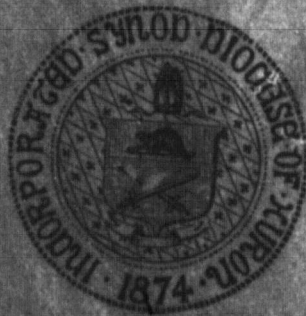

**INCORPORATED SYNOD of the DIOCESE OF HURON**

**TWENTY-THIRD SESSION,**

*(Being the Sixth under the Act of Incorporation of 1874.)*

**FIRST DAY.**

The Synod was convened at London, on Tuesday, June 15th, 1880.

Morning prayer was said in the Chapter House, commencing at 10 a.m.

The Ordination Service began at 11 a. m., when the Bishop admitted one candidate to the Diaconate, and advanced six Deacons to the Order of the Priesthood.

The Bishop of Saskatchewan, Bishop Alford and the Bishop of Michigan took part in the service.

The sermon was preached by the Bishop of Michigan, from St. John, x., 2.

The Holy Communion was administered by the Bishop to the Clergy, Lay Representatives and others.

The Synod assembled at 3 p. m., in the Chapter House.

The Lord Bishop in the Chair.

The customary prayers having been offered by the Bishop, the rolls of the Clergy and Lay Representatives were called by their respective Secretaries, when 75 Clergymen and 109 Lay Delegates answered to their names.

The balloting papers were in accordance with Canon XXX, distributed to the Clerical and Lay members, as their names were called.

**The Bishop's Address.**

His Lordship the Bishop then delivered his Annual Charge to the Synod, as follows:—

BELOVED BRETHREN:—

“Grace be unto you, and peace from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.”

Most thankful do I feel that in the gracious providence of God we are once more permitted to meet here in peace and in prosperity. You will readily understand me when I say that this privilege of greeting you once again in Synod assembled, in the name of our common Lord and Master, greatly tends to quicken my sense of interest towards you all, my brethren in the faith of Christ and in the ministry of His Gospel. May every one of us fully realize the power and influence of the Holy Ghost, whose presence among us we have invoked, and may that self-same spirit teach and enable us rightly to discharge our duties, as loyal members of this legislative body; may all our efforts and labors be in unison with the mind of Him, Who gave Himself for us, and Who left us an example that we should follow His steps: thus shall we bring forth the fruits of righteousness, which are by Jesus Christ, unto the glory and praise of God.

EPISCOPAL ACTS, ETC., ETC.

## OBITUARY.

The mournful duty devolves upon me to record the demise of five of our clerical brethren since we last met in Synod, viz.: the Revs. Canon Bettridge, F. Mack, F.G. Elliott, Canon Grasset and J. Smythe. I am sure I am only expressing the feelings of the members of this Synod, when I say that we deeply sympathize with the bereaved families of these our brethren, and that they have our prayers that the God of all comfort and grace may sustain them in their afflictions. "Blessed are the dead, which die in the Lord; even so, saith the Spirit, for they rest from their labors." It is also my sad duty to record the death of one of the oldest and most faithful lay members of our body, Mr. John Beard, of Woodstock. For many years he was a member of the Provincial as well as of our Diocesan Synod, and as Lay-Secretary of our Synod we have all learned to esteem and love him. He was a man of good common sense, deep convictions of duty, of unblemished integrity, devoted to the best interests of the Church, ever ready for active work in his Master's cause. His humble, steadfast trust in his Saviour, and love for Him were the power and grace of his Christian life. These gave tone and energy to his devotion. He has passed into rest, leaving a pure name and a pious example. No secondary praise is due to the memory of JOHN BEARD, whose useful life is an example to our lay brethren.

## LAY SECRETARY.

In accordance with the Constitution, I have appointed Mr. C. F. Complin to act, *ad interim*, as Lay Secretary. Mr. Complin kindly complied with my request, and is, I am confident, capable of proving a most efficient officer.

## EDUCATIONAL.

I do not think it possible that any intelligent Churchman can at this period fail to realize the valuable assistance our Church must derive from the possession of first-class educational institutions, in which our younger members will not only be instructed in all that is essential to a liberal and solid education, but also in the Protestant and Evangelical principles of our Reformed Church, which have exercised such a widely beneficent influence upon the Mother Country, and upon her vast Colonial possessions. In the words of one of our English prelates:—"If we are to have the position God has given us, then we must live up to the position, and bring forth fruits worthy of it, and we must work that out in all the different departments in which it can be worked out. For instance, we have a right to look to the Church of England as being the leader of thought in these difficult times. We have great advantages

"with regard to the great questions that are stirring men's minds. We have in the Church of England a higher order of education on the whole than any church in the world has; and we have a more highly educated ministry, and a highly educated laity. Then, I may say, that the Church of England ought to take part, and a leading part, in the matter to which I have just referred—*Education.*"

The different Christian Denominations are especially alive in this matter, and ministers and people alike are making remarkable efforts to build and endow higher educational institutions for the benefit of their respective bodies. In this they are wise; for beyond question, such institutions will do much to strengthen and perpetuate their various religious systems. This is a part of our duty to our beloved Church in this Western Canadian Diocese which demands our most earnest and practical consideration.

I acknowledge—and you will bear me witness—that it has ever been an object dear to my heart, that in this Diocese, where in God's good providence, my lot has been cast, the highest advantages in respect of sound Christian education should be extended as far as possible to all within its limits. And, certainly, even in respect of what has been already achieved, I cannot but feel that God's blessing has been and is with us, and that the institutions which we even at the present time possess, have been, and are, a great strength to our Church, and an incalculable benefit, not only to our own Diocese, but to many far beyond its borders.

#### HURON COLLEGE.

At this present time, not less than FIFTY of our working Clergy in this Diocese have received their theological training in Huron College; men to whose faithfulness, as able ministers of the New Testament, I rejoice to bear here my public testimony, and I feel most thankful to know that they are diligent, successful, and acceptable Pastors to the flocks severally committed to their charge; while others, who have also been trained in our Theological College, have been called to occupy prominent positions in other Dioceses.

#### WESTERN UNIVERSITY.

But in addition to what has already been effected in the past, most of you are familiar with the fact, that not only the College Staff and Alumni of Huron College, but very many members of our Church in this Diocese, are looking forward for the speedy establishment of our Western University.

