; above 1 lb. and not exceeding 1½ lbs., 37½ cents; above 1 lb. and not exceeding 2 lbs., 50 cents. Registration fee 5 cents.

No parcel to exceed 4 lbs. in weight. No letter must be enclosed. parcel shall contain anything liable to injure the mail. The size is limited to two feet in length, one foot in breadth or thickness. The postage must be pre-paid by stamp. Unpaid parcels will not be forwarded, but short paid parcels will be sent on with a fine of 12½ cents in addition to any postage that may remain unpaid.

#### Pattern and Sample Post.

Patterns or samples of merchandize may be transmitted within the Dominion at the rate of 1 cent per oz., pre-paid by postage stamp, and may be registered on payment of a fee of 5 cents. Short paid packages or samples will be fined 5 cents. No packet should exceed 24 ozs., or more than 24 inches in length, or 12 in depth, or breadth. No letter should be enclosed, or anything liable to injure the contents of the parcel. Parcels should be so made up that they may be easily examined by the officers of the Post Office.

#### Pattern and Sample Post with the United Kingdom, British Colonies, and Foreign Countries.

The following are the regulations for the transmission of Samples Patterns of merchandise between the Dominion of Canada and the United Kingdom:

1st. Samples of seeds, drugs, and similar articles for delivery in the United Kingdom, may be sent in bags entirely closed, provided such be transparent.

2nd. Scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, and such like articles, allowed to be forwarded by post as samples, to the United Kingdom, Germany, and Belgium, provided they be packed so as not to damage the mails and the officers of the Post Office. They must be so packed as to be easily examined. Any packet found to be insufficiently packed will not be forwarded.

#### Newspaper Post.

On newspapers published in the Dominion, the postage is, if paid quarterly in advance, either by the publisher or by the party to whom it is delivered:—

If not paid in advance, 1 cent each. The commuted rate applies not only to papers circulating within the Dominion, but also to subscribers in the United Kingdom, United States, Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island. All papers must be pre-paid before leaving Canada, not at the commuted rate, 1 cent each, but all transient newspapers, papers not from the publishers or British newspapers posted by regular agents to regular subscribers, must be pre-paid 2 cents each by postage stamps. Exchange papers pass free between publishers in Canada, also to and from those in the United States, Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland. Papers coming from England via the United States are charged 2 cents each on delivery; by Canadian mails free. Postage on papers from the United States to regular subscribers in Canada 1 cent; transient United States papers 2 cents. Papers from Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland may be delivered to regular subscribers at the ordinary commuted rate; transient papers, 2 cents each.

#### Canadian Book Post.

Books and Pamphlets addressed to any place in Canada, Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland, or the United States, must be prepaid 1 cent per oz. by postage stamps.

#### British Book Post.

Books may be sent by post between the Dominion of Canada and Great Britain by Canadian Mail Steamers, or by the Inman line, calling at Halifax, at the following rates, which must be pre-paid:—

Insufficiently paid books, if for Canada, Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland, or the United States, will be sent to the Dead Letter Office; but if for England they will be forwarded, marked with the unpaid postage and 3d. sterling as a fine.

#### Ship Letters.

Letters by private ship, from the United Kingdom, in *ship letter mail* cents, if addressed to the port of arrival, and to other places in the

Dominion, 5 cents. Loose ship letters from the United Kingdom, British Colonies, and Foreign countries, 4 cents. From places in the

Dominion, if addressed to the port of arrival, 4 cents; and to other places in the Dominion, 7 cents. The Postmaster General may make

such reasonable compensation, as he may see fit, to masters of vessels, being Post Office Packets, for each letter conveyed by such vessels

between places beyond the sea and the Dominion, and may direct that any port such vessels shall not be permitted by the Officers of Cus-

tomers to enter or break bulk until all letters have been delivered at the Post Office, nor until the master has made a declaration that he has

delivered all.

