Sable Island.— $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from east end. Latitude $43^{\circ} 48' 40''$ N.; longitude $56^{\circ} 46' 08''$ W. Octagonal, white and brown alternately. In thick and foggy weather and snow storms, a steam fog whistle 50 yards south of the Lighthouse is sounded three times in each minute, as follows:—First, a blast of three seconds; then another blast and interval of the same duration; and then a blast of three seconds, with an interval of forty-five seconds, to complete the minute. The whistle will probably be heard, in calm weather or with the wind, from 10 to 15 miles; in stormy weather or against the wind from 3 to 6 miles.

Sable Island (West end).—Lat. $43^{\circ} 57' 08''$ N.; lon. $60^{\circ} 48' 08''$ W.; Revolves in three minutes, showing three flashes at intervals of half a minute, then a cessation of light during $1\frac{1}{2}$ minute in each revolution. Wood, octagonal, white. In thick or foggy weather and snow storms, a steam fog whistle is sounded eight seconds in each minute, leaving an interval of 52 seconds between each blast. The whistle will probably be heard in calm weather or with the wind from 10 to 15 miles, and in stormy weather or against the wind from 3 to 6 miles.

Yarmouth Harbor.—On end of reef off southwest point of Bunker's Island, east side of entrance to harbor. Lat. $43^{\circ} 48' 30''$ N.; lat. $60^{\circ} 48' 45''$; with the lantern on a dwelling-house, built on a wooden pier, the whole forming a beacon. A red light, for the purpose of guiding vessels into the harbor. Visible from the southward between the bearings of N. E. by N. and N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. It can also be seen over Stanwood's Beach, when bearing from S. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. to S. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. but cannot be run for on these bearings, the only entrance to the harbor being through Yarmouth Sound and Round Cape East.

Cape Forchu Light.—On Cape Forchu, on the Western side of the entrance to Yarmouth (Nova Scotia), in lat. $43^{\circ} 39'$ N. long. $66^{\circ} 8'$ W. It exhibits a plain, revolving light—visible one minute and a quarter, and invisible half a minute. The building is painted white, and is elevated 235 feet above the level of the sea.

Brier Island.—Situate on the western side. A fixed white light, 92 feet above sea level, visible 15 miles. Octagonal white building. A Steam Fog Whistle on Whipple's Point, S. W. of light.

Westport.—On Peter's Island, at the S. entrance of the E. side of the Bay of Fundy. Two white fixed lights, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island Light, 40 feet above high water mark, visible ten miles, and is intended to lead vessels into Westport, or through Grand Passage. Square white building.

Boar's Head.—N. entrance Petite Passage, Bay of Fundy. Alternate Flashes, red and white, at intervals of 60 seconds. Square white building.

Digby Gut.—On Point Prim, at the entrance of the Gut. A fixed white light, 76 feet above high water, and visible 13 miles. Building square, painted red and white vertically. A Steam Fog Whistle on Point Prim, in thick or foggy weather sounds 8 seconds in each minute, making an interval of 52 seconds between each blast.

Port Williams.—Two fixed white lights, 20 feet apart, perpendicularly, visible from all points of approach. Square white building. Port Williams is distanced from Digby Gut Light E. 25 miles; and from Black Rock W. 23 miles.

Margaretville.—A red fixed light, visible 10 miles from all points of approach. Building square, painted in white and black horizontal stripes. Margaretville is distanced E. 37 miles from Digby Gut Light, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock Light.

Black Rock.—A white fixed light, 55 feet above the level of high water, and visible 12 miles. Square white building.

LIGHT HOUSES.

Apple River Light.—On Hetty Point, N. side entrance to the River, and three leagues to the eastward of Cape Chignecto. Two fixed horizontal lights, 40 feet above high water, visible 10 miles. Square white building.

Parraboro.—On the W. side of the entrance to Parraboro' River—a fixed white light, 30 feet above high water, visible 9 miles. Octagonal white tower, standing close to high water mark on the beach.