When I publicly endorsed the University scheme, I well knew the grave difficulties which we should have to contend with in bringing it to a successful issue; but feeling the necessity and importance of the work, I felt confident that God would be with us, and that He would awaken the sympathy and co-operation of His people, both here and in the Motherland, to help us in this our great undertaking.

Notwithstanding the great commercial depression so extensively prevalent during the past few years, I feel thankful that I am enabled to report to you that the result of our efforts up to this present time proves to demonstration that God, even our own God, is owning and blessing the undertaking. We can set up our Ebenezer also, and say with Samuel of old: "Hitherto hath the Lord helped us."

The sums already subscribed both here and in England amount to no less than \$60,000!—no small amount to begin with (and that within so short a working period)—besides the promises of many English friends to subscribe for a period of not less than five years towards the maintenance of the professorial Staff, by which time we trust to secure endowments both for Scholarships and for the permanent support of the Professors of the University. To God alone we desire to give all the praise and glory.

My own purpose, I do not hesitate to say, is fixed and clear. "Having set my hand to the plough, I shall not look back." God helping me, I will leave nothing undone to bring to as speedy a completion as possible a work which I believe hereafter will be universally recognized as one of incalculable benefit to our Church and country.

If we may judge the future by the past—being already in possession of a charter with all the University powers—I do not see why in a very few years from this our Western University should not be in operation, with such a Staff of Professors from our British Universities as would inspire universal confidence and command every respect.

BISHOP ALFORD.

My Right Reverend friend and brother, Dr. Alford, late Bishop of Victoria, Hong Kong, fully sympathizing with us in all our efforts to advance higher Christian education and the extension of the Redeemer's Kingdom, has in the most generous and disinterested spirit, kindly tendered to me his brotherly assistance in all that concerns the well-being and progress of the work of Christ in our Diocese.

Need I say how gladly and gratefully I avail myself of his valuable assistance? Conscious as I have been in the past of

the need of just such assistance as Bishop Alford is so generously willing and able to supply, I cannot but recognize at this particular juncture of time the gracious and loving hand of our Heavenly Father in this, as in all the blessings which He has vouchsafed to us during my somewhat arduous Episcopate. I have, therefore, appointed Bishop Alford my Commissary, and licensed him as one of the Canons of our Huron Cathedral, which positions he has been pleased to accept without any charge whatsoever upon our Diocesan funds. He is one who will thoroughly identify himself with us in every good word and work, and commend himself to us as an experienced Christian scholar, as well as a faithful Bishop of our beloved Church, whose only motive in coming amongst us is to help forward the work of Christ in that portion of the Lord's Vineyard where he feels he can best employ the varied talents with which God has endowed him.

I feel sure you will accord to him a warm and brotherly welcome to the Diocese, and do all in your power, as clergy and people—more especially during my absence—to make him feel at home during his sojourn in our midst, whether of long or short duration. While Bishop Alford is amongst us, I shall, with greater satisfaction to myself, be able to devote a portion of my time to secure from friends on both sides of the Atlantic the necessary means to complete the work of our University.

#### DIOCESAN MISSIONARY AGENT.

In compliance with resolution XVIII., passed at the last session of Synod, the Standing Committee appointed the Rev. W. F. Campbell, Missionary Agent. During the short period that he has been engaged in this work, I am thankful to be able to say, that he has not only faithfully, diligently, and with acceptability attended to the duties of his office, but he has, under God, been most successful in his efforts to awaken a deeper interest in our Diocesan and Foreign Mission cause. His report shows fully and satisfactorily the extent of his labors, &c. I am thoroughly convinced that the Synod and Standing Committee, in adopting such an agency, have taken a step in the right direction. Mr. Campbell is eminently fitted for this work; his heart is in it, and the success which has thus far attended his efforts is, I trust, an earnest and pledge of greater things yet to come.

#### DIOCESAN INCOME.

It is with gratitude to God, and with unspeakable pleasure, that I am able to give you the cheering news, that our income this year exceeds that of every preceding one since the formation of this Diocese. The income has reached this year the sum of \$13,300.25,

being an increase of \$1,490.79 over that of last year. Need I say that to God, and to Him alone, is due all the praise and all the glory, Who so graciously inclined His people to devise liberal things, and Who causes us to triumph over every obstacle and perplexing difficulty.

MISSION FUND.

The receipt from voluntary contributions, directly available for missionary purposes, shows an increase of \$1626.79 as compared with last year. In view of this increase, I recommended to the Standing Committee to carry out *at once*, for the past year, the provision made in Canon XXIX., viz.: that "a Priest over five years' standing should in their discretion receive at least \$800 per annum, if the funds of the Synod will admit of it." With this recommendation, I am glad to say, the Committee unhesitatingly complied. And here I would say, beloved brethren of the clergy and laity, that I can see no difficulty in securing to every Missionary Clergyman a stipend of not less than \$1,000 per annum, if you will only put forth unitedly your prayerful and working efforts to increase the income of our Mission Fund. It rests entirely with you, under God, to bring about this desirable end.

DIOCESAN WORK.

Nearly ten years have now elapsed since, in the providence of God, I was called to the charge and oversight of this Diocese, and it is but natural that you should expect from me an account of my stewardship during that period; and how can I do this better than by furnishing you with a more detailed and full statement of the past and present condition of our Diocese?

First and above all, we desire to acknowledge with thankfulness the goodness of our God, Whose blessing upon our united efforts and labors has enabled us to carry forward and onward the work of God, so happily inaugurated by my revered and excellent predecessor, Bishop Cronyn.

It is my pleasing duty, at this time, to offer for your information and that of our Church members in general, a statistical statement of the present condition of the Diocese, as compared with that furnished by the printed returns in 1871, the year in which I assumed the charge of the Diocese.

SYNODICAL RECTORIES.

*Twelve* Parishes formerly dependent upon Mission Fund aid have been constituted Synodical Rectories.

This comparison gives an increase of *15 Parishes; 74 Churches; 37 Parsonages; 16 Mission Stations; 28 Clergymen, and 91 additional localities supplied with the ministrations of the Church.*

The number of Clergy employed in parochial work has been increased by 18, notwithstanding that we have had to deplore the loss of 18 by death; and we have at the present time 9 Clergymen on the Superannuation List, who, but for the aid they receive from our surplus Commutation Fund, would be left without any provision to meet their wants in their declining years. During my Episcopate I have ordained 53 Deacons and 53 Presbyters. I have received from other Dioceses 41 Clergymen, and 43 have left the Diocese, in which number are included the Bishops of Algoma and Toronto.