The Postmaster General has the exclusive privilege of transmitting letters within the Dominion; and (except in the cases hereinafter men-

tioned) any person collecting, sending, or delivering letters, incurs a penalty, not exceeding \$20, for each and every letter so conveyed or

held in his possession. Such penalty not to apply to, 1. Letters sent to a private friend, provided such letters be delivered by such friend to the party addressed; 2. Letters sent by a messenger on purpose, concerning the private affairs of the sender or receiver; 3. Commissions or

**SAMBRO ISLAND**—On the S. W. side of the entrance to Halifax harbor. A fixed white light, elevated 115 ft. above the sea, visible in clear weather from 20 to 25 miles. White Octagonal Building, Lat.  $44^{\circ} 26'$  N. Lon.  $63^{\circ} 35'$  W. A fog trumpet has been placed on Sambro Island, in operation during thick or foggy weather. Each blast of five seconds duration, with intervals of twenty seconds, audible 6 to 10 miles in calm weather. In case of accident to the trumpet, signal guns from ships will be answered by the discharge of two 24 pounders in succession.

### West from Halifax.

**PEGGY'S POINT**—East point of entrance to St. Margaret's Bay. A red light, about 65 feet above high water. Square White Building standing about 40 yards from the shore. Lat.  $44^{\circ} 29'$  N. Long.  $63^{\circ} 19'$  W.

**CHESTER LIGHT ON IRON BOUND ISLAND**—Entrance to Mahone Bay. Two fixed white lights, apart from each other 25 feet horizontally visible from sea from W. S. W. to N. E. elevated 50 feet above high water. Lat.  $44^{\circ} 26' 15''$  N. Long.  $64^{\circ} 4' 10''$  W.

**CROSS ISLAND**—Upon the S. E. point of the Island. Two lights placed vertically 44 feet apart, the lower light is fixed; the upper one flashing at intervals of a minute, visible 14 miles. Building red, Lantern painted black. Lat.  $44^{\circ} 19'$  N. Long.  $64^{\circ} 9'$  W.

**BATTERY POINT**—At the entrance of Lunenburg harbor. A fixed white light, visible 12 miles. White square building. This harbor is of access, spar buoys are placed in the bay and entrance to the harbor, on the Sculpin Rock, Haddock Shoal, Battery Point Shoal, and the lists of Red Shoal. In approaching the harbor from seaward the Buoy on the Sculpin Rock, painted red and black in horizontal stripes, may be left either hand, giving it a birth of two cable's length. The other buoys are painted black and must be left on the port hand going in.

**IRON-BOUND ISLAND**—Entrance to LaHave River. A bright flash of 20 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of 30 seconds. The lantern is on a square white tower, on the southern side of the island, 100 feet above sea level, visible from all points of approach.

**LOSER'S ISLAND**—West side of the entrance to LaHave River. A red light, on the S. E. point of the island. Square white building, 100 feet above sea level, standing 100 feet from the cliff. Lat.  $44^{\circ} 12'$  N. Lon.  $63^{\circ} 18'$  W.

**PORT MEDWAY HARBOUR**—On Admiralty Head, West side of the entrance to the port. Square white building, with a black square in the center of the seaward sides. A fixed white light, 44 feet above sea level, visible 10 miles. Spar buoys are placed in the channel to Port Medway, on the breaking ledges, Nautilus Rock, corner ground and edge rocks off Bangs' Point. In passing in from seaward the red buoys must be left on the starboard, and black buoys on the port hand.

**LIVERPOOL**—South end of Coffin's Island. A revolving light, appearing full at intervals of two minutes, 80 feet above sea level. Building octagonal, in red and white horizontal stripes, visible 16 miles.

**LORT POINT**—Entrance to the inner harbor of Liverpool. A white light, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the starboard hand when entering the harbor.

**TITTLE HOPE ISLAND**—Off Liverpool. A revolving red light, 40 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute.

Situate nearly in the centre of the island. Lat.  $43^{\circ} 48' 31''$  N. Long.  $64^{\circ} 47' 15''$  W. The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white.

**GULL ROCK**—Off the entrance to Ragged Island harbor. A white fixed light, 51 ft. above sea level. Square white building. Lat.  $43^{\circ} 37' 30''$  N. Long.  $64^{\circ} 66' W.$

**SHELBOURNE**—On the S. E. point of McNutt's Island, at the entrance of the harbor. Two white lights vertical—the upper light one 100 ft. above sea level, and visible 18 miles; the lower light 38 feet below the lantern at the top of the building, and visible 10 miles. Building painted black and white in vertical stripes.