Horton Bluff.—A white fixed light, 95 feet above high water level (rise and fall 40 to 45 feet), visible in clear weather over the greater part of the Basin of Minas (after passing Cape Blomendon) and above the Five Islands and up to Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it. Square white building, standing 66 feet from the Bluff.

Gannet Rock Light.—This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands, off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. It is a light of the Fourth order, Holophotal system—fixed white light 45 seconds, eclipse 5½, flash 5½, eclipse 5½. The Light House is painted in stripes, vertical, black and white. A gun is fired to answer signals during a fog. Dangerous rocks extend four miles eastward of the Lighthouse.

Old Proprietor.—There has been a spindle erected on this rock with a cage on top; at a distance it looks like an old oak tree standing out of the water.

Bearings and Distance by Compass from the Gannet Rock Light House.

This Light bears from the Light House on Briar Island, N. N. W. ½ W., 22 miles.

From the Gannet Rock to the Old Proprietor, E. ½ S., distance 7 miles.

From the Gannet Rock to the Black Rock, off White Head Island, N. E. ½ E., 7 miles.

From the Gannet Rock to the South West Head of Grand Manan, N. N. W., 6½ miles.

From the Gannet Rock to the Northernmost of the Murr Ledges, N. W. ½ N., 2½ miles.

To the Southernmost of ditto, called St. Mary's Ledge, W. S. W. 2 miles.

From the Gannet Rock to Machias Seal Island, W. and by N., ½ N., 12 miles.

NOTE.—Between the Northernmost and Southernmost of the Murr Ledges, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and which extends Westward from the Light House about four miles; from this range, farther Westward, about six miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker, called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

From Briar Island Light to the Old Proprietor, N. and by W. ½ W., 18½ miles.

The Blonde Rock from the Southernmost point of the Cape Sable Seal Islands S. and by W., 3½ miles distant.

Burnt Coat Head.—The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building. A white fixed light, 75 feet above high water level, and visible from all points of approach.

Machias Seal Island Lights.—There are two fixed white lights upon the Machias Seal Islands, one elevated about forty-five feet above high water; the other a new tower, erected last season, fitted with a 3d Dioptric light, stands 69 feet above high water level, and visible from all points of approach for a distance of 25 miles in clear weather; and bear from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distance about 170 feet, by which circumstance of two Light Houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast (British or American.) Both the buildings are painted white. A fog whistle has been erected on the island, which will be sounded as follows each minute:—Two blasts of five seconds in each minute, with an interval of 25 seconds between each blast. The following are the bearings from them, viz:

Vessels standing to the Northward, between these Lights and the Gannet Rock should tack or haul off the moment they bring these Lights in one, as they will then not be more than three-fourths of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than five miles to the East of the Lights.

[It is recommended that the Ships' Compasses should be well compared and adjusted particularly in new ships, before they leave Partridge Island, as serious errors have frequently occurred from want of attention on this point; and as the variation in the Bay of Fundy is seventeen degrees Westerly, (or $1\frac{1}{2}$ points), it will be found by the latest published Admiralty Charts, that the course from Partridge Island down the Bay, South Channel, between the Old Proprietor and N. W. Ledge, is S. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.; but the course to be steered must depend on the direction of the wind on leaving Partridge Island.]

Head Harbor Light.—Next in order, after passing Grand Manan and the plain white light (American), on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbor Light.—This is placed on the North East extremity of Campobello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels also at all times to enter Head Harbor—it is a fixed white light. The building is painted white, with a red cross on it.

Point Le Preau Lights.—Upon this projecting head land, two lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distance 23 feet. Both lights may be seen from every point of the compass, where they may be useful—both are fixed, and white. The Light House is painted red and white, in stripes of five feet broad each, horizontally.

A Steam Fog Alarm has been placed in this Station, which will sound twice in each minute.

South West Wolf Island.—On south-east point of south-west island, Lat. 44d. 51m. 30s. N.; long. 66d. 41m. 10s. W. $1\frac{1}{2}$ min. between each flash. Can be seen in clear weather 17 to 22 miles. Lantern surmounts keeper's dwelling, which is a square wooden structure, painted white. Visible from all points of approach.