FINANCIAL POSITION.

Our financial position is equally encouraging. The income of our Diocese is partly derived from the interest of certain invested funds, and partly from voluntary contributions. The returns from the former source depend largely upon the care with which these trust funds are managed by the Standing Committee and its responsible officers. The receipts from voluntary sources are not controllable in the same way by legislation, but depend upon the personal and active interest of the Clergy and Laity; being subject also to fluctuation on account of the weather, crops, prices, commercial prosperity and many other contingencies which influence the general prosperity of the country from year to year.

It must afford unfeigned satisfaction, and call forth our humble and hearty thanks to our Heavenly Father, that both our income from invested funds and also the voluntary contributions from the members of the Church show a decided *increase* over previous years.

Turning first to our voluntary Diocesan income, we find the comparison as follows:

1871.	1880.
\$10,022.91.	\$13,300.25.

Giving thus an increase of \$3,277.34. There can be no doubt, had the country enjoyed general prosperity during the whole of this period, the increase would have been much larger than it is. During 1872 and 1873—years of great prosperity in the country—the Diocesan income steadily grew to a larger amount than ever before, the increase in 1873 being \$3,194.29 over that of 1871.

My revered predecessor on several occasions felt constrained to draw the attention of the Synod to the unsatisfactory state of the Mission Fund. In 1869 he addressed the Synod in the following language :

"I regret to find that the Missionary Fund is not in a satisfactory state. I have felt it necessary at my last ordination to warn the gentlemen who were ordained, that in consequence of the state of the Mission Fund, I could not promise them any support from the Church Society, and that they should enter upon their missions at their own risk. I intend to adopt the same plan with all whom I ordain, until our Mission Fund is in such a state that I shall feel myself warranted in holding out to Missionaries some certain prospect of remuneration from the funds of the Society."

As soon as I took charge of the Diocese and ascertained the unsatisfactory condition of our Diocesan funds, I felt constrained to issue an appeal to the Clergy and Laity of the Diocese, urging upon them the necessity for immediate action to place our funds upon a better basis, in the following words :

"I take this opportunity of further addressing you on a subject that I feel sure you will consider with me to be of vital importance to the very life and progress of the Church in this vast Diocese. For some time past we have all felt that the income of the Church Society is inadequate to maintain, as it ought, even the existing Missionary staff; much less are we able—owing to the *heavy debt* on the Mission Fund—to answer the increasing demands and wants of this rapidly growing Diocese. The salaries of the Clergy generally, and of the Missionary staff in particular, are so small, and in many instances so irregularly paid and unreliable, that there is just cause for uneasiness on this head also. While the expense of living has largely increased in every way, it is much to be deplored that the income of the Clergy has not been increased commensurate with their position, wants, and demands upon them. The claims upon the Widows' and Orphans' Fund have increased to such an extent that unless some speedy measures are taken to augment the same, there will be a very sad prospect for the widows and orphans of our Clergy. My mind has been much exercised how to remedy this state of things, and what measures and plans ought to be adopted to meet the emergencies before us.

"Of one thing I am certain, if our treasury is to be replenished and increased, by which the machinery of the Church Society can be set into active and successful operation, we must adopt a more systematic plan of working than is at present in use, by which to enlist the prayerful, active interest and co-operation of every individual member of the Church, and not rest satisfied until all, young and old, have been secured as regular quarterly or annual

This appeal was met, I am thankful to say, with a liberal response, as shown by the figures given above, viz., an increase from 1871 to 1873 of \$3,194.29. But, notwithstanding this increase, we found ourselves going every year more deeply into debt. Even in 1873—up to that time, the most prosperous year since the existence of the Diocese—we closed the books with a debt against our Mission Fund of \$3,352.53, which caused the late Secretary of the Church Society to wind up the Annual Report (1873) with the following remarks upon the state of the Mission Fund:—"The Committee regret being obliged to report a deficiency in the amount received for this, the most important branch of the Society's work. Compared with the previous year, the deficiency is over \$500; while the comparative expenditure of the same period shows an excess of nearly \$3,000. The Committee are, therefore, again compelled to bring before the Society the necessity of greater exertions being made to place the Mission Fund in a better position, otherwise the scale of grants made from this Fund must be reduced." (*Vide Church Society Report*, 1873.)

And but for the fact that the "Surplus Commutation" money was ultimately thrown again into its legitimate channel, the Mission Fund, for the benefit of the Missionary Clergy, we would by this time have been hopelessly in debt, if not in a bankrupt condition; many missionary parishes would have been deprived of the ministrations of the Church, which are now in the enjoyment of faithful Pastors, and the stipend of the Missionary Clergy—then inadequate for their support—would indeed have had to suffer a further reduction, or many of the missions to be closed.

Thank God, from such a calamity we have been saved; and God, even our own God, has blessed us and prospered our handiwork upon us.

For although this country since 1873 has passed through a period of unparalleled commercial depression, it is our privileged task, with gratitude to God, to record the steady growth and prosperity of our Diocesan work, as illustrated by the facts and figures which I have already mentioned, showing an increase in the number of Clergy; the extension of the Church's ministrations into many new fields; the erection of a large number of beautiful and costly churches and parsonages; the annually increasing contributions in aid of Foreign Missions; the growth of many mission fields into self-sustaining parishes; and, best of all, since 1874, we have not only kept our expenditure within the limits of our annual income, but have been able to wipe out the greater portion of that heavy debt, which had been incurred during previous years.

To show the progress the Church in this Diocese has made during my administration, I have caused tables to be prepared, giving the details of the voluntary Diocesan income during the last eighteen years (these tables will be found in the Appendix), which show an aggregate increase in voluntary contributions of \$34,547.51, for the period during which, in the providence of God, I have been at the head of this Diocese. While deeply conscious that we could and ought to have done more in this way to extend the Redeemer's Kingdom, I yet cannot consider this steady and liberal support of our Diocesan work, during a protracted period of financial stringency, otherwise than as a sign of active life amongst us, and a great cause of thankfulness to the Head of the Church, Who has so graciously inclined His people thus to show their sympathy with His cause. Nor am I insensible, beloved brethren of the clergy and laity, how much your hearty and zealous co-operation has accomplished in bringing about so cheering a result.

#### INVESTED FUNDS.

The total cash capital of the Synod Trust and Diocesan Funds in 1871 was \$522,465.60. The capital has since been largely increased, partly owing, of course, to the sale of lands which had been for many years totally unproductive, and this year I find it has reached the sum of \$665,898.57, being an increase of \$143,432.97.

