

RECORD COMMISSION.

The following Resolution was passed by the House of Assembly of Nova Scotia on Thursday, the 30th April, 1857.

"That His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor be respectfully "requested to cause the Ancient Records and Documents illustrative "of the history and progress of Society in this Province to be examined, preserved and arranged, either for reference or publication as "the legislature may hereafter determine; and that this House will "provide for the same."

On the 29th May, following, Thomas B. Akins, of Halifax, Barristerat-Law, was appointed Commissioner to carry into effect the above resolution.

In the following year the Lieutenant-Governor was authorized by the House of Assembly "To procure from the State paper office in "London, as recommended by the Report of the Commissioner, copies "of any despatches or other documents that may be found necessary "to complete our files," and on the 4th April, 1859, by a further vote of the House, the Commissioner was empowered to procure from the Government of Canada copies of such papers in the Archives of that Province as related to the early history of Acadia.

On the 15th May, 1865, a Committee of the House of Assembly by their report of that date, recommended "The publication of a volume "of public documents, to be selected by the Commissioner of Records, "provided the selection be contained in a single octavo volume of "moderate size, and that such publication be proceeded with without "delay."

In January, 1869, a volume entitled "Selections from the Public Documents of the Province of Nova Scotia" was completed and published according to the foregoing resolution.

In 1877 about 360 volumes of Manuscripts had been selected, arranged, bound and rendered accessible to reference. Copious selections have since been made from papers in the British Museum. known as the Haldimand collection; also from the Carleton Dorchester collection in the Library of the Royal Institution of Great Britain relating chiefly to the Refugee Loyalists who came to Nova Scotia from New York in 1783 and 4. These, with further transcripts from the Public Record Office in London, and others lately made from the Archives of Massachusetts and from documents in the Library of the Seminary at Quebec relating to Acadia, together with the minutes of Council and Letter Books in the Secretary's office, and the Books of Registry of Grants in the Land office not numbered, have increased the collection to 535 volumes.

The Journals of the Legislative Council after 1783, will be found in the Legislative Council Chamber, under the care of the Clerk of the House. The Journals of the Legislative Council were not printed until about the year 1830.

The Journals of the House of Assembly, from 1758 to 1868, are complete, with the exception of one volume, and are in charge of the Clerk of the House. The first volume, from 1758 to 1760, is in manuscript.

The original Bills, in manuscript, which have passed the Legislature since 1758, are kept in the ante room of the Legislative Council, under the charge of the Clerk of Bills.

MISCELLANEOUS DOCUMENTS.