White Head, Bliss Harbor.—West of Bliss Island. Lat. 45d. 1m. 15s.; long. 66d. 51m. 0s. Can be seen 12 miles in clear weather. Square, wood, white. Red fixed light.

Campobello Island.—North point of Head Harbor. Lat. 44d. 57m. 30s. N.; long. 66d. 51m. 10s. W. Can be seen 15 miles in clear weather. Octagon, white, with red cross. Variation in 1869 $18\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W.

Midgie Bluff Light.—Lat. 45d. 6m. 53s. N.; long. 66d. 54m. 30s. W. The light is a fixed white one, elevated 130 feet above high water mark, and in clear weather should be seen at a distance of 15 miles from all points of approach. A bar extends E. N. E. from the Lighthouse, and vessels will have to keep off 130 fathoms to clear it at low water.

Eastern Sandbar Light, St. Andrews.—Lat. 45d. 3m. 45s. W.; long. 67d. 0m. 50s. W. The light is a fixed white one, and in clear weather can be seen from all points of the compass ten miles. The old lighthouse in St. Andrews harbor bears N. W. by W. $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile.

Saint Croix River Beacons.—The beacon on Spruce Point is in 45d. 11m. 21s. N.; long. 67d. 12m. 4s. W. That on Mark's Point is in lat. 45d. 10m. 2s. N.; long. 67d. 12m. 4s. W.

Beaver Harbor Light.—Lat. 45d. 3m. 45s. N.; long. 66d. 44m. 0s. W. The light is a fixed white one. There is a good anchorage between the light and the buoy E. by N. from it.

Port St. Andrews.—North point of entrance. Lat. 45d. 4m. 10s. N.; long. 67d. 2m. 50s. W. Can be seen 10 miles in clear weather. Octagon, white. Visible between the bearings of S. W. round S. to N. W. Variation in 1869 $17\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W.

Partridge Island Light.—This Light at the entrance of the River and Harbor of Saint John, having been established upwards of forty years, requires no particular notice, further than it is a fixed white light and that the Light House and Keeper's Dwelling are painted red and white, in vertical stripes. The Steam Whistle on this Island is sounded ten seconds in every minute during foggy or thick weather.

Beacon Light.—Within Partridge Island, and upon a Spit or Bar, which extends about half a mile S. E. off Sand Point, and which dries at two-third

Upon this Tower a Fourth Order Dioptric Light, visible ten miles, is established, which is eminently useful to the coasting trade of Saint John, and to all other vessels having pilots on board, as it enables them to enter the harbor at all hours of the night. ▲ fixed white light. The house is white and black, in stripes vertically.

Quaco.—A revolving *white* light is placed on a small rock off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. This light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. The Light House is painted white and red, in horizontal stripes.

Revolving Light, Cape Spencer, Bay of Fundy.—Lat. 45d. 12m. 30s. N.; Long. 65d. 54m. 0s. W. A revolving Red and White Light, elevated 207 feet above high water, showing red for 45 seconds, and White for 45 seconds, with an interval of 45 seconds between each appearance of the Light, and making a complete revolution in three minutes. In clear weather the Light should be seen at a distance of 20 miles. The Lighthouse is a square, white building, with a Tower erected on it, and is 27 feet in height from base to the centre of the Light, and 35 feet from base to the top of the Lantern. The illuminating apparatus is Catoptric. The Light will be visible between the bearings from E. S. E., round by South to W. N. W. The Light will serve as a guide for vessels entering Saint John Harbor, Partridge Island Light bearing by Compass N. W. by W. half W. Northerly, the distance being 6½ miles from Light to Light.

Cape Enrage Light.—On the point of that name, in Westmoreland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbour, N. S. A plain *white* light. The house is painted white, and is about 120 feet above tide mark. Light visible 13 miles. The Steam Whistle is 150 feet north-east of the Light House, and is sounded during thick weather, fog and snow storms, for eight seconds in each minute, with an interval of fifty-two seconds between each blast. The Whistle is heard in calm weather or with the wind at a distance of ten miles, and in stormy weather or against the wind from three to five miles, according to the state of the atmosphere.