It is only proper to state that in this amount are included various Trust Funds (as, for instance, the Episcopal, Rectorial, and Endowment Funds), which are by law limited to their specific objects, and therefore are not available for any other purposes. We have, I am thankful to say, the strongest and most incontestible evidence of the judicious manner in which our funds have been administered, as well as of the prosperity of our Diocese, in the fact, that the interest derived from all invested funds, both Trust and Diocesan, in 1871, was only \$27,418.34; whereas, our books, this year, show returns from these sources of \$44,513.13, being an increase in our income from invested capital of over \$17,000.00!

In connection with this fact, I have great pleasure in bearing my public testimony to the efficiency of our excellent Secretary-Treasurer, Mr. Reed, whose untiring energy, zeal and devoted ability in the discharge of his arduous duties have not a little contributed to secure such a gratifying result.

#### WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

On my accession to the Episcopate, the condition of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund was to me a source of great anxiety, although there were at that time only eight pensioners upon the fund. In the Pastoral, which I then felt it my duty to issue, I made the urgent appeal on its behalf which I have already quoted. I rejoice

to be able now to inform the Synod that the capital of this fund has nearly doubled during the last nine years—the increase being \$25,364.89! The importance of this augmented capital will be the more evident when we consider how the claims upon this fund have been increasing from year to year. At the present time *twenty* widows are receiving assistance from this fund, and it is truly gratifying to learn from the Standing Committee's report of this year, that we have not only paid their several claims in full, according to the provisions of the Canon, but have also been able to add \$1200 to the capital for investment, making a total invested capital of \$55,279.75. I sincerely trust that the object to which this fund is devoted will still command for it the generous and deserved support of all the members of our Church. I trust, the day is not distant, when, for the comfort of our Clergy, we may be enabled to make larger provision for the wants of their widows and orphans.

#### SUSTENTATION FUND.

This fund had its origin at our Synod in 1868, upon the suggestion of F. W. Thomas, Esq., a prominent and influential member of Synod, whilst he resided in this Diocese, and one who always took a deep interest in promoting the welfare of the Church. This suggestion met with the hearty approval and active support of our dear late Bishop, who spoke of the establishment of this fund, as "a work, the value of which cannot be over-estimated, and the beneficial effect of which upon the Church will be felt for all time to come."

I rejoice to say, that this fund has now reached the amount of \$49,117.98, all of which has been most judiciously invested; and the interest is applied from year to year towards the support of our Missionary Clergy. The value of such a reliable and permanent source of income for missionary purposes must be evident to all, and most gladly would I see it very largely increased for the benefit of our faithful and self-denying Missionaries.

#### STANDING COMMITTEE.

This detailed statement of our financial prosperity bears the best testimony to the faithful and judicious manner in which our Diocesan affairs have been managed by the "Standing Committee" of the Diocese, both before and since the late Church Society was by Act of our Provincial Legislature "united to and incorporated with" the Synod under its present title of "The Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Huron," a step by means of which all our congregations are now enabled, through their duly elected representatives, to share in the government and management of our Diocesan affairs.

So much, indeed, under God, does our prosperity as a Diocese depend upon the Standing Committee, elected annually by ballot at the meeting of Synod, that I do not hesitate to say, that the Synod merely exercises a due precaution in selecting for so responsible a position only those of its members who are not only qualified by their practical ability to deal with the various important matters which from time to time demand their most careful consideration, but who are also known to be loyal in their attachment to all that concerns the peace and prosperity of our beloved Church in this rapidly growing Diocese.

In the retrospect which we have thus taken of our Diocesan affairs, during my Episcopate from 1871 up to this period, we can gratefully re-echo the words addressed by the Apostle to the brethren he met at Appii Forum: "Thank God, and take courage." And although the difficulties attending our operations have at times been perplexing and very trying, yet, having looked upward for that wisdom from above which is promised to the prayer of faith, we have fully realized the precious promises: "Lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world;" and again, "No weapon that is formed against thee shall prosper, and every tongue that shall rise against thee in judgment thou shalt condemn;" and again, "If God be for us, who can be against us?"

We, therefore, implicitly trust for a continuance of every needed blessing from the Great Head of the Church, the entire glory of which we would still ascribe to Him, with whom alone is all counsel and sound wisdom and understanding and strength.

But while thus thankfully acknowledging the goodness of God in prospering our work in the past, yet I must here express my conviction that all our efforts yet made are inexpressably feeble, when compared with the object of winning souls for Christ, and with the means possessed by our people.

The members of the Church have to be awakened to a more enlarged view of the blessed privilege of extending the Gospel of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The prophetic direction to the Church is:—"Enlarge the place of thy tent, and let them stretch forth the curtains of thy habitations; spare not, lengthen thy cords and strengthen thy stakes."

There is no time to be lost; our own lives are swiftly passing away. The season of unparalleled advantage which we now enjoy is likewise rapidly passing away. Let, therefore, every true follower of Christ adopt the spirit of the Master's declaration:—"I must work the works of Him that sent me while it is day, the night cometh when no man can work."

PRAYER.

Oh that my voice might reach the most distant Christian people to pour forth their unceasing supplication to Him who heareth and answereth prayers for the outpouring of His Spirit on them and on the Church throughout the world. At this time, while we are assembled to legislate how best to advance the Kingdom of our Lord, let us resolve that we will fervently and constantly pray for His great blessing. To the end of life let us pray on in faith; with unwearied perseverance let us pray till the Spirit of God be poured upon us in the plenitude of His richest grace. Thus praying to God in downright earnest, we shall yet see all that we desire accomplished, and God, even our own God, "shall bless us and prosper the work of our hands, yea, prosper our handiwork upon us."

In the last three cases, the Constitution provides that 51 votes are required for two delegates.

Duff, who was duly elected, be allowed to take his seat, and that Mr. Jasper Golden, the delegate at last year's Synod for Kingsville, be allowed the same, and that Mr. Solon C. Martin, the delegate for Beechville for last year, be also allowed to take his seat, as there was no election of delegates this year.

We, the undersigned Lay Delegates to the Synod of the Diocese of Huron from Trinity Church and St. George's Church, in the Township of London, give notice, that we claim, on behalf of the said churches, that they are entitled to share in the proceeds of the sale of the glebe of St. Paul's Church, London, after deducting the expenses of management and the \$3000 per annum payable to the Rector of St. Paul's Church, under the provisions of the Rectory Land Sales Act, 1866 ; and we hereby require of the said Synod that they shall, under the provisions of the said Act, assign to the said two churches their respective shares in the income arising from the sale of the said glebe.

