At ull these installations I wan aceompanied by the officers of the mid Loulge.

In conformity with a Resolution of the last Session of this Grand ke I appointed Bro. Hy. Waller, P.G.M., Grand Iustructor, to visit mony Lolge, No. 6, and instruct it in the secret work and advise it mally on the work of the Order. I submit herewith that officer's of on this mission.
On 19th February, 1884, I received a letter from the late D.D.G.M. jistrict No. 3, Bro. A. Galloway, informing me that Harmony Lodge, 6, had milawfully admitted a Brother as a member of that Lodge by Nit of carl, by a majority vote, ans that, athongh the Lodge had untified hy him of the illegality of such a course, it still persisted in ming the Brother as a member. To this communieation I replied (rinting out to Bro. Galloway the law as fomnd at pages 158-159 of te's Digest, "That persons who by no fanlt of their own are illegally

initiated, camnot be discharged from membership for that reason," and that if the Brother's name was placed on the Constitution of the Ladlye, he was entitled to all the rights and privileges enjoyed by other members of similar rank. I further informed the D.D.G.M., that if any brother felt agrieved at the action of the Lodge, the right of appeal was open to him.

The following gnestions were proponded to me by Bro. W. H Morton, D.D.G.M., of District No. 3, on the 25th April 188t ; my replie to the same are annexed thereto:--

Question 1 -... How many black balls are required to rejeef : cmadidate for membership ly deposit of eard.

Answen It takes three black bulls.
Question 2 Does artiole 3, see. 1, of the revised Constitution koum candidates for admission by card as well as for initiation.

Answar Yes, this article deals with both cases.
By a resolution of the last Session of this Gramd Lodge 1 mas directed to see that the laws in reference to the nse of umanthoriand rituals and text books, were strictly carried out. No such breach of the law has been brought under my notice, but I take this opportunity al appending for the information of the brotherhood in this jurisdictian



 posisession, or who shall in my way aid or abet in componsing or writion or printing, or exhibiting, or using in any publieation, or writing ar mbar device, purporting to be the unwritten work of Odd Fellowship, on at part, abhreviation or memorandum of such unwritten work, shall deemed guilty of comdnet grossly unbecoming an Odd Fellow and stall upon conviction, be expelled from the Order:"

In comection with this subject I am plensed to observe the ma desire evinced by the ofticers of the Subordinate Lodges to acpuire is perfect themselves in the work of the Order. In many jurisdictiag the flow work is performed hy teams specially selected and traing for its rendition. and this practice is stated to have met with gom suceress in making the new work popmar. Gramd Sire Garey, in

Imention this becanse it has been the impression in this in dietion that the obligations shonld be read.

I am of opinion that it cum, however, be grently strengthened and enhanced in value if each Lodge would appoint an aetive brother lor the especial purpose of working it upamongst its members. At present, this duty belongs to no one in particular, but if the claims of the Association were bronght to the notice of the members, I am conrimeed they would accord it a liberal support.

The Grand Secretary will give you a more detailed necomst of its working und present powition.

I very much regret having to bring to your notice, the fact, that the Br. Laws of Black Diamond Lodge, No. 5, and Harmony Lodge, No. 6, arrmot in accordance with the Constitntion of Subordinate Lodges ans wopted by this (Frand Lodge, in the matter of the reduction of Sick Benfitis to members after a contimons sickness of six months and twelve munths respectively. The By- Laws of Harmony Lodge, were approved of the Committee on Laws of Sulordinates last Session, as shown at pare siat of the Proceedings, but a copy was not retained in office for rderence, as it shonld have been. I have not communicated with the two Lodges concerned on this subject, partly becanse of the failure of the Committee to detect the error in the By-Laws of Harmony Lodge when snbmitted to them. in consequence of which this Grand Lodge has in a measure condoned the offence, but have preferred to submit the matter for your consideration and action, observing, that the Law should legeneral in its application, and these two Lodges must accept it, as well in the other Lodges in this jurisdiction, who have amended their ByLaws to conform to the Constitution.

As we libor under indisadvantage compared with other jurisdictions, in nut having a Representative to the Sovereign Grand Lodge, whose duty it would be to report the proceedings of that Grand Body, and thereby many important changes are not brought prominently before us, and may possibly escape notice, I think it would be advisable for the Grand Mister to include in his report anything of interest that occurs of the character above alluded to, so as to give it a wider circulation among our members.
'Tle Sovereign Grund Lodge met at Minueapolis on 15th September, 1R4. From the reports presented by the officers we learn that the Order made rapid strides of progress in the preceding year. The number ot frand Lodges was 54, an increase of 4 during the year, number of Subordinate Lodges 7703, in incrense of 189. Number of Lodge members blob,871, an increase of 11,875 . Total Relief paid \$2,015,832.52. Total Revenue $\$ 4,804,748.00$.