West Quoddy Light.—This is an American Light, and is placed on the West side of the entrance into the St. Croix by Lubec and Eastport.

Grindstone Island Light.—An Octagonal Tower, 63 feet above the level of high water on Grindstone Island, in Chignecto Bay, in lat. 45d. 43m. 13s. N.; long. 64d. 37m. 25s. W. The Tower is painted white, as is also the Keeper's House, one story, situate about 50 feet to the Eastward of the Tower.

Bearings and distances of several places from the above Light House :

Cape Enrage Light, by compass, S. $61\frac{1}{2}$ W., 10 1-7 miles.

Highest Point of St. Mary's Ledge, by compass N. 40 W., 6-10 mile.

The point of low water off the Light House, by compass, S. 78 W., 2-10 mile.

Jones' Ledge, N. 10 W., 3-10 mile—it dries at low springs, and has about 2½ fathoms on it at half tide.

A Sand Bank, S. 15 W., 6-10 mile; it has $1\frac{3}{4}$ fathoms on its shoalest part at low water springs.

Grand Manan.—There is a Light House and Keeper's house at the "Swallow Tail," on the North Eastern part of the Island of Grand Manan, in the Bay of Fundy. The Light is 45 feet from Base to Deck; the point on which it stands is 103 feet above high water, making 148 feet elevation. This is a conspicuous mark in the South Channel between Briar Island and Grand Manan. Both houses are painted white. The Steam Whistle is on the extreme north-west Head of the Island, and is elevated 80 feet above high water. In thick weather fogs and snow-storms, it will be sounded so as to give three blasts, of four seconds duration, in each minute, with an interval of sixteen seconds between each blast.

Little River.—On an island at the entrance of the River. A fixed white light, varied by flashes every 90 seconds, 40 feet above high water, visible 11 miles.

Richibucto Head Light.—This is a fixed White Light, situated on Richibucto Head, Northumberland Strait, in the Gulf of Saint Lawrence. The light is placed at an elevation of 70 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 14 miles. The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses of the fourth order. The tower is square, about 50 feet from base to vane, painted white, and stands in lat. 46 deg. 33m. 40s. N.; long. 64 deg. 43m. 30s. W. of Greenwich.

Cape Jourmain, Straits of Northumberland.—Lat. 46d. 10m. 0s. N.; long. 63d. 51m. 0s. W.—Visible from all points of approach from S. E. around by N. to W. The Light House is an octagonal wooden pyramidal building, painted white, 40 feet high, elevated 72 feet above high water, and stands 66 feet from the extremity of the cliff. The Keeper's house, a one and a half story wooden building, painted white, is situated 50 feet to the westward of the Light House.

Goose Lake, Miscou Island, Bay des Chaleurs.—A revolving White Light, elevated 40 feet above high water, and shewing a flash every minute, is exhibited at this Light House, and is seen at a distance of upwards of 10 miles. The lighting apparatus has two faces, and makes a complete revolution every two minutes. The tower is a square wooden building, 23 feet high, with a dwelling attached, and painted white. The illuminating apparatus is catoptric.

Heron Island, Bay des Chaleurs.—This Light is a fixed White Light, elevated 66 feet above high water, is visible from all points seaward, and on clear weather is seen at a distance of 12 miles. The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, and painted white. The illuminating apparatus is catoptric.

Curaguet Island, Bay de Chaleur.—Square Tower on Keeper's dwelling.—White.

Miscou Fog Whistle.—A steam fog whistle has been erected on Miscou Island, at the entrance of the Bay of Chaleur. The whistle is sounded twice in each minute.

Shediac Beacon Lights.—Two lights on Point Duchene wharf, in the Harbor of Shediac. Lat. 46d. 14m. 20s. N.; long. 64d. 31m. 0s. W.

Point Escuminac Light.—This Light House is situated in Miramichi Bay, north latitude 47d. 4m. 30s.; west longitude, 64d. 50m. 30s. It is a fixed bright light, elevated 70 feet above high water. A Third Order French Dioptric lighting apparatus has been placed on this Tower, which is visible for twenty-five miles.