5.—The institution of new schools in small parishes and rural districts that are now destitute of schools.

Books can be obtained at any time during office hours. A review of the transactions of the Depository during the past 4 years shews the number of books put in circulation in the Diocese through this medium to have been over 25,000. The expenses of the Depository have been but slight; the greater part of the work of filling orders having been voluntarily performed by the Secretary-Treasurer, Mr. E. B. Reed. Your Committee respectfully request permission to obtain a supply of tracts of the S. P. C. K. for gratuitous distribution.

Your Committee, after considerable correspondence to obtain information as to the best scheme of Sunday School Lessons, beg leave to recommend that of the Church of England Sunday School Institute, of London, England.

4. Canon on the Mission Fund, and providing for the support of children of Missionary Clergymen.

Whereas it is expedient and highly desirable that some Diocesan provision should be made for the payment of allowances for the children of the Missionary Clergymen, be it therefore resolved that clause No. 1 of Canon 29, "On the expenditure of the Mission Fund," be repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:

#### SCALE PROPOSED FOR INCOME OF MISSIONARY CLERGYMEN.

Grants shall be made from this fund so as to raise the stipend from all sources, including the Parish assessments or Churchwardens' subscriptions, for a Deacon to at least \$600 per annum, and for a Priest to at least \$700 per annum, and a house or its equivalent (\$100.)

Whenever the state of the funds will admit of it an annual allowance of \$30 shall be granted for each child under the age of 18 years, duly entitled as hereinafter provided.

If, after the payment of the ordinary grants, and the children's allowance, the state of the fund admit of it, the annual grant to Priests of over five years' standing may, in the discretion of the Standing Committee, be increased to \$800.

Only Missionary and superannuated Clergymen in Priest's orders shall be entitled to the allowance for children.

Such allowance shall not be granted for adopted or step-children.

Every clergyman entitled to allowance for children shall on the first day of March in each year forward to the Sec.-Treas. of Synod a statement, to be signed by himself and his Rural Dean, (printed forms to be furnished by the Synod) of the number, names, age and date of birth of his children for whom he claims allowance, and payment for that financial year shall only be made for those children then on that list and those who being entitled to have ranked on the fund have died during the year.

The children of superannuated clergymen in Priests' orders shall be entitled to the same allowance as if their father was in active missionary service.

The Sec.-Treas of Synod shall, at the meeting of the Standing Committee in June in each year, submit a report of the state of the Mission Fund for the financial year ending the 31st day of March previous, and giving the names of those clergymen entitled to the allowance for children and additional grants, with the amount of their claims, and the Committee shall then distribute the amount for the year past in accordance with this Canon.

In case the amount at the disposal of the Committee shall not be sufficient to pay the children's allowance in full, the amount shall be distributed *pro rata*, and after payment in full of the children's allowance the balance at the disposal of the Committee shall, in their discretion, be applied in payment of the additional grant to clergy of over five years' standing in Priests' orders, either in full or *pro rata*, as the state of the fund will permit.

Clergymen not forwarding the required certificate at the proper time to the Sec.-Treas., or omitting to make the collections for the Mission Fund, as required by the Synod, will forfeit their claim to the children's allowance for that year.

On motion, this proposed Canon was taken up clause by clause.

Clause No. 1 was carried without amendment.

2. The grants from the Mission Fund shall be made on the following basis:—

CLASS I.—To all Clergymen in charge of a parish or mission of over fifteen years of active service in this Diocese, a grant of \$400 a year, or such portion of \$400 as will make, including the parochial assessment, a stipend of \$1,200 a year.

CLASS II.—To all such Clergymen of eight years, and under fifteen years, of active service in this Diocese, a grant of \$300 a year, or such portion of \$300 as will, as above, make a stipend of \$1,000 a year.

CLASS III.—To all such Clergymen of four years, and under eight years, of active service in this Diocese, a grant of \$200 a year, or such portion of \$200 as will, as above, make a stipend of \$800 a year.

CLASS IV.—To all such Clergymen of under four years active service in this Diocese, a grant of \$200 a year, or such portion of \$200 as will, as above, make a stipend of \$600 a year.

II.—The sum named in each of the above classes shall be the maximum grant to any Clergyman, except in case of travelling missionaries, or for new missions where it may be necessary for a time to pay the whole, or the greater part, of the stipend from the Mission Fund; and the order of precedence in making grants shall be as herein arranged, beginning with those of longest standing in the Diocese.

III.—An outfit grant of \$100 (if the state of the Fund will permit) shall be given to newly ordained Clergymen, and to Clergymen joining the Diocese, on being appointed to a parish or mission, if the assessment of such parish or mission is not over \$600.

IV.—It shall be the duty of the Standing Committee to assess the parishes and missions in the Diocese, by naming a fixed annual amount which each parish or mission shall be expected to pay towards the Clergyman's stipend. The said assessments shall continue in force for three years; and the amount of the grant to each parish or mission shall be regulated by the assessment, and the length of service in the Diocese of the Incumbent of the parish or mission.

V.—A report of the amount of stipend received from the parish shall be made every third year by all Clergymen receiving grants from the Mission Fund (according to a given form) before the first day of May, for the year ending with the previous Easter. Such reports shall be referred to a sub-committee (said sub-committee shall be appointed by the Standing Committee at the previous March meeting), who shall arrange the proposed scale of assessments for the next three years, and report to the Standing Committee at the June meeting.

Any Clergyman who shall fail to report, as herein required, shall forfeit his grant from the Mission Fund for that year, unless he shall show good cause to the Standing Committee, at the meeting in June, why such report was not made.

VI.—The Standing Committee shall lay before the Synod, at the annual meeting in June, every third year, the Mission Fund pay list of the Diocese as arranged for the three years, dating from the previous first day of April, showing the assessment laid on each parish, and the grant proposed to be paid to each Clergyman; and, at the annual session of the Synod in the intervening years, they shall report any changes or additions made in or to the said pay list.

Any Clergyman, or parish, feeling in any way aggrieved with the said list,

may appeal to the Standing Committee at the September meeting, and the Standing Committee shall have full power to deal with all such objections.

The debate on this amendment was continued during the afternoon.