**BARRINGTON**—On Baccaro Point, E. side of the entrance to the harbor. A revolving light, bright 15 seconds and dark 25 seconds, elevated 49 ft. visible 12 miles. Square white building, with a black ball on the seaward side.

**CAPE SABLE ISLAND**—A red fixed light. Octagonal white building. Lat.  $43^{\circ} 27' N.$  Long.  $65^{\circ} 36' W.$  High water at Cape Sable, full change, at  $7\frac{1}{2}$  o'clock. Spring tides rise 12 ft., neaps 6 ft.

**SEAL ISLAND**—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy, on the S. point of Seal Island. A fixed white light, 80 feet above high water, and may be seen when approaching, from any point of the compass, at the distance of 18 or 20 miles. Octagonal white building. Blonde Rock lies about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles S. by W. from the light house. Between this rock and the island there are some dangers; the ground rocky throughout and large vessels ought not to attempt passing between them.

**PUBNICO HARBOUR**—On the S. E. side of the entrance to the harbor, about 13 miles northerly of Cape Sable. A fixed white light, 28 ft. above high water, (rise and fall 12 feet.) Square white building, standing 50 fathoms from low water mark.

**FISH ISLAND**—On Big Fish Island, E. side of the entrance to Tacket River. Two fixed horizontal white lights, visible 12 miles.

**YARMOUTH**—On the island of Cape Forchu, West side of the entrance to the harbor. A bright revolving light, 145 ft. above sea level, visible quarter minute and invisible half a minute. Seen in clear weather 18 or 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. Lat.  $43^{\circ} 48' N.$  Long.  $66^{\circ} 09' W.$

**CAPE ST. MARY'S**—East side of entrance to St. Mary's Bay, Digby Co. A revolving light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, and showing alternately red and white faces, 100 ft. above high water. White octagonal building. Lat.  $44^{\circ} 04' N.$  Long.  $66^{\circ} 08' W.$

**BRIER ISLAND**—Situate on the western side. A fixed white light, 92 ft. above sea level, visible 15 miles. Octagonal white building.

**WESTPORT**—On Peter's Island, at the S. entrance of the E. side of the Bay of Fundy. Two white fixed lights, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island Light, 40 feet above high water, and visible 10 miles, and is intended to lead vessels into Westport through Grand Passage. Square white building.

**BOAR'S HEAD**—N. entrance Petite Passage, Bay of Fundy. Alternating flashes, red and white, at intervals of 60 seconds. Square white building.

**DIGBY GUT**—On Point Prim, at the entrance of the Gut. A white light, 76 ft. above high water, and visible 13 miles. Building square, painted red and white vertically.

**PORT WILLIAMS**—Two fixed white lights, 20 feet apart. perpendicularly, visible from fort Williams.

Long, visible from all points of approach. Square white building. Fort Williams is distant from Digby Gut Light E. 25 miles; and from Black Rock W. 28 miles.

MARGARETVILLE—*A red fixed light*, visible 10 miles from all points of approach. Building square, painted in white and black horizontal stripes. Margaretville is distant E. 37 miles from Digby Gut Light, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock Light.

BLACK ROCK—*A white fixed light*, 55 ft. above the level of high water, and visible 12 miles. Square white building.

SPENCER'S POINT—*A white fixed light* is placed on the top of a building at this point, on the northern shore of Cobequid Bay, near the head of Minas Basin.

PARRSBORO'—On the W. side of the entrance to Parrsboro' River. *fixed white light*, 30 ft. above high water, visible 9 miles. Octagonal white tower, standing close to high water mark on the beach.

HORTON BLUFF—*A white fixed light*, 95 ft. above high water level, rise and fall 40 to 45 ft.) visible in clear weather over the greater part of the Basin of Minas (after passing Cape Blomedon) and above the Five Islands and up to Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it. Square white building, standing 66 feet from the Bluff.