Miscou Island Light.—This Light House is situated on Birch Point, north latitude 48d. 1m. 0s.; west longitude, 64d. 30m. 0s. It is a fixed red light, elevated seventy-nine feet above high water.

Shediac Lights.—On Point Du Chene Wharf, in the summer, north latitude 46d. 14m. 20s.; west longitude 64d. 31m. 0s. It is a fixed White light.

Two Fixed White Beacon Lights on Shediac Island, visible ten miles.

Miramichi River.—Light House on Portage Island. Fixed White Light, elevated — feet above high water.

Two Beacon Lights on "Preston's Beach," about five miles above Escuminac Light. Two Beacon Lights at Oak Point. Two Beacon Lights at "Grants." All fixed white Lights. Visible ten miles.

POSTAGE.

All letters sent to any part of the Dominion or United States are liable to a uniform rate of three cents per half ounce, according to the following scale:—

- A Letter not exceeding half ounce in weight, 3 cts.
- A Letter exceeding half ounce, and not exceeding one ounce, 6 "
- A Letter exceeding one ounce, and not exceeding one ounce and a half, 9 "
- A Letter exceeding one ounce and a half, and not exceeding two ounces, 12 "
- A Letter exceeding two ounces, and not exceeding two ounces and a half, 15 "

And so on, adding three cents extra for every additional half ounce.

Postage on Drop Letters, one cent per half ounce, and must be prepaid.

Letters for the United States must be prepaid, or they will not be forwarded.

Letters posted for delivery within the Dominion, must be prepaid at least one rate of postage, otherwise they will not be forwarded.

On Packet Letters to and from the United Kingdom, prepaid, the scale of rates is as follows, via Halifax, Portland, Quebec, or New York:—

- A Letter not exceeding half ounce in weight, 5 cts.
- A Letter exceeding half ounce, and not exceeding one ounce, 10 "

And so on, adding five cents for every additional half ounce.

Letters for Newfoundland, six cents; Bermuda, six cents; West Indies, via Halifax, twelve cents.

All Letters should be prepaid by Postage Stamps.

Printed Books, Periodicals, and Pamphlets, under 5 lbs. in weight, can be forwarded by Post in the Dominion and to Newfoundland, at the rate of one cent per four ounces.

Transient Newspapers require to be prepaid, at the rate of one cent per four ounces. Dominion newspapers for subscribers require to be prepaid, one cent per pound, if sent from the office of publication.

Pamphlets, Periodicals, and Books, to pass at the above rates, must be sent without a cover, or in a cover open at the sides or ends.

No words or marks (except the name and address of the person to whom sent), shall be written on any Newspaper, Pamphlet, Book, Periodical, etc.

Book Postage to United Kingdom, under 1 oz., 2 cents; 1 to 2 oz., 4 cents; 2 to 4 oz., 6 cents; 4 ounces and under 8 ounces, 12 cents; 8 ounces and under 12 ounces, 18 cents; 12 ounces and under 16 ounces, 24 cents; 1 lb and under 1½ lb., 36 cents; 1½ lb to 2 lb., 48 cents.

Periodicals printed in Canada can be sent to United Kingdom for 2 cents.

REGISTRATION.—The system of registration is applicable to all descriptions of letters without distinction, whether they contain articles of value or not. It also applies to parcels. The charge, in addition to postage, is, for letters, 2 cents, to United States, 5 cents; parcels, 5 cents. to England, 8 cents.

PARCELS.—Parcels closed at the ends and sides can be sent by mail throughout the Dominion, at a rate of 12½ cents per half lb. The weight of each parcel is not to exceed 5 lbs., nor the size to exceed 2 feet in length or breadth, and 1 foot in thickness. The parcel must not contain any glass, liquid, or any substance liable to do injury to the mail, under the penalty of a forfeiture of the parcel if discovered. The parcel is not to contain any writing. Parcels must be prepaid by stamps. The sender, by writing his name on the outside, can have the parcel returned in case of failure to reach the person addressed.

Patterns and Samples under 8 ounces in weight can be sent to the United States on the prepayment by postage stamp of 8 cents.