#### **Fraternal Greeting.**

The Clerical Secretary read a telegram from the Bishop of Montreal, returning the greetings of the Montreal Synod, now in session.

The Bishop adjourned the Synod at 6 o'clock, to meet for evening session at 7:30 o'clock.

Whenever a vacancy occurs the Synod shall be assembled as directed by the Constitution, and proceed in manner following:

**1. NOMINATION.**

Every Clergyman of over ten years in Priests' orders shall have the right, if he so desires, to nominate a clergyman, who is of not less than fifteen years in Priests' orders.

Said nominations shall be made by calling out the name, writing it on a card, and by handing said card to the Chairman.

**2. POSTING THE NAMES.**

When all the nominations are made, the Chairman shall direct the Secretaries to write the said names in a plain hand on a sheet of paper, and to post the same in a conspicuous place in view of the members of the Synod.

## 3. BALLOT.

The Synod shall then proceed to ballot, by each member placing not more than two of such names at one time on the ballot paper. Should only one name obtain a majority of both orders, or should no name obtain such majorities, the Synod shall continue to ballot until another name obtains the required votes, or until two of such names obtain a majority of both orders, as the case may be.

## 4. PREPARE FOR CASTING THE LOT.

When any two of such names shall have received a majority of both orders, the Chairman shall direct the Secretaries to write the said names on two separate pieces of paper of equal size—one name on each paper—and to fold them up in the same way, and to put them in a box (which shall be provided for this purpose), and to set the box on the table before the Chairman.

## 5. PRAYER.

The Chairman shall then call upon the members of the Synod to fall down upon their knees, and he shall reverently offer up the following prayer :

O Lord, who knowest the hearts of all men, shew whether of these two Thou hast chosen that he may become Bishop (or coadjutor Bishop) of this Diocese. We ask this in the name and for the sake of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

## 6. CASTING THE LOT.

All rising from their knees, the Chairman shall direct the members of the Synod to take their seats, and shall then call upon some member to come forward to the table.

The member whose name is called shall rise and go forward, and stand before the chair in full view of the members of the Synod.

The Bishop then arose to dismiss the Synod. He could not find words adequate to express his grateful and heartfelt thanks to the members before him, for the manner in which they had helped him to conduct the business of the largest Synod ever convened within the Chapter House walls. He felt deeply thankful to see so many Clerical and Lay Delegates meet together for legislation in the best interests of the Diocese, and to assist him in carrying on the Church's work; and above all his heart was full of gratitude to Almighty God for the gracious manner in which the Church had been blessed, and for maintaining the peace and harmony that had always characterized the Diocese of Huron. (Applause.) There had been considerable animation in the discussions, but on the whole they had been conducted as temperately as could be expected in so large an assemblage. God had heard their prayers. He had already alluded to the great temporal blessings of the Church, but above these he was more deeply gratified to know that the spiritual interests were progressing most encouragingly. Ministers, although imperfectly paid, were laboring on with a Christian hope for reward in Heaven. To his lay brethren, he would say, that their manifestation of friendship had awakened a deeper gratitude than he was able to express. As he went from place to place, their

beaming faces and encouraging words had greatly strengthened his hands and cheered him on in his work. Notwithstanding the three days of constant attendance at the Synod, he left it feeling physically and, he trusted he might say, mentally strengthened. (Applause.) He hoped that in returning to their parishes the clergymen would continue to be examples to their flock; and by all he hoped that charity would be exercised, which left no room for discord. He trusted that if, in the Providence of God, they were permitted to meet again in Synod, they would do so in the fulness of the Gospel of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

The Bishop then pronounced the benediction, and adjourned the Synod at 12:30 p. m.

## Annual Diocesan Missionary Meeting.

The Annual Missionary Meeting in connection with the Synod of the Diocese of Huron was held in St. Paul's Church, London, on Wednesday evening, June 16, 1880, at 8 p. m.

His Lordship the Bishop of Huron in the Chair.

On the platform were seated the Right Rev. Bishops McLean and Alford, Very Rev. Dean Boomer, Ven. Archdeacon Elwood, Rev. Canons Mulholland and Innes, and His Honor Judge Davis.

The meeting was opened by singing "Onward, Christian Soldiers." After which, prayer was offered by Rev. Canon Innes.

His Lordship the Bishop of Huron said, that the great Commission, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the Gospel to every creature," was as binding to-day as it was nineteen centuries ago, and the same zeal should be displayed now as was manifested by the first Apostles and Martyrs. He expressed his pleasure at being supported by Bishops McLean and Alford, to whom he would leave the discussion of the foreign missionary field. With reference to home work, his heart was full of thankfulness for what God had done for the Church in the Diocese of Huron. He referred to the large increase of missionary income during the past year of \$1,626.79. God had owned, blessed and prospered this work, and the result gave His Lordship not merely mental strength, but physical strength also, and all must feel that they can go on prospering, and to prosper with greater courage than ever before. The material progress of the Diocese during the past nine years speaks for itself of the exertions of both clergy and laity throughout the whole field. He referred to the present unprecedented financial condition of the Diocese, and said, "Who will say that God is not blessing us?" Let there never a murmur escape our lips; but rather let our hearts overflow with gratitude and our lips with thanksgivings to Him Who gave His own Son, and with Him also gives us all things. He earnestly appealed to the laity to continue their generous support to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, which had always had their ready sympathy. This Fund, he said, had almost doubled during nine years. But what cheered him most of all was the spiritual life and activity so evident in every quarter: for in every parish the Gospel is faithfully preached. During the past year he had confirmed 1776, which was a noble evidence of fruitful and successful pastoral work. The laity, too, was alive to their privileges and responsibilities. Then let us take courage, and look up to God, and we would see greater things.

The Bishop then introduced the Right Rev. Bishop Alford.