BURNT COAT HEAD—The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building. *A white fixed light*, 75 feet above high water level, and visible from all points of approach.

GANNET ROCK—The Gannet Rock is 66 feet above high water, and a light house upon it, painted black and white, in vertical stripes. *fixed white light* (visible 12 miles) lies S. W. by S. distant  $3\frac{1}{4}$  miles from the southern point of Three Islands, and S.S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. 7 miles from the S.W. head of the Grand Manan. A gun is fired to answer signals during a fog. There are a number of small ledges and sunken rocks about it, which are always breaking. The light stands conspicuously in the immediate vicinity of all the sunken rocks and dangers, extending from the old Proprietor to the Seal Islands of Machias, a distance of about 20 miles. Between the northernmost and southernmost of the Four Ledges there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them above water, and which extend westward from the light house about 4 miles. From this range farther westerly, about 6 miles, lies a dangerous breaker, called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping near three remarkable headlands, near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, about 10 miles.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND—S. W. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. from Grand Manan, the the Machias Islands. On the eastern island two light houses erected, showing fixed lights, distant from each other about 200 feet in the direction of E.S.E. and W.N.W., by which they are easily distinguished from all other lights on the coast. Elevated about 54 feet above high water, visible 15 miles. A gun is fired every four hours during a fog. Both buildings white.

GRAND MANAN ISLAND—On Swallow Tail Point, N. E. side of island. *A white fixed light*, 148 ft. above higher water, visible 17 miles. Building white, Lat.  $44^{\circ} 45' 22''$  N. Long.  $66^{\circ} 44' 4''$  W. This conspicuous mark in the S. Channel between Brier Island and Grand Manan.

LITTLE RIVER—On an island at the entrance of the River. *A fixed light*, varied by flashes every 90 seconds, 40 feet above high water, visible 11 miles.

**Wines, Liquors, Ales, Porter, Groceries, at the "Army and Navy Depot."**

**QUODDY HEAD**—On the S. E. side of Quoddy Head. *A fixed white light*, 133 feet above sea level, visible in clear weather 17 miles. It bears from the Southern point of Grand Manan N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. 13 miles, and from the Northern point of said island W.N.W. 7  $\frac{1}{4}$  miles. Has a fog trumpet.

**CAMPO BELLO**—On the N. E. extremity of the island. *A white fixed light*, 64 ft. above the sea, visible 15 miles. Building white with red cross. This light enables vessels to enter Head Harbor at all times. It is also a guide to vessels entering the main channel, to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner Bay of Passamaquoddy.

**POINT LE PREAU**—upon this projecting head land *two fixed white lights*, one above the other, distant 28 feet. The lower lantern is fixed to the outside of the building, and throws its light quite inshore, both to the eastward and westward into Mace's Bay. The highest light is 81 feet, visible 15 miles. Building red and white in horizontal stripes, 5 feet broad, and bears from the easternmost Wolves E. by N., 11 miles.

**ST. JOHN, N.B. HARBOUR**—On Partridge Island at the entrance of the River and harbor. *A white fixed light*, 120 feet above high water, and visible 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. Steam Whistle is sounded 10 seconds in every minute during fog and snow storms, audible 4 to 6 miles. There is also a *Bell Buoy* at the extremity of the ledge at the eastern end of the island, which is very useful to vessels in thick or rough weather. The bell can be heard 5 miles.

**QUACO HEAD**—On a small rock lying off Quaco Head. *A revolving white light*, 58 feet above high water, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute, visible 15 miles. Building red and white in horizontal stripes.

**CAPE ENRAGE**—On the point of that name in Westmorland near opposite Apple River Light in Cumberland. *A plain white light*, 110 feet above the sea, visible 15 miles. Square white building.

**GRINDSTONE ISLAND**—On Grindstone Island, Chignecto Bay. Lat. 45° 43' 13" N. Long. 64° 37' 25" W., 60 feet above high water. Octagonal white tower.

#### East from Halifax.

**EGG ISLAND**—Off Jeddore. *A revolving light*, 85 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, showing alternately red and white faces. Building octagonal, painted black and white in vertical stripes. Lat. 44° 39' 51" N. Long. 62° 51' 32" W.