POSTAGE STAMPS.—Postage stamps are provided at the respective values of ½, 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 10, 12½, and 15 cents; Registration stamps are also provided, of the value respectively of 2c., 5c., and 8c., each; all bearing as a device the effigy of Her Majesty.

Patterns and Samples are transmitted between the Dominion and the United Kingdom at the same rate as per book post. The pattern or sample must be open at the end or side, except in case of seeds, drugs, etc., which can be sent in closed transparent bags.

Persons remitting money should obtain a Money Order, as the Department is not responsible for the loss of a letter containing money; and in no case should a money letter be sent without registration. No notice is taken of any unregistered letter.

Letters for the British and Foreign West Indies, Cuba, Porto Rico, Mexico, Central America, South America, China, Japan, the Sandwich Islands, and the Australian Colonies, are forwarded daily via New York, if so addressed and prepaid.

Mail Steamers for the United Kingdom, leave Rimouski or Portland every Saturday; New York, Mondays, Tuesdays and Saturdays; Halifax, every alternate Tuesday. The Mail Steamer for Bermuda, leaves Halifax every fourth Monday. For Newfoundland, at periods announced from time to time.

The Commission charged upon Money Orders is as follows:—

For Local Orders, Orders on Offices in New Brunswick, Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia, P. E. Island, British Columbia, and Manitoba—not exceeding \$4, 2 cts.; namely, \$4, and not exceeding \$10, 5 cents; over \$10 and not exceeding \$20, 10 cents; over \$20 and not exceeding \$40, 20 cents; over \$40 and not exceeding \$60, 30 cents; over \$60 and not exceeding \$80, 40 cents; over \$80 and not exceeding \$100, 50 cents. No single order issued for a larger amount than \$100, but when a larger sum is required additional orders may be issued to embrace the amount required.

For Orders on Newfoundland—Up to £5, 25 cents. Over £5 and up to £10, 50 cents. Over £10 and up to £15, 75 cents. Over £15 and up to £20, \$1.

For Orders on the United Kingdom—Up to £2, 25 cents. Over £2 and up to £5, 50 cents. Over £5 and up to £7, 75 cents. Over £7 and up to £10, \$1.

For Orders on British India—Up to £2, 80 cents. Over £2 and up to £5, 60 cents. Over £5 and up to £7, 90 cents. Over £7 and up to £10, \$1.20.

For Orders on the United States—Up to \$20, 25 cents. Over \$20 and up to \$40, 50 cents. No single order granted for a larger sum than \$40, Canadian currency.

The person to whom an Order is payable, can have it paid to a second person by writing on it, "Pay to the order of _____ (the name of the second person to fill the blank), for value received."

Table for Fortelling the Weather.

This table and the accompanying remarks, are the result of many years actual observation; the whole being constructed on a due consideration of the attraction of the Sun and Moon, in their several positions respecting the Earth, and will, by simple inspection, show the observer what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the Moon into any of its quarters, and that so near the truth as to be seldom found to fail.

OBSERVATIONS.—The nearer the time of the Moon's change to noon or midnight, the more nearly will the result accord with the prediction.

The space for this calculation occupies from ten at night till two next morning.

The moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter, happening during six of the afternoon hours, i. e., from four to ten, may be followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the wind, as is noted in the table.

The Time Ball, on Reed's Point Wharf, St. John, N. B.,

Will be hoisted half its elevation each day (Sundays excepted) at fifteen minutes before 1 o'clock. At one minute before 1 o'clock it will be hoisted its full height; and at 1 o'clock, mean time, the Ball will be dropped. A Chronometer keeping correct Greenwich time, should then show 5h. 24m. 15s., and the difference between this and the time shown by a Chronometer, is the true error on Greenwich time at the moment. As the above hour of 1 o'clock, when the Ball drops, represents 5h. 24m. 15s. at Greenwich, the error of a Chronometer may be ascertained, no matter where the Ship is lying. Masters of vessels arriving at Saint John, should compare their Chronometers by the Time Ball, as it will enable them to get the sea rate, which frequently varies from harbor rates.