Bishop Alford had listened with pleasure to the cheering accounts of Diocesan progress, but he would speak on the subject of Foreign Missions. The field was a wide one, for it embraced the whole world. In connection with the

Church of England there were great missionary organizations who encircled the world in their arms. He spoke of the Christian Knowledge Society, the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, the Colonial and Continental Society, the British and Foreign Bible Society, and lastly, the Church Missions Society. He made brief allusion to mission work in western and eastern Africa, and also in the interior of that mysterious Continent. He had seen four native Chiefs from Central Africa upon the platform in Exeter Hall at a great annual meeting of the Church Missionary Society. He spoke also of missionary success among the millions of India. But the work there is vastly in arrears, one missionary to one million being something like the proportion at the present time; but the work is going on, and many native missionaries are being raised up. A very entertaining account was then given of missionary work in China and Japan, over which he had been Bishop for four years. He described China as a wonderful country—wonderful in the population of its great cities. The territory of the Northwest of the Dominion had 80,000 heathens; but the population of China was 450,000,000. It consisted of eighteen provinces, each as large as England. Canton, Foochow, and other cities, had millions of inhabitants. Peking is the most densely populated city in the world. This immense Empire is all governed from Peking. British rights are respected. Hong-Kong is a British Colony, and in that little island one feels as much at home as in any place in England itself. The principal city is Victoria, with a population of 100,000. The Bishop concluded a very effective speech by a detailed account of the various mission fields in China.

The anthem, "Ascribe unto the Lord," (*Travers*), was then sung by the choir of St. Paul's Church.

The Chairman then introduced His Honor Judge Davis.

Judge Davis considered it his duty to appear upon the platform as an evidence of his interest in the great missionary cause. It is every man's duty to help any and every movement which aims at ameliorating the condition of society, and no movement is equal to the Christian movement to accomplish this object. Banish Christianity, and what would we have ere long? We would go back to the dark ages, and in two or three centuries fall back into heathen degradation. Nothing has such a civilizing effect—nothing has such a social effect as the wonderful story of the Gospel. In this age of upheaval, of inquiry, and of scepticism, every good and true man should buckle on the armor; Christians should be decided. We want not opinions only; but overt acts. Christianity is gaining ground. Christian scholars are meeting sceptics on their own chosen ground of science, and taking from them fortress after fortress. This statement was eloquently illustrated by references to Germany and England. In conclusion, he felt that the Diocese of Huron was safe in Bishop Hellmuth's hands, and that nothing but a sound Protestantism will be fostered under his administration, and all must pray that His Lordship may be long spared to continue to lead and strengthen this noble work.

The choir gave the anthem, "Plead Thou my Cause," (*Mosart*).

The Chairman then introduced the Lord Bishop of Saskatchewan.

Bishop McLean must first relieve himself of one thought which had been uppermost in his mind for the last two days—thankfulness to Almighty God for His great goodness vouchsafed to the Diocese, as set forth in the Bishop's masterly Synod address by the irresistible logic of facts. He spoke of the financial prosperity of the Synod, of its singular unanimity and good feeling, and of its justly celebrated educational advantages. He paid a tribute to Huron College,



and predicted success for the Western University. If the Bishop of Huron failed in this, he could only say, after knowing his work for more than 20 years, it would be his first failure. As to mission work—How do we translate Christ's Command? By the acts of the Apostles. They went from one city to another. Each place where the Gospel is preached is to be a centre from which light shall radiate in all directions. Mission zeal is necessary to the well-being of the Church. It is a great principle that there is nothing grand or great which does preserve its grandeur by what it imparts. He illustrated by the contrast between a beneficent running stream and a stagnant pool. What is the difference? One is doing good, the other is doing no good. So it will be with Synods and Churches, unless they impart to others they will not prosper. His Lordship dwelt at length upon the condition of the Diocese of Saskatchewan, and eloquently pressed its pre-eminent claim upon the sympathies of the Canadian Church, and personally thanked the Synod of Huron for the generous assistance they had already given to him in his work in that interesting and important Mission-field.

Hymn No. 116, "Hills of the North Rejoice," was then sung, and a collection taken up in aid of the Mission Fund of the Diocese.

The Bishop pronounced the Benediction and the meeting was closed.

**THE FINANCIAL REPORT**  
—OF THE—  
**STANDING COMMITTEE of the INCORPORATED SYNOD of the DIOCESE of HURON**

For the Year Ending March 31, 1880.

*(Being the Sixth under the Synod Act of Incorporation.)*

It is with earnest and heartfelt gratitude to Almighty God that the Committee present their Annual Report, and call the attention of the members of the Synod to the large increase to our missionary funds during the past year, and this they feel that they are warranted in looking upon as an indication that His special blessing has been vouchsafed to the Diocese.

DIOCESAN INCOME.

The income of the past year derived from the voluntary contributions of the Diocese amounted to \$13,300.25, an increase of \$1,490.79 over last year's income, and being the largest amount ever yet received since the formation of the Diocese.

This gratifying result of our labors bespeaks most surely a growing interest in the work of the Diocese in the hearts of our people, and affords the more reason for gratitude to God, when we consider the unusual weather that prevailed during the year, and especially during the winter, when the absence of sleighing and the impassable condition of the roads prevented the usual facilities that are afforded for business and commerce, and very materially effected and interfered with our missionary meetings and collections.

GENERAL PURPOSES FUND.

The amount received from annual subscriptions and Parochial Association collections was \$6,175.71, being an increase of \$1,028.90, as compared with last year.

Grants amounting to \$195.19 were made for Sunday School supplies, and the Committee were enabled to transfer the sum of \$4,427.20 to the Mission Fund. The Committee have also reserved the sum of \$1,200, to be appropriated towards payment of the Mission Fund Debt, when authorized by the Synod; and they strongly recommend to the Synod that the amendment to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund Canon, relating to this matter, be enforced, in accordance with the motion of which the Sec. Treas. has given notice.

MISSION FUND.

The amount received for this Fund was \$3,619.87, being an increase of \$597.89 over last year. The appointment of a Missionary Deputation Agent, in accordance with the resolution passed at the last session of the Synod, has, the Committee are gratified to be able to report, been productive of most excellent results, both as regards the financial aspect and the large amount of interest and zeal that has been aroused among the Laity in missionary work both Foreign and Diocesan.

This clearly is evidenced by the large addition this year to the Parochial Association and Mission Fund collections, the receipts showing a total increase of \$1,626.76 directly available for Missionary purposes. 208 meetings were held, the largest number hitherto, and the collections amounted to \$1,217.61, being \$311.50 in excess of last year, while the expenses of the deputations were \$24.88

It must be remembered, moreover, that inasmuch as the Missionary Agent only commenced his work in October last, he was of course only able to visit about two-thirds of the Diocese before the 31st of March, the close of the financial year, and that the remainder had to be provided with meetings under the old deputation system, and hence the reduction in the expenses is not nearly so much as can be effected in the future.