**OUTER BEAVER, OR WILLIAMS'S ISLAND**—*A revolving white light*, 70 feet above sea level, visible 12 miles. Square white building with two black balls on its seaward side. A reef extends eastward from Beaver Island some distance. Lat. 44° 49' N., Long. 62° 21' W.

**WHITE HEAD ISLAND**—On the S. W. point of the Island. *A brief flash light* of 10 seconds duration followed by eclipses of 10 seconds displaying alternately 3 flashes and 3 eclipses in a minute. Square white tower, standing 75 fathoms from the water's edge, with an octagonal iron lantern, 60 feet above the sea level.

**CRANBERRY ISLAND**—(Cape Canso.) *Two white fixed lights*, placed vertically 12 yards apart; the upper 75 ft., the lower 45 ft., above high water, visible 15 and 9 miles respectively. Tower striped white and red horizontally. Lat. 45° 19' 49" N., Long. 60° 55' 29" W. A trumpet has been placed on Cranberry Island, in operation during thick or foggy weather. Each blast of five seconds duration, with intervals of 20 seconds, audible 6 to 10 miles.

**GUYSBOROUGH HARBOUR**—On the W. side of the entrance to the harbour, head of Chebucto Bay. *A fixed white light*, 30 feet above water, visible 8 miles. Lat.  $45^{\circ} 22' 47''$  N., Long.  $61^{\circ} 29' 11''$  W.

**DDY, OR SAND POINT**—(Gut of Canso). On the W. side of the entrance to the Strait of Canso. *Two horizontal fixed white lights*, 100 ft. apart, elevated 25 ft. each, visible 8 miles. Square white building with a black diamond on the seaward side.

**WEST SIDE GUT OF CANSO, NORTHERN ENTRANCE**—*A white fixed light*, 110 ft. above high water, visible 18 miles, or between Cape George and Port Hood. White tower standing 120 yards from the shore. Lat.  $45^{\circ} 41' 42''$  N.

**KOMKET ISLAND**—St. George's Bay, Antigonish Co. Standing on N. side, 50 yards from the E. end of the island. *A fixed red light*. Square white building, 50 ft. above high water. Lat.  $45^{\circ} 38' 3''$  N. Long.  $61^{\circ} 49' 7''$  W.

**CAPE ST. GEORGE**—On the N. side of the cape. *A revolving white light*, every half minute, visible 25 miles. 350 ft. above high water. Square white tower. Lat.  $45^{\circ} 52' 35''$  N. Long.  $61^{\circ} 55' 0''$  W.

**BIG CARIBOU ISLAND**—On the N. E. end of the island. *A white revolving light*, showing its greatest brilliancy every minute. Square white building, standing 130 ft. from the point, and about 35 ft. above high water. Lat.  $45^{\circ} 44'$  N. Long.  $62^{\circ} 46' 0''$  W.

**ICTOU ISLAND**—On the S. E. point of the island. *A white fixed light*, 52 ft. above sea level, visible 12 miles. Square white building.

**TATAMAGOUCHE ISLAND**—Off Tatamagouche harbour. *A fixed white light*. A lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white. Lat.  $45^{\circ} 49' 39''$  N. Long.  $63^{\circ} 9' 0''$  W.

**ICTOU HARBOUR**—On the S. point of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 65 feet above sea level, visible 12 miles. *A small light* is shown below the lantern. Building octagonal, in red and white vertical stripes.

**RICHAT**—On Marache Point, S. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 34 feet above high water, visible 8 miles. Square white building.

**GREEN ISLAND**—Near the S. E. end of Madame Island, off the town of Richat. *A fixed red light*, elevated 70 feet above high water. Lat.  $28' 51''$  N. Long.  $60^{\circ} 53' 40''$  W. The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white.

**LOUISBURGH**—On Lighthouse Point, N. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 85 ft. above high water, visible 16 miles. Square white building, with vertical black stripes.