The Committee would especially wish to record their appreciation of the manner in which the Missionary Agent, the Rev. W. F. Campbell, has accomplished his work during the past winter, and the zeal and ability which he has shown in the performance of his arduous labours; and they feel gratified to learn from Rev. Mr. Campbell that the clergy and laity have everywhere so cheerfully and cordially co-operated with him.

Mission Boxes have again been issued and can be made the means, as formerly, of augmenting the income of the Fund.

The expenditure of the Fund during the past year was, for outfits, \$1,000, and for salaries, \$15,272.65; this last being the largest amount ever expended by the Diocese for that purpose.

The Indian Missions are still maintained in full working order, there being now some 10 or 12 churches and stations with 7 clergymen, of whom 3 are natives. The sum of \$1,206 was paid from the Mission Fund towards the support of the services of the church, in addition to the grants made by the Societies in the Mother Country.

#### MISSION FUND DEBT.

The balance still due on this account is \$3,580.06, which will be reduced to \$2,380.06 by the payment of \$1,200, reserved for that purpose and awaiting the sanction of the Synod. A continuance of the plan by which this heavy debt has been so easily and gradually paid off, will enable it to be completely extinguished within three years.

The Committee would again urge upon the Synod the vital importance of an annual revision of the grants to be made from the Mission Fund, as the only effectual means to avoid the recurrence of debt; and they would remind the Synod that ever since 1874, when this plan was adopted, not only has the Committee been able to keep the expenditure within the income of the Fund, but has also paid off each year a large amount of the former debt.

#### SUPERANNUATION FUND.

During the year the amount paid for this purpose was \$3,485.08, an excess of \$823.36 over the pensions of last year.

During the year, eleven Clergymen received superannuation allowance, in accordance with the Canon.

Three deaths, however, occurred, and the number now on the Fund is only eight.

Each succeeding year shews more fully the wisdom and justice of the Synod in thus making provision for those Clergymen who are no longer able to take permanent active duty.

#### WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

Owing to the peculiarly unfavorable weather on the appointed Sundays in July and January, the quarterly collections show a decrease of \$93.49, as compared with those of last year. Notwithstanding this, the Committee have been enabled to pay the sum of \$3,695.00 for pensions, the largest amount which has yet been required for this purpose, and have also been able to add the sum of \$1,225.28 to the capital of the Fund. The Committee have much pleasure in

again drawing the attention of the Synod to the prosperous condition of this Fund, which has now an invested capital of \$55,279.75.

During the year, 20 widows received pensions from the Fund.

#### DAY OF THANKSGIVING.

The collections on this day were \$808.80, being an increase of \$32.88 over last year.

The amount, as usual, is given towards our Diocesan grant to the stipend of the Bishop of Algoma.

#### FOREIGN MISSIONS.

The amount on hand last year was disposed of by the Synod as follows :—

The collections on the Day of Intercession for 1879 were \$492.22, being \$61.27 less than last year.

The change of time for holding this service, from November to May, probably militated against the receipts this past year.

The amount collected for other foreign missionary objects was not so large as in the previous year, owing to the fact that fewer special objects were brought before the notice of our congregations.

The amount now at the disposal of the Synod for Foreign Missions is \$1,038.96, being the proceeds of collections on Day of Intercession, 1879, and one-half of the collections at the annual missionary meetings.

The Committee would again urge upon the Synod the desirability of some scheme being matured at the next meeting of Provincial Synod for a united effort in furtherance of Foreign Mission work, and they would suggest that special instructions be given to our Diocesan delegates to endeavor to bring the matter prominently before the notice of the Provincial Synod.

#### THE DEPOSITORY.

This continues to be used as an active assistant to our Diocesan Sunday Schools. \$1,756.30 were paid last year for library and prize books, and there is now a good stock on hand.

The Depository is made entirely self-supporting; the books being sold at rates just sufficient to cover expenses.

The printed audited accounts, as usual, show the position of the various other Funds.

## NOTES ON RURAL DEANS' REPORTS.

## DEANERY OF BRUCE.

- a*—Brant and Elderslee—This congregation is again taken up.  
*b*—Pine River—\$100 is granted by the Col. and Con. Ch. S. to the Incumbent of Kincardine to keep up services at Pine River and parts adjacent. A new mission will be formed of Pine River, Amberley and Ripley as soon as a missionary can be obtained.  
*c*—Port Elgin—A building is rented for church service.  
*d*—Bass Lake—Preparations going on for building a church.  
 Missions—The following arrangements are proposed to be carried out as soon as possible: Hanover, Allah Park, Elmwood; Chesley, Townline Brant and Elderslee; Indian Peninsula as a travelling Mission; Warton, Sarawak and Bass Lake.

## DEANERY OF ELGIN.

- a*—Port Burwell—Parsonage delapidated and unfit for residence. There is a glebe of 200 acres.  
*b* & *c*—Tyrconnel and Dunwich—The endowment of this mission comprises also a small endowment from Fingal.

## DEANERY OF ESSEX.

- a*—Sandwich—There is a glebe of 10 acres, on which the parsonage stands; also a lot in the town. \$100 was granted from the Col. and Con. C. S. to this mission.  
*b*—Leamington—A site reserved for church and parsonage on the glebe.  
*c*—Kingsville—\$100 granted from the Col. and Con.

## DEANERY OF GREY.

- a*—Owen Sound—A suitable house is rented by the congregation as a parsonage. A handsome stone church is in course of erection.  
*b*—Williamsford—The congregation is about building a church.  
*c*—Walker Falls—A stone church is in process of building.  
*d*—Egremont—This station has only recently been opened.  
*e*—Dundalk—A new church is nearly completed.

*b*—Wingham—A grant of \$100 given from the Col. and Con. Ch. Society.  
*c*—Walton—A church is being built.  
 Brussels—The church debt is assumed and provided for.  
 Belgrave—The debt on church assumed by congregation.

## DEANERY OF KENT.

- a*—Chatham—There is a valuable glebe in the town.  
*b*—Dresden—\$500 is granted from the Col. and Con. C. S. in support of the colored mission here.  
*c*—Moravian Indians—This work is temporarily in charge of Rev. D. Deacon, the incumbent of Bothwell, and a grant of \$200 from the Col. and Con. C. S. is given to maintain the church services here.  
*d*—Thamesville—The S. S. has been adjourned for the present.  
*e*—Clearville—A new church is in course of erection.  
*f*—Florence—One register is kept for Florence and Aughrim.  
*g*—Highgate—Services were closed for some time owing to prevalence of small-pox.