**TATTARI ISLAND**—On the N. E. point of the island. *A revolving light*, visible 60 seconds and invisible 30 seconds, elevated 90 feet, 62° 21' 32" W. Building white. Lat.  $40^{\circ} 2' 13''$  N. Long.  $59^{\circ} 40' 0''$  W. The light should never be brought to bear to the eastward of S. E. or to the southward of S. S. W., nor approached nearer than 15 miles. Gun fired as signal, and a boat for assistance.

**FLINT ISLAND**—On Flint Island, E. coast of Cape Breton, between Granby and Point Gage, entrance to Cow Bay. Lat.  $46^{\circ} 11' 5''$  N. Long.  $59^{\circ} 47' 0''$  W. *A revolving light*, attaining its greatest brilliancy every 15 seconds, 65 feet above high water. Octagonal white building.

**SLOW POINT**—On the eastern side of the entrance to Sydney, C. B. Harbour. *A white fixed light* elevated 70 feet, visible 14 miles. Building red and white vertically.

**WATER BIRD ISLAND**—Between the entrance of the Great Bras d'Or,

and St. Ann's (E. coast of Cape Breton). *Alternate flashes of red and white at intervals of 60 seconds, elevated 77 ft., visible 14 miles.* Octagonal white building. Lat.  $46^{\circ} 25' N.$ , Long.  $60^{\circ} 25' 30'' W.$

**ST. PAUL'S ISLAND**—On the S. point of the island, Lat.  $47^{\circ} 11' N.$ , Long.  $60^{\circ} 9' 36'' E.$ , is an octagonal lighthouse, exhibiting a revolving white light every minute, elevated 140 ft., visible 20 miles on all bearings, except between S. S. E. southward to W. On a rock, 260 ft. from the end of the island, in Lat.  $47^{\circ} 13' 50'' N.$ , Long.  $60^{\circ} 8' 20'' E.$ , another similar building of the same height, showing a white fixed light, visible 20 miles, between N. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. northward to E.N.E. A gun is sounded during a fog, and a gun fired every 4 hours.

**MARGARIE, OR SEA WOLF ISLAND**—On the N. W. side of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Mabou and Ceticamp harbours, distant  $\frac{1}{2}$  miles from the main land. A white fixed light, near the centre and summit of the island, elevated 298 feet, visible 21 miles from all points of approach. Square white building.

**PORT HOOD**—A fixed light, shows red on the N. side, and white on the southward, elevated 54 feet, and visible 10 miles. Square tower. Lat.  $46^{\circ} N.$ , Long.  $61^{\circ} 31' 40'' W.$

**CAPE RACE**—(S. E. Point of Newfoundland.)—A revolving light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every half minute, elevated 100 feet, visible 17 miles. The S. E. face of the building is striped red and white vertically. Lat.  $46^{\circ} 31' 44'' N.$ , Long.  $53^{\circ} 7' 00'' W.$

1 Square Rigged Vessel, 2 balls close up, one on the outer halliard and one on the inner halliard.

2 Do, 1 ball hoisted on the outer halliard, and 1 close up on the inner halliard.

3 Do, 2 balls close up, one out and one in.

4 Do, 2 balls separated, and one close up on the inner halliard.

5 Do, a pendant of any colour on the outer halliard, and one ball close up inside.

6 Do, a pendant under a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball at the inner halliard close up.

Do, a pendant over a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball close up on the inner halliard.

7 Do, a pendant under two balls close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

8 Do, a pendant between two balls close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

9 Do, a flag of any colour close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

The above balls, &c., are hoisted on the east or west yard arm, according to the quarter the vessel first appears in.

When Sailing Vessels are reported from an Outpost, the following signals are made on the lower yard, now used exclusively for sailing vessels, as repeats:—

10 or a Square Rigged Vessel, two balls of a size, one at the outer, the other at the inner halliard, close up.

11 Ship, a large ball at the end of the yard, with a small one at the halliard.

Two lanterns, one red and the other white, are hoisted at night to denote a Steamer reported.

The red lantern is always shown at the end of the yard arm, and the white one at the inner halliard, E or W, according to the quarter the Steamer is reported in.

Numbers are indicated the same as on the lower yard.
